Brady Rule

The Brady Rule, named for Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963), requires prosecutors to disclose materially exculpatory evidence in the government's possession to the defense. "Brady material" or evidence the prosecutor is required to disclose under this rule includes any evidence favorable to the accused—evidence that goes towards negating a defendant's guilt, that would reduce a defendant's potential sentence, or evidence going to the credibility of a witness.

If the prosecution does not disclose material exculpatory evidence under this rule, and prejudice has ensued, the evidence will be suppressed. The evidence will be suppressed regardless of whether the prosecutor knew the evidence was in his or her possession, or whether or not the prosecutor intentionally or inadvertently withheld the evidence from the defense. The defendant bears the burden of proving that the undisclosed evidence was material, and the defendant must show that there is a reasonable probability that there would be a difference in the outcome of the trial had the evidence been disclosed by the prosecutor.

Police officers who have been dishonest are sometimes referred to as "Brady cops." Because of the Brady ruling, prosecutors are required to notify defendants and their attorneys whenever a law enforcement official involved in their case has a sustained record for knowingly lying in an official capacity

- 1. Telling lies under oath; standard operating procedure for police officers acting as witnesses in trials
- 2. Police perjury is the act of a police officer giving false testimony

Giglio v. United States, 405 U.S. 150 (1972), is a United States Supreme Court case in which the Court held that the prosecution's failure to inform the jury that a witness had been promised not to be prosecuted in exchange for his testimony was a failure to fulfill the duty to present all material evidence to the jury, and constituted a violation of due process, requiring a new trial. This is the case even if the failure to disclose was a matter of negligence and not intent. The case extended the Court's holding in Brady v. Maryland, requiring such agreements to be disclosed to defense counsel. [11] As a result of this case, the term Giglio material is sometimes used to refer to any information pertaining to deals that witnesses in a criminal case may have entered into with the government. [1]



On March 13th, 2017, officers were assigned to the GIVE Detail from the hours of 4:00 p.m. to midnight. At approximately 9:00 p.m., Investigator Aaron Donaldson received information that there was a lone male subject walking on foot in the area of Sunset Ave near Shaw Street and was believed to be in possession of a firearm. A description of the male was provided to the officers by Investigator Donaldson. At one point, the male met up with three additional subjects and they were now standing in front of a market located on Oswego Street. Officer Charles Parkosewich was assisting in plain clothes and advised the rest of the marked units that the subject was observed in front of the store and was now walking with the other individuals westbound on Oswego Street.

The marked units consisted of Officer Brandon Burnham and Officer Andrew Miller, Sergeant Joseph Cimpi and Officer Donald Talerico and Sergeant Kerry Carville with Officers Alexander Castilla and Christopher Vomer. All patrol units were nearby and were able to converge onto the subjects from all points, so as to apprehend the subjects if they decided to flee. The subject, who was believed to be in possession of the firearm, was apprehended by Sergeant Carville and handcuffed. Officer Parkosewich was able to locate a loaded .22 caliber Burgo Revolver in the male's waistband. Sergeant Cimpi then searched the subject and located a .22 caliber live ammunition round.

If not for the number of officers on scene tactically positioned to ensure the subjects could not escape, the armed suspect may have fled the area or possibly attempted to use the handgun on an officer to escape. Due to Investigator Donaldson's gathering of information and Officer Parkosewich providing a distinct description of the subject, as well as all the marked units working together, a dangerous armed criminal was apprehended and an illegally possessed handgun was seized without incident. The actions of these officers bring honor to themselves and the Utica Police Department.



On May 12th, 2020, I, Inv. J Austin, reported for duty commencing at 1645 hours. I was attired in civilian clothing, while being assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division / GIVE unit as a Field Intelligence Officer, under the supervision of Sgt. Curley.

For this shift, my partner, Inv. Dewey and I utilized CID car #75 and were equipped with exterior protective vests labeled on the front and back with "POLICE" as well as clearly displayed Police shields on our hips.

As one of the GIVE Field Intelligence Officers, I am assigned cases within the City of Utica where an individual is found or suspected to be in possession of a firearm, as well as also being assigned cases which are considered "shots fired" where evidence of gunfire is located but no person is actually struck by a projectile.

