Also discussed were the implications of being a Brady and Giglio Officer, Use of personal social media both on and off duty, officer involved domestic incidents and personnel complaints.

Brady Rule

The Brady Rule, named for Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963), requires prosecutors to disclose materially exculpatory evidence in the government's possession to the defense. "Brady material" or evidence the prosecutor is required to disclose under this rule includes any evidence favorable to the accused-- evidence that goes towards negating a defendant's guilt, that would reduce a defendant's potential sentence, or evidence going to the credibility of a witness.

If the prosecution does not disclose material exculpatory evidence under this rule, and prejudice has ensued, the evidence will be suppressed. The evidence will be suppressed regardless of whether the prosecutor knew the evidence was in his or her possession, or whether or not the prosecutor intentionally or inadvertently withheld the evidence from the defense. The defendant bears the burden of proving that the undisclosed evidence was material, and the defendant must show that there is a reasonable probability that there would be a difference in the outcome of the trial had the evidence been disclosed by the prosecutor.

Police officers who have been dishonest are sometimes referred to as "Brady cops." Because of the Brady ruling, prosecutors are required to notify defendants and their attorneys whenever a law enforcement official involved in their case has a sustained record for knowingly lying in an official capacity

Testifying

- 1. Telling lies under oath; standard operating procedure for police officers acting as witnesses in trials
- 2. Police perjury is the act of a police officer giving false testimony

Giglio v. United States, 405 U.S. 150 (1972), is a United States Supreme Court case in which the Court held that the prosecution's failure to inform the jury that a witness had been promised not to be prosecuted in exchange for his testimony was a failure to fulfill the duty to present all material evidence to the jury, and constituted a violation of due process, requiring a new trial. This is the case even if the failure to disclose was a matter of negligence and not intent. The case extended the Court's holding in Brady v. Maryland, requiring such agreements to be disclosed to defense counsel. As a result of this case, the term Giglio material is sometimes used to refer to any information pertaining to deals that witnesses in a criminal case may have entered into with the government.

LETTER FOR FILE

OFFICER CHRISTOPHER EVANS, OFFICER ANDREW MILLER and OFFICER RICHARD LANGE

On May 27th, 2018, Officers Christopher Evans, Andrew Miller and Richard Lange encountered a highly aggressive and agitated male who menaced them with a knife in the middle of the roadway in front of a home on Seymour Avenue. Prior to their arrival, they were informed by communications that this emotionally disturbed subject had just stabbed an individual inside a residence there. Once met by this armed and disturbed subject, officers yelled for him to disarm himself. The subject then began to stab himself in the chest and throat while advancing towards Officers Miller and Lange.

After a taser deployment and ensuing struggle, the officers were able to detain the subject in handcuffs. Officer Lange and Officer Evans rendered medical aid to the subject by applying direct pressure with cloths and combat gauze to the open wounds on his neck. Officer Miller assisted by keeping the combative male restrained and from flailing around. UFD arrived on scene and took over medical treatment.

During the encounter, it was highly likely that the subject would try to bite and strike them and that they would be directly exposed to the blood of this subject. These officers acted without hesitation and without regard for their own safety in an effort to the save the life of this bloody and combative individual.

On March 13th, 2017, officers were assigned to the GIVE Detail from the hours of 4:00 p.m. to midnight. At approximately 9:00 p.m., Investigator Aaron Donaldson received information that there was a lone male subject walking on foot in the area of Sunset Ave near Shaw Street and was believed to be in possession of a firearm. A description of the male was provided to the officers by Investigator Donaldson. At one point, the male met up with three additional subjects and they were now standing in front of a market located on Oswego Street. Officer Charles Parkosewich was assisting in plain clothes and advised the rest of the marked units that the subject was observed in front of the store and was now walking with the other individuals westbound on Oswego Street.

The marked units consisted of Officer Brandon Burnham and Officer Andrew Miller, Sergeant Joseph Cimpi and Officer Donald Talerico and Sergeant Kerry Carville with Officers Alexander Castilla and Christopher Vomer. All patrol units were nearby and were able to converge onto the subjects from all points, so as to apprehend the subjects if they decided to flee. The subject, who was believed to be in possession of the firearm, was apprehended by Sergeant Carville and handcuffed. Officer Parkosewich was able to locate a loaded .22 caliber Burgo Revolver in the male's waistband. Sergeant Cimpi then searched the subject and located a .22 caliber live ammunition round.

