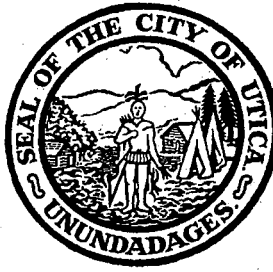





On 7/20/19 at about 2154 hours units were dispatched to the area of Steuben and Addington. The caller gave information about a male that was following her and may have a gun. PO Detraglia advised that the party in question was going to [REDACTED] and that he was just on a call regarding the same person. I responded to the area with multiple other units to assist with an area check. It was relayed to officers that [REDACTED] had 5 active bench warrants from this agency. Upon doing an area check officers stated they saw him run through the yards north bound from Addington Pl. A perimeter was set up and after several minutes PO [REDACTED] called out that he had the male at the intersection of Steuben and Grove. Units converged on his location as it was relayed that the party was resisting. Upon my arrival [REDACTED] was handcuffed and laying on the ground. As officers helped him up he began to fight with them and scream and kick at officers while jumping up and down. At this time, officers took him to the ground again to gain position of advantage. On the ground, [REDACTED] was banging his head on the sidewalk saying that the police kicked him. He was extremely combative and would not comply. Family members of his approached and were yelling to him to comply and stop fighting with the police. This did not calm him down. PO [REDACTED] then drew his taser and turned it on and pressed it against [REDACTED] upper back and gave commands to stop resisting or he would be tased. After several moments [REDACTED] was calmed down. [REDACTED] was then helped up and walked to the rear of car 26. At the rear door, he refused to get in the car and began to fight with officers again. At this time several officers were attempting to place him in the car and during the struggle their duty belts scraped against the rear drivers side quarter panel of car 26, causing several scratches. I responded to the passenger side of car 26 and grabbed ahold of [REDACTED] wrist as PO [REDACTED] utilized a come along and we were able to get him seated in the rear of car 26.

During the incident, [REDACTED] grabbed PO Kellogg and was kicking at several officers.

[REDACTED] was transported to HQ and turned over to the booking officer. Depositions were secured from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] about what they saw during the incident.

Holt	As the result of an internal investigation associated with RMS 18-29530, it was determined that PO Comeskey failed to utilize "due care" while operating Car 52 on 7/18/18 resulting in a curb strike and subsequent damage to the front passenger side tire of Car 52 in violation of departmental policy. Lt. Holt subsequently issued PO Comeskey a Written Counseling Memorandum in regards to the proper care of department vehicles. PO Comeskey accepted responsibility for his actions and stated in the future he would be more careful while operating department vehicles.

While in front of [REDACTED] St., I observed a white mark on the front passenger side tire. I then observed damage to the rim of the tire.

Once the call was completed, I called Car 40, Sgt. Carville and advised her as to what happened. Sgt. Carville then instructed me to return to the intersection of where it all occurred.

Sgt. Carville then responded to the intersection of City St at Thorn St and called for a tow off rotation. I then secured photographs of the intersection, the impact to the curb, and Car 52's damage. These photographs were downloaded to the Crime Scene Everyone Folder under this RMS.

I then completed this officer narrative.

I take full responsibility for this incident and will accept the punishment.

Summary:

On July 18th, 2018 Officer Comeskey reported to the Utica Police Department from the hours of [REDACTED] hours and was assigned to car / zone 52. At approximately 1833 Hours he was responding to a fight call located at [REDACTED]. PO Comeskey struck a curb on the way to the call and car 52's front right rim sustained damage. A fact finding investigation was initiated regarding the cause of the damage.

Investigative Facts:

On July 18th, 2018 I Sgt. Kerry Carville, reported to the Utica Police Department from the hours of [REDACTED] hours, I was assigned to the Utica Police Department Uniform Patrol Division, in car 40 as a Street Supervisor per the Squad Commander Lt. Fernalld.

Officer Comeskey reported to the Utica Police Department from the hours of [REDACTED] hours and was assigned to car / zone 52. At approximately 1833 Hours PO Comeskey was dispatched to a fight call at [REDACTED]. PO Comeskey contacted my cell phone at approximately 1848 hours and informed me that he had struck a curb on his way to the fight call and once on scene noticed that the rim to the front right tire was damaged. PO Comeskey stated that the vehicle was driveable and there was no damage to the tire, only a dent to the rim. I was on another call at the time and asked PO Comeskey where he struck the curb and he stated at [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I asked PO Comeskey why he had left the scene prior to reporting the damage and he stated he did not think there was damage and did not get out to check until after the fight call. PO Comeskey was advised to respond back to the area where the damage occurred and I would be en route to investigate once I was done handling the call I was on.

I contacted the Squad Commander, Lt. Fernalld and informed him of the incident that PO Comeskey was involved in. I advised the Lieutenant that I would go assess the damage and keep him informed.

I arrived at [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and PO Comeskey pointed out the curb / sewer drain where his front right rim had made contact. The curb/ sewer drain was at the end of [REDACTED] Street at the intersection of [REDACTED] Street and I observed a fresh scrape on the curb along with small particles of stone from the curb on scene.