At approximately 1750 hours, we were patrolling the area of a recent shots fired incident, which occurred at the intersection of Schuyler St and Warren St. (20-13506)

We were stopped at a clearly illuminated and working red traffic light, on Schuyler St at the intersection of Schuyler St and Court St facing south bound. While stopped at the red light, a silver in color Chevrolet Malibu bearing NY REGULATED drove around my CID car and through the intersection against a clearly illuminated and working red traffic light, and at no point attempted to stop. At this time, I activated my emergency lights and sirens and proceeded through the intersection.

I observed the brake lights activate on the vehicle almost instantly after I activated my lights and sirens however; the vehicle did not come to a stop for over 700 feet, almost the entire length of the block. I know through my training and experience that this behavior is very common and consistent with someone attempting to conceal either a weapon or narcotics.

My partner, Inv. Dewey made contact with the driver and I notified 1	Dispatch regarding the traffic	stop and our
location. I then made contact with the passenger,	. While speaking with	I could
see that the driver who I now know to be	was visibly nervous and his	s hand was

Moments later, PO C. Vomer arrived on scene and he ran the driver's name through RMS and NYSPIN in order to verify his driving status and ensure he had no outstanding warrants. I then began speaking with regarding what took him so long to pull over. The stated that the brakes in the vehicle were bad and that's what took him so long to pull over. I informed that it was not only illegal to operate a motor vehicle in New York State with bad brakes, but it was a serious safety concern for not only him but, for all the other drivers on the road.

responded by telling me that, it wasn't for me to decide or determine if his brakes were bad and that it wasn't illegal. was doing in Utica and he informed me that he came to Utica to register the vehicle with the DMV. At this point I further questioned egarding the legal status of the vehicle, as we have had multiple stolen vehicles in the City of Utica recently. I then asked who the vehicle was currently registered to and was unable to tell me, and replied whoever I bought the car from, but I don't know his name. then stated that he iust bought the vehicle today and had the title to the vehicle. The provided me with the title of the vehicle which was signed by the seller approximately one month before and had not been signed by buyer. I then inquired why it was signed so long ago if he had just purchased the vehicle, and why he hadn't signed could not provide me an answer. I then asked for proof of insurance for the vehicle, as the purchaser, was unable to provide. I then learned that driving privileges in New York State were currently suspended. Based off the fact that driving privileges in New York State were suspended, oral admission that the brakes on the driving privileges in New York State were suspended, the braid admission that the brakes on vehicle were bad, and the fact that the registered owner was not on scene, I requested a tow off rotation from was then advised to exit the vehicle and stand on the sidewalk. At this point, that he was 16 years old and

claimed he was 17 years old.

At this point, a vehicle inventory was completed of the vehicle and was allowed to retrieve any personal items he wished from the vehicle.

I attempted to explain the totality of all the circumstances to however; he was argumentative and refused to listen to anything I attempted to tell him.

PO C. Vomer then issued be several UTT's, see his narrative for further.

Maugeri's arrived on scene and towed the vehicle from the scene.

As Maugeri's was towing the vehicle from scene, mother, arrived on scene and stopped in the middle of the roadway and exited her vehicle very aggressively. She was advised to re-enter her vehicle and pull it to the side of the roadway. I attempted to explain the situation to her however; she was very argumentative and claimed "people like me" are the problem with this world and make it hard for everyone. and his mother's vehicle, at which time she sped away from the scene in a very aggressive manner. So much so that two bystanders made comments about her driving.

At no point did I remove any property from the vehicle, nor did I see any other Officer remove any property from the vehicle.

On May 19th, 2020 I reviewed PO Flo's BWC at which point, I can clearly see PO Flo remove the yellow in color. knife from the roof of the vehicle where Inv. Dewey had placed it and then you can hear as he places it in the driver's door of the vehicle.

On May 12th, 2020 I Inv. Dewey reported for duty to the Utica Police Department for the 1645-0100 hrs. Shift. I was attired in a modified uniform / civilian clothing, while being assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division / GIVE unit as a Field Intelligence Officer, under the supervision of Sgt. M Curley.

For this tour of duty I along with my partner, inv. Austin, utilized Car 75 and were each attired in outer carrier vests emblazoned with "Police" clearly displayed on the front and rear of the vest along with clearly displayed Police shields on our hips.