If not for the number of officers on scene tactically positioned to ensure the subjects could not escape, the armed suspect may have fled the area or possibly attempted to use the handgun on an officer to escape. Due to Investigator Donaldson's gathering of information and Officer Parkosewich providing a distinct description of the subject, as well as all the marked units working together, a dangerous armed criminal was apprehended and an illegally possessed handgun was seized without incident. The actions of these officers bring honor to themselves and the Utica Police Department.

This afternoon, at approximately 1520 hours PO Jordan Dodge, PO Andrew Miller, and I were standing in front of Lukin's Bar, for the St. Patrick's Day events, when our attention was drawn to the front of O'Donnell's Bar due to an unknown disturbance. We quickly responded to Bar and upon arrival we observed the bar staff attempting to remove a disorderly male party from inside the establishment. As we engaged the individuals the staff advised us that the male party wearing a Yankee's jersey was fighting/attempting to fight inside the bar and that he was being kicked out. At that time the male party in question, who I now know to be , was screaming and yelling, and acting in an aggressive manner as if he was attempting to fight individuals. At that point as being restrained by a couple of other male parties. Myself, PO Dodge, and PO Miller advised everal times to disperse from the area, but he failed to comply with our lawful orders and continued to scream obscenities and act in an aggressive manner. The two male parties, who were restraining to be his friends, were advising him to leave and also advised us that they would get him to leave. Despite his friends' physical effort to get him to leave the area would not leave the area. We continued to advise to disperse several more times, but he continued to disobey our orders and cause a public disturbance. At that point was advised that he was under arrest for Disorderly Conduct which prompted PO Miller to grab his hands in attempt to take him into custody. Immediately began actively resisting by stiffening his arms and pulling them

into his body preventing PO Miller from compliantly handcuffing . Due to tactive resistance of PO Miller and PO Dodge utilized an empty hand take down in order to gain a position of advantage. Once was on the ground PO Miller, PO Dodge, and I advised him to place his hands behind his back but he refused to comply with the direct orders and stiffened his body. After a brief struggle PO Dodge and PO Miller were able to handcuff to the rear and he was escorted to his feet. Once on his feet lunged towards PO Jessica Dodge and PO Dino Jukic who had a female in custody. As a result of attempting to lunge towards the other officers PO Dodge and PO Miller utilized an empty hand come along and escorted to the rear of their patrol vehicle.

As a result of the take down sustained and abrasion to his left eyebrow, but refused medical attention. No further injuries reported. The following response to resistance investigation was initiated.

PO Miller understands his deficiencies in regards to the audits and will strive to be much more conscientious.

IV. Clearly explain the behavior expected of the member:

PO Miller will complete ALL fields listed and provide ample information in the comments section of both request forms. He should know that the more information he puts in the comments section, the less likely he will be flagged by the state in the future.

V. Potential consequences for continuing the unacceptable behavior:

In the event PO Miller is flagged on any future DMV or criminal history inquiries, further discipline will result which will likely include at a minimum a letter of reprimand.

VI. Provisions for follow-up consultations:

The audit reports will be carefully monitored in the future for any defecencies on the part of PO Miller.

At approximately 1630 hours, Ptlm. was dispatched to Rt. 12 South bound, just past the Burrstone exit to check the welfare of a white male carrying a suitcase. Dispatch advised that the male was walking on the shoulder of the road and was yelling at cars.

The male was located on Rt. 12 South just before the French Rd. exit. The male told Ptlm. Miller that he was walking to Florida, and was not yelling at the cars. The male was identified as . The male said that he did not want to talk to police anymore, and said he was going to continue walking. Was dispersed from the area. Ptlm. Miller then continued to watch walk South bound on Rt. 12. Was was not obstructing traffic, and was not yelling at any cars. Ptlm. then cleared from the area, and was dispatched to another call.

After his next call for service was cleared, dispatch again advised that they received multiple 911 calls regarding the same male on Rt. 12 continuing to yell at cars, and that he was on a bridge by Lomond Place. Dispatched advised that the callers stated they thought he might try and jump off the bridge. Ptlm. continued towards this location. Initially Ptlm. Miller did not see this male at the above location. Ptlm. Miller continued to drive South Bound on Rt. 12, and was about to turn right onto the Rt 840 on ramp to loop back around. As Ptlm. Miller was doing this he observed a male matching and description on Rt 12 South, past the city line. He then advised dispatch of my findings and to notify New Hartford PD. Ptlm. Miller then took a detour to get back on to Rt. 12 South bound in an attempt to speak with the male and await New Hartford PD's arrival as the male may be possibly suicidal as relayed by dispatch.