I observed the rim to the front right tire of car 52 and noticed that it was bent and should be changed. There was no damage to anything else other than the rim. I requested that PO Comeskey secure photographs of the scene and rim to the patrol car. PO Comeskey was advised to download the photographs into the Crime Scene Everyone under RMS # 18-29530.

I then asked PO Comeskey what happened and he stated that he was dispatched to a fight call at [REDACTED] Street and he took a wrong turn and ended up traveling Southbound on [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. PO Comeskey stated that when he realized he was heading the wrong way he attempted to make a U-Turn at the intersection of [REDACTED] Street at [REDACTED] Street and heard a loud noise but did not feel or see anything. PO Comeskey stated he then

proceeded to the fight call and once there, he observed a white mark on the front passenger side tire and damage to the rim of that tire. PO Comeskey stated he then called me to advise me of the damage.

I then advised PO Comeskey to complete a detailed narrative regarding what happened and asked if there was anyone who may have witnessed the incident. I was told by PO Comeskey that the resident from [REDACTED] Street was outside when it occurred. I responded to that location and secured a Supporting Deposition from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that she was outside sitting in her van at approximately 1835 hours, which was parked on [REDACTED] Street facing [REDACTED] Street and saw a Utica Police car pass by her heading towards [REDACTED] Street. She observed the Officer make a U-hand turn and heard a loud knock sound and she figured that the police car hit the curb or the sewer, because it sounded like metal on metal. [REDACTED] stated she Officer slow down and look into his rear view mirror to see what he hit and the took off down [REDACTED] Street. [REDACTED] added that the Officer was not going very fast before making the U-turn.

I notified Lt. Fernalld and he made the notification to the Duty Commander, Captain Cinque and we were advised we could change the tire and keep car 52 in service. The damaged rim to the front right tire was tagged and placed in the Sally Port.

While at Headquarters I made the appropriate notifications to the Command Staff regarding Damage to Police Property via E-mail. I tagged my BWC and asked PO Comeskey if his BWC was activated at the time of the incident and he stated he did not activate it at that time, but did so shortly thereafter.

Investigative Findings:

Summary:

I, Lt. James R. Holt Jr., am employed by the City of Utica Police Department, assigned to the Patrol Division - C Platoon (afternoon shift = [REDACTED] hours) as the Platoon Commander. While performing my duties as the C Platoon Commander, I reviewed an internal investigation submitted to me by Sgt. Carville regarding damage to the front passenger side rim of Car 52 which was incurred when the operator of Car 52 - PO Comeskey struck a curb / sewer drain cover at the intersection of [REDACTED] St. and [REDACTED] St. [REDACTED] Platoon Patrol Supervisor Sgt. Carville was notified of the incident / damaged rim and subsequently initiated an internal investigation regarding the incident / damaged rim for the purpose of identifying any potential associated departmental policy / procedure violations.

Investigative Facts:

On July 18, 2018, PO Comeskey was assigned to C Platoon Car / Zone 52. While responding to a reported fight at [REDACTED], PO Comeskey conducted an impromptu U-turn at the intersection of [REDACTED] St. and [REDACTED] St. at which time the passenger side tire of Car 52 struck the concrete curb / metal sewer drain cover on the side of the roadway at the intersection. Shortly after handling the reported fight complaint, PO Comeskey inspected the passenger side tire on Car 52 and noted that the rim was damaged (specifically the rim was scuffed and bent, however the tire was not damaged). Upon noting the damaged rim, PO Comeskey immediately notified Sgt. Carville of the situation. Sgt. Carville initiated an internal investigation regarding the incident / damaged rim for the purpose of identifying any potential associated departmental policy / procedure violations.

Sgt. Carville inspected the damaged rim as well as the accident scene. All indications led Sgt. Carville to believe that PO Comeskey did in fact strike a curb / sewer drain cover at the intersection of [REDACTED] St. and [REDACTED] St. causing damage to the passenger side rim of Car 52. While at the accident scene, Sgt. Carville interviewed a witness (resident of [REDACTED] St. who was outside her residence) who provided the same version of events as PO

Comeskey. Furthermore, the witness stated that PO Comeskey did not appear to be operating Car 52 in a reckless manner. Photographs of the damaged rim were secured and added the digital case file.

Sgt. Carville notified the Squad Commander Lt. Fernalld of the incident. Lt. Fernalld subsequently notified the Duty Commander Capt. Cinque of the incident. Capt. Cinque recommended that the tire / rim be changed at which time Car 52 could remain in service. Sgt. Carville arranged for the DPW to change the rim / tire on Car 52 without incident. The damaged rim was tagged and forwarded to Fleet Maintenance.

Investigative Findings:

After reviewing the facts and circumstances regarding this incident, I find that the mere fact that PO Comeskey struck a curb / sewer drain cover causing damage to the passenger side rim of Car 52 allows for the inference that PO Comeskey carelessly operated Car 52 in violation of the following departmental policy and procedure sections:
