PERSONAL APPEARANCE - PO Tartaglia always reports to work with a clean, pressed uniform presenting himself in a professional manner.

PERFORMANCE - PO Tartaglia has been noted as a top monthly performer regarding traffic tickets. arrests, and/or parking tickets for April, May, and September, and makes sure his work is completed on time.

JUDGEMENT / KNOWLEDGE OF LAWS, POLICIES, ETC. - In May PO Tartaglia responded to the 1600 block of Taylor Ave for a check the welfare of a male party, who appeared to be intoxicated, inside a vehicle. As a result of PO Tartaglia's investigation into the incident the male party was taken into custody under MHL 22.09 and his vehicle was towed. Due to the male party seeking restitution for his vehicle being towed an internal investigation was commenced and as a result of the investigation it was determined that PO Tartaglia was in violation of several sections of our procedural manual that deal with enforcement/discretion, officer safety/tactics, conducting DWI investigations, demeanor/professionalism, towing procedures and knowledge of the NYS mental health law.

CARE AND USE OF EQUIPMENT - PO Tartaglia was involved in an On-Duty motor vehicle collision in August where when he was responding to a call for a disorderly party he struck (sideswiped) a parked and unoccupied motor vehicle.

COMMAND PRESENCE / PERFORMANCE UNDER STRESS - When PO Tartaglia is presented with a stressful situation and or a situation where he is unsure with himself he tends to talk to fast. This non-calmness and stress manifests into uncomprehensive radio transmissions, poor decisions he makes on calls, and a perceived argumentative demeanor.

How can this employee best improve his/her performance? (Include setting Career/Performance Goals).

PO Tartaglia currently has just over 4 years on the job and portrays a positive attitude towards assignments and tasks given by his supervisors. At this point in his career he is no longer looked at as a "rookie" police officer, but his decisions and behavior don't reflect the same at all times. PO Tartaglia needs to work on his command presence and performance under stress, so that it does not negatively translate into his behavior and decision making.

Attendance (4) - Ptlm. Tartaglia utilized 1 sick days throughout the year.

Performance Under Stress (2) - Ptlm. Tartaglia becomes flustered when dealing with high stress calls. This may be caused by a lack of self confidence in himself to make a sound decision.


On March 27, 2017, at approximately 10:15 p.m., several units were dispatched to the formula occurred. It was further related by the dispatcher that the two suspects were black males wearing dark clothing and were in possession of a handgun. While en route, Officer Jordan Dodge located two males that matched the description of the suspects on the formula of the suspects on the findividuals, they began to flee the area on foot. The subjects ran in opposite directions.

Several officers who were responding to the scene were able to take one of the suspects into custody. A BB gun, that looked identical to a handgun, was located in the area where Woodson had fled. A perimeter was then set up to try and contain the second suspect. While checking the yards on the the second suspect was located hiding near a fence. This suspect was also in possession of a BB gun.

Both males were later charged by members of CID with Robbery 2nd. Due to these officers' quick actions and teamwork, they were able to remove two dangerous and violent subjects from the streets and possibly prevent them from committing similar robberies.

Summary:

On October 16th 2019, I reviewed an investigation completed by Sgt. Starr Rae Wooden in relation to a motor vehicle accident involving car 52 on Washington St. near Westminster Presbyterian Church.

Investigation:

On August 21st 2019 at around 1215hrs, PO Michael Tartaglia (car 52) was dispatched to for an argument. Upon arrival, Tartaglia attempted to make a U-turn and park his vehicle on the west side of the street. While he was pulling into the spot, Tartaglia collided with a blue 1998 Chevy Express van, which was parked (unoccupied) on the same side of the street, in front of Westminster Presbyterian Church. Car 52 suffered minor damage to the right rear door, quarter panel and tire. The van suffered minor damage to the left front bumper. An accident report was completed by PO Titus Ciccone and photographs were secured of the damage to both vehicles. Tartaglia's BWC footage was also reviewed and tagged.

Findings:

Based upon my review of Sgt. Wooden's report, the BWC footage and the photographical evidence, I concur with her findings that Tartaglia was in violation of the following section(s) of our procedural manual, as a result of being involved in the collision:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

EE. Departmental Vehicles/Operation/Care/ Personal Use/MV Accident/Reporting;

- 2. Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.
- *Based upon my review of Tartaglia's disciplinary history and the damage sustained to both vehicles, I recommend that he receives a letter of reprimand for his transgression.

Summary:

On Wednesday August 21st, 2019 I, Sgt. S. Wooden, reported to the Utica Police department in full uniform attire and was assigned as the Street Supervisor utilizing Car 40/BWC 40 for the 0745-1600 hours tour of duty.

While on routine patrol, at approximately 1235 hours I was notified by PO Ciccone that PO Tartaglia, operating Car 52, had been involved in a minor motor vehicle collision with a parked car. PO Ciccone advised me that PO Tartaglia sideswiped a parked vehicle as he attempted to enter into a parking spot while responding to a dispute in progress call. PO Ciccone further advised me that Car 52 sustained damage to the rear right door, rear right quarter panel and the rear right tire hub, and the parked vehicle sustained minor scrapes to the front left bumper.

Once all the information pertaining to the collision was collected, the scene was documented, and the accident information exchange form was provided to the owner of vehicle #2 the following fact finding information was initiated.

Investigative Facts:

On Wednesday August 21, 2019 I responded to response the egarding the officer involved motor vehicle collision involving PO Tartaglia and the following fact finding investigation was completed:

-	I spoke with PO Tartaglia who adv	vised me that at approximately 1215 hours he was
	responding to a	for a dispute in progress call when he made a left
	hand turn onto Washington Street	to proceed northbound. PO Tartaglia stated that

as he turned onto Washington St he observed two uninvolved vehicles behind him. PO Tartaglia stated he did not observe any legal spots to park on the east side of the street, but he did observe a spot on the west side of the roadway, just south of Westminster Presbyterian Church (714 Washington Street), so he proceeded to make a U-turn in order to proceed southbound and park in that vacant space. PO Tartaglia stated that after he conducted the U-turn he pulled to the right of the road to allow traffic that was going northbound, and then he began to enter into the empty parking spot. PO Tartaglia stated that as he proceeded to drive southbound into the empty parking spot that was when the right rear of his patrol vehicle (Car 52) struck a parked blue and green 1998 Chevy Express (bearing NY REG was parked on the western side of the street and facing southbound. PO Tartaglia stated that the vehicle was directly in front of 714 Washington Street and parked in a clearly posted no parking zone. PO Tartaglia stated that when he examined both vehicles he saw that the there was a scrape, dent, and paint exchange to the rear right door, quarter panel, and wheel hub. PO Tartaglia stated that he examined the damage to the parked vehicle and observed that the front left bumper sustained a small scrape, and the bumper was knocked slightly out of place. PO Tartaglia further stated that due to the nature of the call he was responding to, and the fact that he was the first officer on scene, he responded to the call and resolved it prior to notifying the supervisor.

- PO Tartaglia did not report any injuries as a result of the collision.

I observed the damage to Car 52, which was consistent to PO Tartaglia's account of what occurred. I also examined the parked vehicle, which was now parked on the east side of the road, and saw that the front left bumper had a small scrape and the bumper was tilted. The severity of the scrape, dent, and paint exchange on both vehicles indicated that there was not much force (slow speed) between the two vehicles to create that damage profile.

I spoke with the owner of the parked vehicle (V#2), who advised me that at the time of the accident his vehicle was parked in front of 714 Washington St and unoccupied. Stated that the damage to his van was very minor and he did not want anything done. Was advised that since a police vehicle was involved a motor vehicle accident report would be completed. Further stated that he had no complaints regarding the incident.

PO Ciccone secured photographs of the two vehicles and the damage sustained by both. PO Ciccone also completed an MV104a.

- PO Tartaglia was advised to complete an Officer Narrative regarding the incident.

- I completed an area check to see if there were any exterior video camera systems that might have captured the collision. No cameras were located.

- The Duty Commander was notified regarding the accident. The officer involved motor vehicle accident notification was emailed to the Division Commander, Logistics and Resource Unit, and Professional Standards Unit.

- PO Tartaglia was advised to take Car 52 to the Fleet Maintenance Garage and have the mechanics assess the damage. Car 52 was taken to Don's Ford for an assessment by PO Tartaglia and once the assessment was completed Fleet Maintenance approved for the vehicle to stay in service.

- On 8/21/19 Sgt. Hagen provided me with a preliminary repair estimate for the damage to Car 52 in the amount of \$1,478.11.
- I reviewed PO Tartaglia's Body Worn Camera, which was activated at the time of collision. The video footage shows PO Tartaglia maneuvering the vehicle, then there is a "thud" sound, and the patrol vehicle appears to collide with an unknown object (parked vehicle #2) causing the patrol vehicle to rock.

Investigative Findings:

After reviewing the collision incident and all of the pertinent information/facts pertaining to such, I find that the main contributing factor for the collision was that PO Tartaglia misjudged the space between his patrol vehicle and the parked vehicle, thus passing the vehicle unsafely, and striking the same. A second contributing factor was that vehicle #2 (the parked vehicle) was parked in a clearly marked "No Parking" zone. I also find that PO Tartaglia was in violation of the following UPD Policy and Procedures pertaining to the operation of police vehicles:

Chapter 4, Article 1: Patrol Operations

1.14 CARE OF EQUIPMENT:

A. Officers assigned a departmental vehicle shall abide by all policies, procedures, and rules relating to the care, inspection, and maintenance of such vehicle.

Chapter 8, Article 1: Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

- A. General Duties:
 - 2. Employees shall perform their duties in a competent manner.
- EE. Departmental Vehicles/Operation/Care/ Personal Use/MV Accident/Reporting;
 - 2. Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.

1.17 GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT:

- P. Departmental Property and Equipment;
 - 1. Employees shall be held responsible for the proper care and use of departmental property and equipment assigned to or used by them. When obtaining any equipment, and again upon its return, it is the employee's responsibility to inspect it. Employees shall utilize departmental equipment only for its intended purpose.

On Wednesday, August 21, 2019, I, PO Michael J Tartaglia III, reported for duty to the Uniform Patrol Division of the Utica Police Department for the 0800-1600 hour shift. I was assigned to Car/ Zone 52, BWC 8366, per the acting platoon commander, Sgt Berger.

At approximately 1215 hours I responded to 1 for a dispute. It was reported that two males were arguing and that it was in progress. See the related RMS for further.

While en route to the call I was going northbound on Genesee Street and approaching Washington Street on my left. I made my left hand turn onto Washington Street and proceeded northbound. During this time there were two uninvolved vehicles being operated by pedestrians behind me. There was no spot to legally park on the eastern the of Washington Street and I observed an open spot on the western side of Washington Street, just south of Westminster Presbyterian Church, 714 Washington Street. I pulled ahead of the spot and conducted a U-turn to go southbound on Washington Street. After conducting my U-turn I was facing southbound on Washington Street and began to pull to the right to allow more room for the traffic that was going northbound. I began to pull into the empty parking spot when I struck a parked vehicle. The vehicle, a blue and green 1998 Chevy Express bearing NY , was parked on the western side of the street and facing southbound. The vehicle was directly in front of 714 Washington Street and parked in a posted no parking zone which clearly stated for vehicles not to park there to not block the church entrance/ exit. I had struck the rear passenger side door of my vehicle on the driver side corner of the front bumper. This caused a scrape, dent and paint exchange along the rear passenger side door and dent to the rear passenger wheel hub cap. The damage to the parked vehicle was a small scrape and the bumper being knocked slightly out of place. Due to the nature of the call I was responding to and being the first officer on scene I responded to the call and resolved it.

After resolving the original call, Sgt Wooden was advised regarding this incident. The owner of the vehicle, , was located and informed on the accident. Car 51, PO Ciccone, responded and completed the necessary paperwork and secured photos. See his narrative for further. I then responded to the UPD garage and was instructed to go to Don's Ford to secure and estimate for cost of repairs. A cost of the repairs was then sent to the UPD garage by Don's Ford staff.







Upon reviewing Ofc. Tartaglia's BWC footage from the call it is clear that the circumstances surrounding the incident were quite different from what his report portrayed. The video shows that when Ofc. Tartaglia arrives are in the vehicle, however the video also shows that the vehicle, however the video also shows that the vehicle is seat belted into the driver's seat, the keys are in the ignition and the vehicle's engine is running. Once the vehicle is awake and speaking it is clear that the vehicle is intoxicated due to the way he is speaking (slowed, slurred speech), the way he looks (glassy, bloodshot eyes), and the way he had difficulty dividing his attention between answering Ofc. Tartaglia's questions as well as following his directions to turn the vehicle off. All of these factors should have lead Ofc. Tartaglia immediately down the path for a DWI arrest decrease although intoxicated, was not incapacitated and could communicate with Ofc. Tartaglia he was just choosing to be uncooperative and did not want to identify himself.

During what was essentially a vehicle stop Ofc. Tartaglia displayed tactics that were contrary to officer safety. Tartaglia appeared to either be unaware or unwilling to state to that there was reasonable cause to believe that had been driving while intoxicated and that he was conducting an investigation into same. Instead Ofc. Tartaglia kept telling wover and over that he didn't do anything wrong and he just needed his identification and to make sure he was "safe". This information was not accurate there was no rhyme or reason to this deception and instead it caused confusion, further argument, and for the property of

have the upper hand in the situation as he continued to say that he was "safe" and he was not driving.

At no point did Ofc. Tartaglia take charge of the situation, advise that he believed him to be driving under the influence and having open alcohol containers in the vehicle both of which are illegal and were being investigated and that if he didn't comply with providing his pedigree information he could face further charges. If didn't comply at that point then Ofc. Tartaglia should have escalated by having step out of the vehicle and place him into handcuffs. Instead Ofc. Tartaglia continued to argue with and give him false information that he "hadn't done anything wrong" and that he needed his ID to ensure his safety. Just checking someone's safety is not enough to compel them into providing us with pedigree information. It is the suspected criminal activity that gives police the ability to require ID be provided.

During Ofc. Tartaglia's argument with eradioed that he was 'Code 4' but to have another unit respond and assist due to the male being uncooperative. He continued his back and forth with and then at one point appeared to get frustrated and walked away who he knew was still intoxicated and behind the wheel of a vehicle with the keys in the ignition. The backup officer had not yet arrived. Ofc. Tartaglia then got into his own vehicle, turned around in the roadway and positioned his police car behind is unknown for what purpose Ofc. Tartaglia decided to do this but it was extremely unsafe from an officer safety stand point as well as possibly creating a danger to the public if to leave. By the time Ofc. Tartaglia had parked his vehicle behind had exited his own vehicle and was standing in the roadway. At that time Ofc. Tartaglia told back in his vehicle. This is again against officer safety as he is telling a suspect to reenter a vehicle that he has no idea what could be inside and he's advising a drunk person to get back behind the wheel of a vehicle with the keys in it. Ofc. Tartaglia should have wanted of the vehicle in the first place so that he could conduct further observations of behavior relevant to intoxication, perform SFSTs, and take him into custody. get back into the vehicle and at that point Ofc. Tartaglia stopped pushing the issue, again that he, not the officer, had control in the situation. showing

There is no clear reason why Ofc. Tartaglia would take the route of an MHL 22.09 arrest. was speaking clearly (though slurred), was able to argue and compose logical thoughts and statements. was able to exit his vehicle under his own power and was able to walk unassisted. He could have communicated any information to Ofc. Tartaglia that he asked, just chose not to. was not incapacitated to the point where he could not care for himself, could not speak, or was a danger to himself or anyone else. The only thing possibly

Investigative Findings:

Based on my investigation, reviewing the reports and BWC video, reviewing the Policy and Procedure and NYS law I have determined that Ofc. Tartaglia did violate the Policy and Procedure of the Utica Police Department.

Ofc. Tartaglia's conduct would fall under the following section of the Utica Police Department Policy and Procedure:

9.15 TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DISCRETION:

Ofc. Tartaglia violated this section when with sufficient probable cause to support a charge of Driving While Intoxicated he used discretion and did not make such an arrest even though department policy dictates that he will make such arrest.

Ofc. Tartaglia failed to take any DWI enforcement against who was clearly intoxicated and operating a motor vehicle on a public highway.

9.18 OFFICER DEMEANOR DURING TRAFFIC STOPS:

- A. Officers must act to minimize the tension during the enforcement process. Methods of controlling conflict on traffic stops include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Presenting a professional image via the officer's language, bearing, and tone of voice
 - 2. Displaying calmness and emotional stability when confronted by angry violators
 - 3. Demonstrating with certainty that the officer has observed the violation
- B. When speaking to violators, officers should:
 - 2. Respectfully explain the reason for the stop and the nature of the violation
 - 5. Politely disengage the conversation if the driver becomes argumentative

Ofc. Tartaglia did not display a professional image with his bearing or tone of voice. He appeared timid and unsure of himself. When became angry and argumentative Ofc. Tartaglia did not remain calm and take control of the situation, he went back and forth with and wavered on why he was stopping and speaking with him. Ofc. Tartaglia admits to that he knows he is intoxicated but states he is not going to arrest that for it.

Vehicle Tow, Impound, and Release Chapter 4 – Article 10

10.13 TOWING PROCEDURES:

G. Violation of the Vehicle and Traffic Law - Officers are required to tow vehicles that are in violation of certain sections of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law if the operator of the vehicle does not have a licensed third party to take control of the vehicle.

§ 1227. Consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages in certain motor vehicles. 1. The drinking of alcoholic beverages, or the possession of an open container containing an alcoholic beverage, in a

Findings:

Based upon her investigation into the matter, Berger cited several sections of our procedural manual, which were violated by Tartaglia during the aforementioned vehicle stop/call for service. They deal with enforcement/discretion, officer safety/tactics, conducting DWI investigations, demeanor/professionalism, towing procedures and knowledge of the NYS mental health law. The following sections are the ones I find most pertinent:



Please be advised that State and Federal Laws prohibit us from disclosing any "Discipline" issued to an employee. We can only share with you that discipline was given.



On Friday August 25, 2017 I, Officer Donald Talerico arrived to work at the Utica Police Department in the Uniformed Patrol Division assigned to Car/Zone 56 Body Worn Camera 8311, for the 1600-0000 hour's tour of duty. Sergeant Cimpi was the Squad Commander.

At approximately 1715 hours I responded to HQ with Irhad Rascic () who was taken into custody regarding him being an active File 5 out of The Oneida County Sheriff's Office and VTL charges.

As I entered the door the leads from the sally port into the booking area I observed a B/M who I now know to be pacing in the cage screaming "I want my phone call! I want my phone call!". Once I arrived in the booking room with Rascic I advised PO Tartaglia of his charges and that he was a File 5 out of the sheriff's office and they were going to be responding shorty to take custody of him. As I was advising PO Tartaglia of this I observed 3 other unknown B/M's sitting on the bench in the booking room and could still hear McClain yelling in the background about wanting to make a phone call. I then began to assist PO Tartaglia with Rascic due to him being extremely busy with the other prisoners. After I completed assisting PO Tartaglia I began to fill out the booking sheet for my arrest of Rascic. As I was doing this PO Tartaglia left the booking room. Moments later I heard PO Tartaglia yell "Oh Shit" at that time I stopped what I was doing and observed PO Tartaglia run into the being room, grab the keys to the cage and run back out. I then responded to the cage to assist PO Tartaglia with mis unknown issue. Once I turned the corner I observed PO Tartaglia trying to open the door to the cage. I then observed McClain sitting on the floor of the cage with some type of string or rope around his neck that was attached to the cage door. At that time, I assisted PO Tartaglia and began to pull the door to the cage open. I then observed that McClain had tied a shoe lace to the cage door and wrapped it around his neck. I immediately cut the shoe lace so that McClain was able to breathe. Once the shoe lace was cut McClain began gasping for air and vomiting. At that Time Sgt Cimpi arrived and began assisting us. He was informed about what had just occurred as well. McClain then sat on the floor of the cage and continued taking deep breathes of air. Once he stopped gasping for air he was placed on the bench of the cage and his sneakers and jacket were secured. At that time dispatch was advised to have UFD respond to evaluate McClain.

As I was waiting for UFD to arrive I attempted to speak with McClain but he would not respond to any of my questions. McClain then placed his hands over his face, began to cry and started to rock back and forth. Once UFD arrived on scene Capt. Baranowski and FF Kain began to check McClain's vitals. I was advised that his vitals were normal but he was still unwilling to speak with anyone. As I was looking at McClain's neck I could observed redness around both side and the imprint of the shoe lace. I was then advised by Sgt Cimpi that McClain is going to be transported to the hospital for MHL 9.41. UFD advised dispatch to have a rescue vehicle respond. I continued to attempt to speak with McClain but he was still unwilling to speak with me. At one point, he stated that he couldn't take it anymore and he wanted to die, but he was mumbling these statements. When I asked him to repeat what he

said he would just sit on the floor and cry with his hands over his face. Once the UFD Rescue rig arrived on scene McClain was shackled and handcuffed. When McClain was advised that he was going to be transported to the hospital he would not move and had to be carried from the cage to the sally port where FF Zongrone and FF Durr were awaiting with a stretcher. McClain was then placed in the stretcher and into the Rescue vehicle. I advised disparch I was following UFD to St Luke's Hospital for MHL 9.41 transport.

Upon arrival at St Luke's Hospital I informed the hospital staff regarding this incident. They were also advised that McClain has pending Burglary charges against him and they must contact the Squad Commander Office when he is being released. They were also given the number of the Squad Commanders Office. I was further advised by the hospital staff that they were going to give McClain a sedative due to him possibly being combative and uncooperative. The Mandatory Oneida County Mental Health Behavioral and Commitment paperwork for MHL 9.41 was completed, signed, and faxed.

I was advised by Sgt Cimpi that PO Balio was going to be responding to my location to watch McClain. Once PO Balio arrived I briefed him on this incident. I also advised PO Balio that I was only able to obtain pictures of the side and back of McClain's neck. He was advised to secure more photographs once the sedative begins to take effect. I then cleared the hospital and responded back to HQ.