At around 1746 hrs. While awaiting in traffic at the red light located at the intersection of the part
We were behind the vehicle at which time the vehicle continued southbound on Schuyler Street and did not come to a complete stop until the intersection of Schuyler Street @ Warren Street. It is important to note at this time the vehicle took approximately a 10th of a mile to pull over and it appeared as though the operator and passengers of the vehicle were making furtive movements. I know through prior police experience as a Police Officer that this displayed behavior is consistent with individuals who are attempting to brandish and /or conceal weapons and/or illegal contraband form Police. In fact as of October 2nd, 2019 I along with Inv. Austin were involved in a similar incident in which the Operator of the vehicle in fact exited the vehicle brandishing a firearm and fled from us. It was within my professional opinion that with the totality of the circumstances accompanied with the displayed behavior the incident was surmounting to not only public safety concerns but also Officer Safety concerns.

and requested his identification and registration for the motor vehicle. Provided me with his identification and while speaking with him I noted he appeared very nervous, i.e. failing to make eye contact with me as well as stammering while speaking with me. Due to the aforementioned observed behavior, furtive movements, and nervousness I requested out of the vehicle at which time he complied and exited the vehicle. I then conducted a non-intrusive pat frisk of his person to ensure he did not in fact have any weapons on him. While pat I felt a cheap carpenter style knife in the front pocket of his pants. I asked his pocket to which he stated it was a knife. I removed the knife for my safety as well as ind placed same on the roof of the sedan. was negative for any further weapons and was told to stand at the rear of the vehicle. I then proceeded to check the immediate reachable vicinity of For Officer Safety purposes. It was at this time I entered into a conversation with the front right passenger I advised mmediate area within the vehicle to ensure there were no conducted a minimally intrusive sweep of weapons in the vehicle to which stated "Yes sir that's completely understandable".

While I was conducting a pat frisk of _____, Officer Christopher Vomer arrived on scene, I am assuming Vomer heard our vehicle stop broadcasted over dispatch. Upon completing a pat frisk of I located one (1) pocket knife in his pants pocket. This knife was placed on top of the vehicle and I advised he could retrieve the weapon at the completion of the stop. During the stop, PO Flo who also arrived to back us up, placed the knife inside the vehicle's driver side door. Throughout this incident I removed no items from the vehicle nor observed any other officer's on scene remove anything from the vehicle. While Vomer was on scene he rank DLIC for validity. It was then learned that driving privileges were suspended due to a failure to answer a summons, Onondaga County, Town of Dewitt, dated 01/23/2020. It is important to note that throughout the vehicle h was continuously argumentative and ignorant all the while refusing to take responsibility for his actions. admitted to operating the motor vehicle with inadequate brakes as well as stated he did not care that he had a suspended license and that he would operate the motor vehicle regardless. Due to Covid-19 restrictions it was deemed suitable to release Johnson on scene with UTT's for NYS VTL 1111(d1), 1120(a), 402(1), 375(2a4), 306(b), 509(1), 509(8), and 511(1a) which were all made returnable to Utica City Court on 7/13/20 at 0900 hours all of which were issued by PO Vomer. It is important to note that behavior was entirely disorderly. So much so that during the vehicle stop I was addressed by who stated that he would address disrespectful language and mannerisms on my behalf physically. I offer and advised him to stay on the opposite side of the street and I would be back to respectfully declined speak with him regarding an unrelated incident in which he assisted with a few weeks prior.