Ptlm. Miller then located the male and conducted a citizen stop on Ptlm. Miller advised that we again had multiple calls of him yelling at vehicles passing. he was not yelling at cars, and that he was a prophet. stated that also Osama's head just got cut off yesterday. Miller to get back. held the knife approximate height in a threatening manner. Ptlm. Miller was scared for his life and thought held the knife approximately shoulder was approximately ten feet from Ptlm. Miller. Ptlm. Miller then grabbed onto his service weapon, still holstered and advised to drop the knife, and back peddled so that he could create space. As he was back backing up, put the knife away. then continued to walk up to him in a threatening manner, and stated "shoot me". Ptlm. 

Summary:

On February 28th 2020, I reviewed an investigation completed by Sgt. Benjamin Perra in relation to a motor vehicle accident involving car 49 (PO Andrew Miller).

Investigation:

On January 20th 2020 at approximately 1410hrs, PO Andrew Miller was parked, facing north bound, in front of the Oneida Square Market (Concida St.). Miller was assigned to a foot patrol detail in that area, at the time. When Miller attempted to exit his vehicle, to resume his foot patrol, his front driver's side door was struck by a (Concident report was completed by PO Christopher Manion (car 55) regarding the collision. In the accident report, Miller was faulted for opening his front driver's side door into traffic. Photographs of the vehicles and the scene were secured. Surveillance footage that captured the collision was also downloaded into the crime scene folder. The damage to car 49 was estimated at \$5,373.58 by the Carbone Collision Center.

Findings:

Based upon my review of Sgt. Perra's report, the surveillance footage and the photographical evidence, I concur with his findings that Miller was in violation of the following section(s) of our procedural manual, as a result of being involved in the collision:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

EE. Departmental Vehicles/Operation/Care/ Personal Use/MV Accident/Reporting;

- 2. Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.
- *Based upon my review of Miller's disciplinary history and the damage sustained to both vehicles, I recommend that he forfeits (3) vacation days from his 2020 time bank.

On the 20th day of January 2020, I reported to work for the 0800 to 1600 hour shift, assigned to Car 50 as a street supervisor, under the command of Sgt. Geddes. Summary:

On January 20th 2020, around 1410 hours, Officer Andrew Miller was involved in a car accident. Miller parked his patrol car (Car 49) in front of Oneida Street (Oneida Square Market). When Miller was opening his driver hide door it was struck by a vehicle passing north bound on Oneida Street. Miller was not injured and the passing whicle sustained front right damage.

Investigative Facts:

On January 20th 2020, Officer Andrew Miller was assigned to the Oneida Square detail. Officer Miller parked 49 in front of the Oneida Square Market, which was parked legally. When Miller was exiting his patrol vehicle e opened his driver side door and it was struck by a passing vehicle. Car 49 sustained extensive damage to the driver side door. The vehicle that struck Car 49, was operated by a vehicle sustained front right damage from the accident. Stated that he was not injured as a result of the accident and Officer Miller did not sustain injury either.

When the accident was reported I responded to the scene and Officer Manion completed an accident report. Photographs were secured of both vehicles and the scene. The accident was captured on the surveillance cameras. I secured a copy of the video and placed it into the crime scene folder. Car 49 was towed from the scene back to the Utica Police Fleet Maintenance Garage. When I spoke with Officer Miller, he stated he did not observe the scene back to opening his driver side door.

After being sent to the Carbone Collision Center, it was estimated that Car 49 sustained \$5,373.58 worth of amage.

Investigative Findings:

After further investigation into this incident, I determined Officer Andrew Miller was at fault for the accident. Miller did not use due care when opening the driver side door of his patrol car. Miller stated that he did not even the vehicle traveling north bound through the square, but he is still at fault nonetheless. Miller is in colation of Chapter 8, Article 1, Section EE (2) of the Utica Police Department Policy and Procedure. The aforementioned policy states: Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.

This incident has been rejected for closure At this time, as it has been determined that if PO Miller and Femia had handled the call at the time of their interaction with Mr. prior to French Rd, there would have been no UOF / tasing in the Town of New Hartford.

The only issue here which is deemed to be a training issue, is that PO Femia and PO Miller both state that there was nothing they could when they first encountered Mr. Version Rt 12 prior to French Rd. However, NYS vehicle and traffic law prohibits any person from walking on a State Highway 1229-a(a) both officers being new might have not known of this V&T law.

Please issue a verbal counseling to each officer, making them aware of this V&T section for possible future reference if they were encounter a similar incident.

Again, this is to be handled as a training issue.