My BWC was tagged regarding this incident.

Photographs were placed in the Crime Scene Everyone folder under this RMS by PO Tartaglia and PO Balio.

On Friday, August 25th, 2017, I, PO Michael J Tartaglia III, reported for duty to the Uniform Patrol Division of the Utica Police Department for the 1600-0000 hour shift. I was assigned to be the Booking Officer, BWC 8366, by the acting platoon commander, Sgt Cimpi.

Upon beginning my shift at 1600 hours I met with Officer Fanelli who was the Booking Officer for the 0800-1600 hour shift. Officer Fanelli advised me of a female that had been transported in, who I later identified as Tammy , a male who was in the cage, that I was later able to identify as Hector M McClain, Joynt. , and two other males that were on the bench, whom I later identified as Gary J Bowman, I observed that Bowman was not cuffed to the bench and that the cage and Amadeo J Deblasiis, DOF door had been locked and secured at this time. McClain was walking freely inside of the cage and wanted to know why he was arrested. Officer Fanelli advised me that as of this time that only Bowman had been entered into the system and was not booked. However Officer Fanelli also informed me that he had searched all persons held in the booking area at this time and he had all of their property in the Booking Officer's room and all of the property was separated and labeled who it belonged to. Officer Fanelli then left for the night. At this time Matron Zampa was still here and was asked to start booking Joynt while I started to book McClain and Deblasiis. It was at this time I learned that three people had not been taken out of the system and released, one being a juvenile record, and that Deblaces had been arrested at approximately 1430 hours and McClain had been brought in between 1500 hours and ift change.

Between 1600 hours and approximately 1710 hours I was trying to enter in Deblasiis and McClain and enter in the charges for Bowman. McClain was very uncooperative in the cage, asking why he was arrested and that he wanted his phone call. I informed McClain multiple times that he would be able to make a phone call once I had his charges and when he was completely booked. McClain continued to yell repeatedly that he wanted a phone call. McClain kept repeatedly yelling that he wanted a phone call for approximately 20 minutes. At approximately 1630 hours Ahmad J Boyd, DOB was transported in for domestic related charges and I began to enter him into the system.

At approximately 1710 hours PO Talerico transported in a male that I learned to be Irhad Rascic, for AUO 3rd and a Warrant out of Oneida County Sheriff's Department. McClain at this time was still yelling that he wanted a phone call. I was beginning to search Rascic for contraband and to secure whatever property he had on him when I noticed that McClain had stopped yelling. I also noticed that McClain was no longer standing and I could hear a raspy gurgling sound. I went to the other side of the booking area to check on McClain and I could observe that he had shoes on. McClain had taken the shoe lace off of his left shoe and tied one end of it to the cage door and tied a loop around his neck and sat down trying to hang himself. I immediately ran and grabbed the cage door key and unlocked the door to cut McClain loose. PO Talerico was with me and cut the lace McClain was

hanging himself with and Sgt Cimpi ran out to assist us. The lace that was around McClain's neck was removed and McClain began to gasp for air and vomited on the cage floor. UFD was requested to respond to the Booking Area for a medical and mental health evaluation. Sgt Cimpi was informed on the situation at this time. McClain's sneakers and jacket were removed from him and secured at this time.

White waiting for UFD to arrive McClain sat on the cage floor with his knees up and his face in his hands. icClain was crying and refused to answer any questions asked by myself and PO Talerico. At this time I was attempting to secure photographs of McClain's injuries and he would not move and continued to cry. I did what I could to secure photographs of the side and back of McClain's neck. McClain speak once and a while, however he was mumbling and I could only make out that he did not care and that he wanted to die. UFD arrived on scene and again McClain refused to answer any questions asked to him at this time and continued to keep his face in his hands and continued to cry. I was advised by Sgt Cimpi to place feet shackles and cuffs on McClain and to also utilize a belly chain. McClain was secured at this time and asked to stand up and walk outside to the ambulance that would take him to the hospital. McClain continued to sit and cry and had to be lifted to his feet and carried outside. Once outside McClain was placed on a stretcher and placed in the back of an ambulance where he was transported to St Luke's on 9.41 related charges.

I then secured photographs of the cage, McClain's shoe and the lace he had used attempting to hang himself. I then downloaded and tagged my body camera footage related to this incident. All photographs were then downloaded to the Crime Scene Photos folder. The floor of the cage was then mopped.

At approximately 2310 hours PO Balio transported McClain back to Police HQ to complete his booking. I spoke with McClain briefly about his time here and he stated he was mad because he felt that everyone else's booking was not completed before they could make phone calls. I explained to him that per my training I was taught that a person could not make any phone calls until their booking was completed. McClain then stated that felt like he was have for a while before he even saw me report for duty today and when I asked how long he had been here before I ame in and he saw me stated that he wasn't sure. I asked if it had been anywhere from 15 to 20 minutes and he stated that he felt like it was longer than that. McClain's booking was then completed and met constant watch criteria.

On Friday, August 25, 2017, I was working 0745-1600 hours, assigned to B-Platoon. I was assigned to Car 40 as a street supervisor.

At or about 1500 hours, I heard Lt Dougherty (from the squad commander's office) request a car to check the area of Kemble St and Hobart St, for the CAC, for a male named Hector McClain. I believe Car 56 (Llewellyn) and Car 57 (White) were initially dispatched. PO Manion then got on channel 5 and relayed that he had a visual of McClain on the pole camera and PO Manion gave a clothing description of McClain. PO Manion also stated that McClain was wanted for two burglaries. A short time later, I heard Car 31 (Deputy Chief Noonan) request the description of McClain and once that was given, I believe Car 31 stated that he was in the area of Oneida St and Hobart St. After this, I heard Car 36 (Lt Bansner) state that he was in the area and he began coordinating the response of the officers.