Due to both occupants being incapable of operating the motor vehicle, a tow off rotation was requested to which Maugeri's Auto obliged. While waiting for the tow truck to arrive, I heard making a phone call to his Mother in which he consistently used derogatory language to describe officers on scene and request she come to up. A few minutes later a silver in color four (4) Door sedan operated by a accelerated southbound on Schuyler Street from Court Street and parked in the middle of the roadway next to the exited the motor vehicle and it appeared that this woman was nother. The visibly agitated and exited the vehicle confrontational leaving her door ajar. In order to maintain control of the situation and attempt to deter the from furthering her aggressive behavior and escalating the situation: I immediately advised her to get back in her vehicle and park it properly. The attempted to yell something at me at which time I cut her off and again sternly ordered her to get back into her vehicle and park it properly as she was blocking the roadway and causing a hazard. The complied with my given directives and reentered her vehicle and parked facing northbound on on the east side of the street. I attempted to explain the situation and she was extremely argumentative and proceeded to state that the Police were the problem. Phicle at which time the female sped away at a high rate of speed to the point where she squealed her tires away from the curb while failing to signal from same while entering traffic. At this time an unidentified B/M who had been gardening in his front lawn north of our location yelled towards us "She aint have her seatbelt on! I aint no snitch but she wallin!" It was decided on scene to not attempt and stop the W/F in order to issue her UTT's in an attempt to deescalate the encounter. It is my professional opinion that Mother had predetermined hatred towards the Police and blatant disregard to the public's safety. No matter how many times the situation was explained to each of them on scene by multiple Officers' it seemed to fall on deaf ears and they are placing this complaint to try and discredit the stop and issuance of tickets in lieu of going through the

On June 25th, 2020 I, Sgt. Kerry Carville reported to the Utica Police Department from the hours of 1545 – 0000 hours for my tour of duty. Sometime throughout my tour I read an E-Mail that was sent to me from Sgt. Curley. This E-Mail was in regards to a Civilian Complaint stemming from a vehicle stop at 1750 Hours under RMS # 20-15445. I recall PO Comeskey fielding a lengthy phone call at the desk. I could hear him reiterating numerous times the procedures for towing a vehicle due to an arrest. This conversation continued for approximately 15 minutes and it sounded as though the subject on the other end was not satisfied with his answers. At one point I heard PO Comeskey tell the subject that they could file a Civilian Complaint if they were not satisfied.

Upon hearing this I decided to walk over to the desk area inquired with PO Comeskey what the subject on the other end needed. PO Comeskey informed me that the subject was the mother of a male that Investigators Dewey and Austin had just arrested for AUO and she was upset in regards to why the vehicle had been towed, as well as her son's knife coming up missing.

I remember taking the call where I identified myself as Sgt. Carville and asked how I could assist her. This female was screaming and yelling on the phone about us towing her son's car and taking his knife. I explained that the Officer she had just spoke with had already advised her regarding why this procedure was done at length and was more than helpful. I, Lt. Stanley Fernalld, am assigned as the Lieutenant of the Criminal Investigation Section of the Utica Police Department Criminal Investigation Division.

On Monday June 20, 2020 Sgt. M. Curley provided me with his investigation into an external primary complaint made against Inv. Josh Austin, PO Paul Dewey, PO Flo, and PO Chris Vomer relative to a motor vehicle stop that St. Both Inv. Austin and PO Dewey are assigned to GIVE occurred on May 12, 2020 on the Unit and report directly to Sgt. Curley. PO M. Flo and PO C. Vomer are assigned C Platoon.

There were two online complaints made reporting person and motor vehicle operator

- Complaint Form #1 listed no specific officers. The narrative of the complaint was as follows: "The officers stole property illegally searched my car extremely rude and aggressive desk officer and sergeant failed to give me names of offending officers dishonest"
- Complaint Form #2 listed Vomer as the offending officer. The narrative of the complaint was as follows: "Did not practice social distancing or wear masks"

Both formal complaints checked the following 'Nature of Actions';

- -Excessive and improper use of force
- -Unlawful search and/or seizure
- -Dishonesty and untruthfulness
- -Corruption
- -Rudeness, discourtesy, and offensive language
- -Violation of civil rights
- -Bias-based procedures and tactics

Sgt. Curley conducted his investigation and returned the following results based on this factors he determined to be at issue;

1. Stolen Property – Not Sustained

2. Illegal Search of Vehicle – Exonerated

3. Rude and Aggressive – Not Sustained

4. The Desk Officer and Sergeant failed to give names – Exonerated

5. The officers did not practice social distancing or wear masks – Exonerated

In addition to reviewing Sgt. Curley's investigation I also reviewed the available body worn camera footage and narratives submitted in this investigation.