I proceeded to the area and before I arrived, I heard the command (from Car 36) for the officers to move in and a short time later, at approximately 1511 hours, it was reported that the cars on scene had one in custody. I arrived a short time after and I observed a male I now know to be Hector McClain in handcuffs and several officers were in the area. Lt Bansner also appeared to be in command. At that point, I turned my back to the officers and McClain and acted as perimeter security. McClain was placed in Car 55 (Mahaffy) and transported to headquarters. Car 25 (Devey) followed the transport. At that point, I cleared all remaining patrol cars from the call.

At or about 1600 hours, I was in the Squad Commander's Office at the end of my shift. McClain was in the holding cage and was screaming over and over again that no one told him he was under arrest, he wasn't read his rights, and he wanted a phone call. He continued to scream and yell for quite some time. I would say, at least 30 minutes. I then left the police station for the day.

Summary:

On 08/25/17 at approximately 1710 hours, Ptlm. Tartaglia who was assigned to the doorman position heard a gurgling noise coming from the holding cage area. Upon going over to check the holding cage area, Ptlm. Tartaglia observed the male prisoner, Hector M. McClain () who was in the cage sitting on the floor near the holding cage door with one end of a shoe lace tied around his neck while the other end was tied around the holding cage door. PO Tartaglia immediately yelled to alert me, as I was in the office, while he ran back to the booking area to grab the key for the lock on the holding cage.

After grabbing the key, Ptlm. Tartaglia along with the assistance of Ptlm. Talerico and I cut the shoe string and then removed the other end from around McClain's neck. At this point, McClain who was still conscious and breathing began to gasp, cry and vomit.

UFD was then dispatched to the station for medical treatment. The on call Duty Commander, Capt. Mickle was contacted and advised of the incident. McClain was then transported by UFD to St. Luke's Hospital regarding an MHL 9.41 while car 56, Ptlm. Talerico followed.

Photographs were secured of McClain and the scene as well as the shoelace. Narratives were completed by all officers involved including officers from B-Platoon. B-Platoon was on duty at the time McClain was transported into the station and placed in the holding cage. A NYS Commission of Corrections Reportable Incident form was completed on E-Justice.

An Investigation was initiated under RMS 17-38208.

Investigation:

As part of my investigation I spoke with Ptlm. Tartaglia and Ptlm. Talerico on scene. I also was on scene and atnessed much of the incident. McClain was already in the holding cage upon C-Platoons arrival for their shift. McClain's property was already in the booking area in a plastic bin. McClain for hours was hostile, yelling and screaming as well as hitting his hands on the cage at periods. He was observed sitting on the bench and it was assumed that he had calmed down. It was a short time after, approximately 1714 hours that McClain untied his shoe lace from his shoe placed it around his neck and used it to try and hang himself from the holding cage.

Further investigation showed that McClain was transported into the station at 1521 hours by Ptlm. Mahaffey and Ptlm. Dewey, regarding incident number 17-38190. A citizen stop of McClain was conducted at Kemble and Hobart St. due to open Burglary charges from Inv. Singe. Video footage of the holding cage area shows Ptlm. Mahaffey and the booking officer for B-Platoon, Ptlm. Fanelli taking property from McClain but not his shoes. The holding cage is then locked and McClain is left in the cage until shift change. Prior to C-Platoon taking over, McClain was not even entered into RMS booking at all therefore there were no documented cell checks completed every 15 minutes by Ptlm. Fanelli. A check of RMS also shows that Ptlm. Tartaglia entered McClain into RMS at 1620 hours but no cell checks are documented in RMS until 23:23 when McClain returns from the hospital meaning Ptlm. Tartaglia did not document a cell check from 1620 unitl 1714 hours when McClain began to hang himself.

Narratives were completed by Ptlm. White who assisted on the initial stop of McClain, Ptlm. Dewey (initial stop of McClain), Sgt. Scott Berger (initial stop of McClain), Ptlm. Mahaffy (initial stop of McClain and transport of same to the station), Ptlm.Llewellyn (initial stop of McClain), Ptlm. Lange (Chauffer for B-Platoon), Ptlm. Fanelli (doorman for B-Platoon), Ptlm. Talerico (present during suicide attempt), and Ptlm. Tartaglia (doorman during suicide attempt).

All in station camera footage was reviewed as part of this investigation. A NYS Commission of Corrections Reportable Incident form was completed on E-Justice. On call Duty Commander, Capt. Mickle was notified of incident. An email was sent to all proper command staff and professional standards regarding incident.

Findings:

Based on my investigation I determine that Ptlm. Fanelli violated the following policy and procedures:

11.19 TRANSPORTATION OF A PRISONER TO HEADQUARTERS:

- P. The proper entry shall be made in the prisoner log book upon the arrival of any prisoner(s), male or female. If a matron is not working the female prisoner logbook will be maintained at the doorman's desk.
- -Ptlm. Fanelli violated this policy when he did not enter Hector McClain into RMS upon McClain's arrival into the station at 1521 hours. McClain was not entered into RMS until Ptlm. Tartaglia did so at 1620 hours.

11.27 BOOKING PROCEDURES:

... Upon intake of a prisoner the doorman/matron shall take their personal items (i.e. money, rings, watches, necklaces) as well as any belts, neckties, shoelaces or shoes, drawstrings, clothing items such as jackets, hooded sweatshirts, overcoats or other similar outer garments, and place it in a prisoner property bin. If an item(s) is too large for the prisoner property bin or there are no bins available the doorman/matron may use a large plastic bag to store the items. The doorman/matron shall note in the prisoner log book that the prisoner's property was secured and record the bin number.