In addressing the complaint factors identified by Sgt. Curley I have made the following determinations;

- 1. Stolen Property Not Sustained. Although complaining party did not specify what property was stolen, it is believed that he his referring to a utility knife based on the conversation that PO Comeskey had with mother. PO Flo is observed on his BWC taking a utility knife off the roof of the vehicle and placing it back into the driver side door panel. I would otherwise determine this portion of the complaint to be exonerated, however we were not able to determine what exactly was alleged to stolen, and therefore it is not sustained.
- 2. Illegal Search of Vehicle Exonerated. Officers were within their legal standing to conduct a search of the vehicle based on applicable search and seizure laws; as well as, to conduct and inventory search of the vehicle for the purposes of an authorized tow.
- Rude and Aggressive Not Sustained. Based on the BWC, there is active arguing and banter between the passenge and Inv. Austin, PO Dewey, and PO Flo. The officer's behavior was neither rude, nor aggressive, but at times condescending in the way they were explaining their actions to the should do a better job of not "taking the bait' when confronted with an argumentative citizen.
- 4. The Desk Officer and Sergeant failed to give names Exonerated. Based on the narratives of both Sgt. Carville and PO Comeskey they appeared to do everything necessary in an attempt to appease the caller to no avail. PO Comeskey does state that he does not give the mames of all officers, but provides her with the name of the officer issuing the citations, and the appropriate directions on how to obtain information on the report and how to file a complaint if she deemed necessary. The Utica Police Department Procedural Manual does not dictate when and how an officer is authorized to release names of other officers involved in an incident.
- 5. The officers did not practice social distancing or wear masks Sustained. Although there is nothing in the Utica Police Department Procedural Manual governing the wearing of masks, there was an email from Deputy Chief Noonan on April 17, 2020 ordering all officers to wear a face covering over their mouth and nose when engaging with the public.

In addressing the specific 'Nature of Actions' in the online complaint I have made the following determinations;

- -Excessive and improper use of force Unfounded
- -Unlawful search and/or seizure Exonerated
- -Dishonesty and untruthfulness Unfounded
- $\hbox{-}Corruption-Not Sustained \\$
- -Rudeness, discourtesy, and offensive language Not Sustained
- -Violation of civil rights Unfounded
- -Bias-based procedures and tactics Unfounded

An ancillary issue observed during this investigation was that the officers involved in the motor vehicle stop failed to complete a Vehicle Inventory Sheet (UPD-173) per UPD Procedural Manual Chapter 4, Article 10, section 10-14 sub G.

It is my belief that the officer or officers initiating the investigation are responsible for ensuring that the appropriate paperwork, to include a Vehicle Inventory Sheet, be completed. Therefore I recommend that Inv. Austin and PO Dewey be verbally counselled on the necessity of completing a Vehicle Inventory Sheet. Additionally, I recommend that Inv. Austin, PO Dewey, PO Flo, and PO C. Vomer be verbally counselled on wearing a face covering when conversing with the public until a time that order is lifted by the Deputy Chief or his designee.

	The encounter with the problem of began following a lawful motor vehicle stop for the violation of NYSV&TL 1111D-1, passing through a red light at the intersection of Schuyler St and Court St. The officers attempted to make the stop immediately, however the operator did not fully stop until 944 Schuyler St. According the narratives written by Inv. Austin and PO Dewey, the was argumentative and disrespectful from the immediate interaction. Additionally, the was making furtive motives throughout the stop, causing them to believe he may be concealing something. Due to these factors was requested from the vehicle and a pat frisk was conducted.
	Soon thereafter PO Vomer arrived on scene to assist with the stop. PO Vomer was immediately informed of the facts of the stop and agreed to handle the issuance of the appropriate UTT's and the tow of vehicle after it was learned that a property driving privileges were suspended in the State of New York. Maugueri's tow service was requested and arrived within the allotted time frame.
	Following learning of the need to tow the vehicle, the officers stated that they initiated a vehicle impound inventor pursuant to UPD Policy and Procedure.

	Findings Relative to Complaints Made: 1. Stolen Property
	Due to the control of the property that was stolen, and my inability to speak with him directly, I am not able to determine what property he is alleging to have been stolen. However several of the officers mention items that were initially placed on the top of the vehicle. These items were identified as keys and box cutter style knife. PO Flo specifically states that he placed the box cutter back in the driver side door prior to the vehicle being towed. Based on the lack of information from Johnson and the admission from the officers I find this complaint to be: NOT SUSTAINED
	2. Illegal searching of Vehicle The officers initially conducted a limited sweep of the driver's immediate grab able area due to his furtive movements and the belief that they may be attempted to conceal a weapon. This is permitted by law and policy and procedure. Additionally pursuant to the necessity to tow the vehicle, the officers completed a vehicle impound inventory giving them lawful permission to assess and record personal property inside within. I find this to be: EXONERATED
	3. Rude and Aggressive
	While reviewing the narratives written by the officers as well as PO Vomer's and PO Flo's bodycam at no time did I witness rude or aggressive behavior by the officers. See actions and language certainly could have led to a different exchange, however the officers remained professional throughout. Inv. Austin attempts to explain the nature of the stop and the infractions, however he is met with resistance and belligerence by Mathematical I find this complaint to be: NOT SUSTAINED
	4. The desk officer and Sergeant failed to give names:
(PO Comeskey stated that on the date in question he received a call at the desk from an individual stating to be smother. Amongst being angry at the stop, she stated that the officer's had stolen property, specifically a knife, from her son. PO Comeskey did his due diligence and attempted to contact all the officers involved to find out the whereabouts of the knife.

He was learned that the knife was placed atop the vehicle, and it was relayed to him that ultimately retrieved the knife. This was the best information he had at the time, however it was later learned that the knife was actually placed back in the vehicle prior to being towed.

Additionally, he stated that he attempted to calm the mother numerous times and tried to explain the nuances of a vehicle stop. He stated that she was loud and argumentative throughout and ultimately he explained the process of filing a civilian complaint.

Sgt. Carville stated that she overheard the conversation and due to the duration of it, then took over the call. She too attempted to speak calmly and reasonably with the mother, however he anger continued. Sgt. Carville also explained the process of a civilian complaint and ultimately ended the call.

At no time did either officer state that they were asked nor failed to provide the identities of those involved.

As a result I find this complaint: EXONERATED

5. The officers did not practice social distancing or wear masks

Wearing of masks and social distancing is a construct that we should strive for to maintain a healthy status in today's society. However, in policing we do not always have the luxury of the ability to socially distance ourselves. We cannot shy away from performing our duties and thus must interact with the public daily. In instances such as traffic stops we must engage the public from a minimal distance for a variety of reason not necessitated to be described within.

Departmental memos have been issued that masks and distancing can and should be used in the appropriate situations for proactive and protective measures.

Nothing in policy and procedure at that time dictated that officers must at all times wear masks. Therefore this complaint is: EXONERATED.

Ancillary Issue:

No officer completed a formal written Vehicle Impound Inventory that I could locate. These officers should be verbally counseled on the necessity of completing one for claims of liability against themselves and the department.





On March 24th, 2019 I, Sgt. David Poccia was assigned this Civilian Complaint by Lt. Holt. Lt. Holt provided me with a copy of the civilian complaint which Lt. Dougherty secured from the arrested person in this incident

In this complain a salleged the following:

- 1. He was subject to an unlawful search and/or seizure.
- 2. Officers violated his civil rights.
- 3. His money that he had on him was taken by officers.
- 4. He was assaulted by officers when he was slapped in his hand and kicked several times during the search of his person.
- 5. That he was groped by officer Balio.

Body Worn Camera footage from Officer Balio and his partner Officer C. Vomer were reviewed and tagged. Body Worn Camera footage from Officer DeTraglia who assisted in the search of the

Upon reviewing all body worn camera footage from Officers Balio, C. Vomer, DeTraglia and Lt. Dougherty I have been able to determine the following:

- 1. The search/seizure design was lawful.
- 2. At no point in time did it appear any officers on scene violated any of the scene ivil rights.
- 3. Yes money was seized by officers as they had reason to believe the large quantity of money (\$703) that was in two bundles was from proceeds from illegal marihuana sales as more was found to be in possession of three different bags containing what was believed to be marihuana which had a total aggregate weight of 24 grams. The was given a forfeiture seizure notice by officer Balio which lists the property taken from the way and which contains a notice to all recipients of Forfeiture Notices that the District Attorney's Office may commence a forfeiture action of all listed property if it is determined that such property is found to be proceeds from alleged crimes.