-Ptlm. Fanelli violated this policy as he did not take all of McClains property off of his person which included his shoes and shoe laces.

- -Ptlm. Fanelli violated this policy when he placed McClain in the holding cage without thourghouly searching McClain and securing and removing all the proper property from McClain.
- G. The condition of prisoners, in the cellblock, shall be checked by the doorman, matron or other sworn officer by actual visits to the cell, at intervals not to exceed fifteen (15) minutes. All checks and activity of a prisoner shall be entered into each prisoners booking in RMS under the detainee tracking module by use of the electronic scanner.

- -Ptlm. Tartaglia violated this policy as he did not document any cell checks for McClain until 2323 hours after he had already returned from the hospital. McClain did not document any checks from when he entered McCalin into RMS at 1620 hours until his attempted suicide attempt at 1714 hours.

Ch 08/25/2017 I Reported to work at the Utica Police Department. I was assigned to work as the doorman. My our of duty was the 0800 to 1600 hours shift.

During the time frame of 1530 hours to 1550 hours I recall units bringing in a few prisoners at once and specifically Tammy Joynt and Hector M McClain. Gary J Bowman. and Amadeo J Deblasiis, I were already in Utica Police custody on the rear bench. I recall the female Mrs. Joynt being placed onto the bench and the bench was full. Joynt was irate and crying. At this time I was sitting at my desk and remember the Officers bringing in McClain were placing him in the holding cell because there was little room on the bench. I then got up to assist Officer Mahaffy and started to secure McClain's property from inside the cage. Mahaffy advised me that this arrest was for Inv. Manion regarding a burglary investigation. I remember Officer Mahaffy asking me specifically if I wanted him to take McClain's shoes and I said no because I was under the impression that McClain was going upstairs to CID. I also thought McClain was going to be in the cage temporarily until the bench cleared. I made sure he was deemed safe for officer safety reasons and closed the cage and placed his personal property in a bag. At this time I would estimate the time being 1545 hours and realized it was to late to start any booking information in the computer. I then wrote all the names of the prisoners in custody in the yellow tags and sorted the property out for my relief. All other prisoners here besides Joynt and McClain were booked as far as possible but I remember Inv. Singe had not brought down Gary Bowman's charges yet. It was a very busy time period for a shift change and I tried to advise my relief, Officer Tartaglia of what was going on as best as possible. I then left for my shift and all was in order.

Summary:

On 8/25/17 at approximately 1714 hours, C Platoon Booking Officer / Doorman PO Tartaglia heard a gurgling noise coming from the prisoner holding cage. PO Tartaglia immediately checked on a male prisoner Hector M. McClain being held in the prisoner holding cage awaiting arrest processing / booking for Burglary related charges. PO Tartaglia found McClain sitting on the holding cage floor near the holding cage door with one end of a shoelace tied around his neck while the other end of the shoelace was tied around the holding cage door. It was obvious that McClain was attempting to commit suicide by hanging = suffocation. McClain was choking and gasping for air hence the suspicious noises that caught PO Tartaglia's attention. PO Tartaglia immediately alerted the C Platoon Squad Commander Sgt. Cimpi by velling to him while running back to the booking area to grab the key for the lock on the prisoner holding cage door. PO Talerico heard the commotion and offered his assistance. After gaining access to the prisoner holding cage, PO Tartaglia cut the shoelace and removed same from around McClain's neck. McClain who was still conscious and breathing began to gasp for air, cry and vomit. The Utica Fire Department was promplty requested for emergency medical evaluation / treatment of McClain. The Utica Fire Department Emergency Medical Services transported McClain to St. Luke's Hospital via an ambulance regarding additional medical evaluation / treatment as well as a mandatory mental health evaultion pursuant to MHL 9.41. PO Talerico accompanied McClain to the hospital and completed the necessary paperwork pursuant to a MHL 9.41 arrest.

The Duty Commander Captain Mickle was notified regarding the incident. Sgt. Cimpi initiated an internal investigation regarding the above prisoner attempted suicide incident (RMS 17-38208).

Investigative Facts:

Sgt. Cimpi initiated a fact finding internal investigation regarding the incident. Sgt. Cimpi obtained surveillance camera footage from all the Booking Area cameras to assist with his investigation. Sgt. Cimpi interviewed PO Tartaglia and PO Talerico regarding the incident. After interviewing PO Tartaglia and PO Talerico, Sgt. Cimpi directed them

to complete comprehensive Officer Narratives regarding the incident. Sgt. Cimpi learned that Hector McClain was being held in the prisoner holding cage when PO Tartaglia took over the C Platoon Booking Officer / Doorman position at shift change from the B Platoon Booking Officer / Doorman PO Fanelli. PO Tartaglia noted that McClain's personal property was in a plastic bin which was sitting in the booking office therefore PO Tartaglia assumed McClain had been searched, stripped of all pertinent personal property, the property was logged, and secured in a plastic bin per departmental policy/procedure. McClain had been arrested during the B Platoon Shift as he was wanted by Inv. Singe regarding impending Burglary related charges. McClain was transported to the Utica Police Department at 1521 hours by B Platoon PO Mahaffy and placed into the prisoner holding cage with the assistance of Tactical Unit PO Dewey. Custody of McClain was turned over to the B Patoon Booking Officer / Doorman PO Fanelli at which time PO Fanelli searched McClain and secured some of his personal property however he did not secure his shoes and shoelaces which is contrary to departmental policy/procedure. PO Fanelli secured the prisoner holding cage door and McClain was left until PO Fanelli's tour ended at 1600 hours. PO Fanelli did not create an RMS Booking Module upon McClain's intake therefore there were no documented 15 minute cell checks completed by PO Fanelli all of which is contrary to departmental policy/procedure. A check of RMS shows that PO Tartaglia completed an RMS Booking Module for McClain at 1620 hours. Sgt. Cimpi found no documented cell checks of McClain until 2323 hours when McClain returns from the hospital meaning PO Tartaglia did not document a cell check from 1620 hours until 1714 hours when McClain was found attempting to commit suicide in the prisoner holding cage.

PO Tartaglia secured pictures of the scene as well as the shoelace that McClain utilized to hang himself. A NYS Commission of Corrections Reportable Incident Form regarding the incident was completed via E-Justice. An email was sent to all pertinent command staff and professional standards personnel regarding incident. As perviously noted, Sgt. Cimpi obtained and reviewed all surveillance camera footage from the Booking Area cameras to assist with his fact finding internal investigation.

Investigative Findings:

After reviewing all the facts and circumstances regarding this incident, it was determined that the following departmental policies and procedures were violated:

Chapter 4, Article 11 ARREST, TRANSPORT, BOOKING

11.19 TRANSPORTATION OF A PRISONER TO HEADQUARTERS:

P. The proper entry shall be made in the prisoner log book upon the arrival of any prisoner(s), male or female. If a matron is not working the female prisoner logbook will be maintained at the doorman's desk.

 PO Fanelli violated said policy when he did not create an RMS Booking Module for prisoner Hector McClain upon intake at 1521 hours. An RMS Booking Module was not completed for McClain until PO Tartaglia completed same at 1620 hours.

11.27 BOOKING PROCEDURES:

A. Upon intake of a prisoner the doorman/matron shall take their personal items (i.e. money, rings, watches, necklaces) as well as any belts, neckties, shoelaces or shoes, drawstrings, clothing items such as jackets, hooded sweatshirts, overcoats or other similar outer garments, and place it in a prisoner property bin. If an item(s) is too large for the prisoner property bin or there are no bins available the doorman/matron may use a large plastic bag to store the items. The doorman/matron shall note in the prisoner log book that the prisoner's property was secured and record the bin number.

• PO Fanelli violated said policy as he did not secure all of McClain's personal property from his person, specifically his shoes and shoelaces.

11.28 DETENTION FACILITY (LOCKUP) OPERATIONS:

A. Before being placed in a cell or holding cage the clothing and person of each prisoner shall be thoroughly searched.

- PO Fanelli violated said policy when he secured McClain in the prisoner holding cage without thourghouly searching his person and securing / removing all his prsioner property, specifically his shoes and shoelaces.
- G. The condition of prisoners, in the cellblock, shall be checked by the doorman, matron or other sworn officer by actual visits to the cell, at intervals not to exceed fifteen (15) minutes. All checks and activity of a prisoner shall be entered into each prisoners booking in RMS under the detainee tracking module by use of the electronic scanner. The prisoner's condition and other notations considered relevant should be noted by the officer and/or matron. Under no circumstances will anyone enter either cellblock area while carrying a weapon. Except upon initial entry with a prisoner, no personnel shall enter the booking or holding area, where prisoners are being detained, while armed.
 - PO Fanelli violated said policy when he did not create an RMS Booking Module for the prisoner McClain therefore none of the required 15 minute cell checks were completed from McClain's intake at 1521 hours until PO Fanelli was relieved at shift change around 1600 hours by PO Tartaglia.
 - PO Tartaglia violated said policy as he did not document any of the required 15 minute cell checks for prisoner McClain from 1620 hours when he created a RMS

Booking Module for McClain until 1714 hours when McClain was discovered attempting to commit suicide.

Ancillary Issues:

No ancillary issues were noted during this investigation.

Recommendations:

As a result of the above noted departmental policy and procedure violations, I recommend that PO Fanelli receive a Letter of Reprimand as well as the forfiture of 5 days of benefit time which will serve as punitive discipline in full satisfaction of the above matter. Furthermore, I recommend that PO Tartaglia receive a Letter of Reprimand which will serve as punitive discipline in full satisfaction of the above matter.

The internal investigation found that PO Tartaglia violated departmental policy / procedure as he did not document any of the quired 15 minute cell checks for prisoner McClain from 1620 hours when he created a RMS Booking Module for McClain until 14 hours when McClain was discovered attempting to commit suicide.

As a result of the investigation it was determined that you have violated Department Procedural Manual as follows:

hapter 4. Article 11 ARREST, TRANSPORT, BOOKING

DETENTION FACILITY (LOCKUP) OPERATIONS:

The condition of prisoners, in the cellblock, shall be checked by the doorman, matron or other sworn officer by actual visits to be cell, at intervals not to exceed fifteen (15) minutes. All checks and activity of a prisoner shall be entered into each prisoners booking in RMS under the detainee tracking module by use of the electronic scanner. The prisoner's condition and other notations considered relevant should be noted by the officer and/or matron. Under no circumstances will anyone enter either

tellblock area while carrying a weapon. Except upon initial entry with a prisoner, no personnel shall enter the booking or holding area, where prisoners are being detained, while armed.

On 11/10/2017, a Command Discipline hearing was commenced. You were offered PBA representation and you accepted/denied. Also present during this hearing was ...declined PBA Representation. We came to the following resolution.

- B) You accept responsibility for violating the Departmental Procedural Manual.
- C) You accept this Letter of Reprimand.
- D) You also understand that in the future, this behavior or any other violation of Departmental Rules or Regulations of a similar nature will be subject to further disciplinary action.
