



Officer Ray Kellogg,

On February 17th, 2019 at approximately 0032 hours you were operating car 27 which is a marked Utica Police Department patrol vehicle assigned to the Tactical Unit. While responding to an incident at [REDACTED] you were involved in a one-car Motor Vehicle Accident in which car 27 struck the curb at the intersection of [REDACTED]. As a result of this accident, damages were sustained to car 27 which totalled \$1,160.40. As a result of this incident a fact-finding investigation was completed and you were found to be solely at fault for the accident and resulting damage that occurred to Utica Police Department vehicle, Car 27.

As a result of the investigation it was determined that you have violated Department Procedural Manual:

Chapter 4

Article 1

1.14 CARE OF EQUIPMENT:

A. Officers assigned a departmental vehicle shall abide by all policies, procedures, and rules relating to the care, inspection, and maintenance of such vehicle.

Chapter 8

Article 1



On 3/27/19, a Command Discipline hearing was commenced. You were offered PBA representation and you ~~accepted~~ denied.



I made a call to the UPD dispatcher tonight. A house on our block, [REDACTED], has been empty for a LONG time. I figured it was legit, but it seemed odd. A bunch of people with trucks and bolt cutters showed up and started throwing stuff "out" of the house, for hours. The way they acted made me wonder. I asked the dispatcher if an officer could come check them out. I didn't think it was a crime going on, but I wasn't sure, with the way they were acting.

An officer showed up quickly. It must have been a bad time because I heard sirens elsewhere. He was alone, but he behaved very professionally. The people he tried to question were rude and treated him very badly. It didn't seem to me a legit business person would have people like that working for them. I was wrong. Obviously, the owner of the house must have hired the hoodlums to clean it out. The noise went on late, past 11 after he left, but that's not why I am writing.

The responding officer was professional. He handled their abuse with no other officer to assist him. He took a lot of grief from a bunch of asses. He maintained himself, and did his job with the utmost steadiness and thoroughness. I was impressed.

Chief Williams – I would like to bring to your attention the fact that one of your officers did a great job in assisting me with a case. Here's the situation: On October 2, 2018, a woman that works here in the City of Sherrill had credit cards stolen from her purse. My investigation into this matter took me into the City of Utica, as the credit cards had been used multiple times there. One of the cards was used at the [REDACTED], located at [REDACTED]. When I followed up at that store, I received a video surveillance photograph of the subject that made this purchase. On Thursday, October 4, 2018, a bulletin was sent out through the MVCAC looking to identify this subject. The following morning, October 5, 2018, I received an email from Officer Kellogg. I later spoke with Officer Kellogg on the telephone. Officer Kellogg told me that he recognized the male subject in the bulletin as someone that he had seen in his patrol area, but had only seen him for the first time a couple of weeks prior. Officer Kellogg spotted this subject the morning of October 5, 2018 carrying an open container of beer. Officer Kellogg stopped this subject and identified him as Terrell Holmes. Upon doing a wants check on Holmes, it was learned that Holmes had an active parole warrant. Officer Kellogg arrested Holmes on this warrant. During a search incident to arrest, Officer Kellogg located a Bank of America credit card in the name of [REDACTED] who is my victim, in one of his pockets. Holmes was later picked up by parole and brought to the Jamesville Correctional Facility in Syracuse, where I was able to interview him and learn more about the credit card theft. Holmes admitted to using the card in Utica and he also told me where he got the credit card from.

What makes this more impressive is the story of Terrell Holmes. Holmes was released from Mohawk Correctional Facility on September 20, 2018 and was brought to the Utica bus station with a bus ticket to Syracuse. Holmes simply had to wait in the Utica bus station for two hours to catch the bus to Syracuse. He never got on the bus. He wandered away from the bus station, leaving his belongings there, and ended up spending from September 20 until October 5 wandering from drug house to drug house getting high on crack cocaine. Officer Kellogg's statement to me that he had only seen him around for a couple of weeks prior to October 5 was spot on. It is clear from this that Officer Kellogg is a highly observant officer who is well aware of what is going on in and around his patrol area.

I just wanted to take a few minutes of your time and make you aware of this. Officer Kellogg's awareness, willingness to help and cooperation helped me close a case in which Holmes and two other subjects have been charged with multiple felonies related to this investigation. He is truly an asset to your department and I appreciate his assistance.

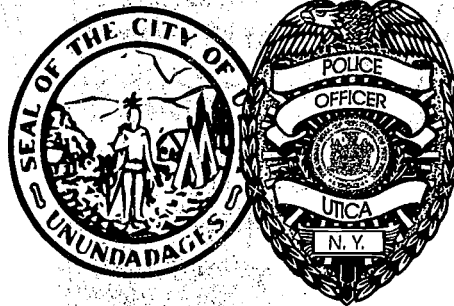

In summary, the writer requests that a proper investigation be conducted (transparency by the Utica Police Department). In reading the post [REDACTED] alleges that Investigator Paul Paladino was operating his vehicle in an unsafe condition (possibly intoxicated) and after being involved in an accident fled the scene causing the police to chase him down, in violation of NY State vehicle and traffic law.

3/12/19 Packet was entered. D/C Noonan complete investigation and was provided with the packet to conduct his investigation.

On Saturday January 5th 2019 PO Kellogg, while partnered with NYSP Trp S Ferriter was involved in a failure to comply relative to observed VTL infractions. The pursuit ended in the driveway of [REDACTED] at which time PO Kellogg approached the passenger side of the suspect vehicle, with Trp Ferriter making a driver side approach. Upon making contact with the driver, Trp Ferriter was forced to utilize a takedown technique in order to extricate the operator from the vehicle. At that time PO Kellogg responded over to the driver side of the vehicle to assist Trp Ferriter in taking the suspect, Eldin Munjakovic into custody. Once there, PO Kellogg was forced to utilize a soft hand/come along in order to bring Munjakovic's right hand behind his due to his failing to comply with officer's request to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. PO Kellogg was able to secure Munjakovic in custody with Trp Ferriter with no further escalation of force.

While at HQ, I spoke with Munjakovic who complained of lower back pain from when "the officer's kicked" him. I observed no such strikes on the BWC, and Trp Ferriter stated that he had placed his knee in Munjakovic's lower back area in order to gain a position of advantage as he had tried to rise up after being taken to the ground incident to arrest. At Munjakovic's request UFD arrived and would later, again at his request transport him to St Elizabeth's Medical Center for treatment. While en route Munjakovic advised UFD that he had a pre-existing back problem that frequently caused him pain. He was later treated and released for minor back pain, refusing medication.

On January 10th, 2019 at approximately 1555 hours I responded to the Lobby Area to speak with Mr. Joseph Gerbino [REDACTED] Mr. Gerbino had some questions regarding his arrest which occurred on January 9th, 2019. Mr. Gerbino was accompanied by Ann Ryan [REDACTED] but she did provide her phone number [REDACTED]

Mr. Gerbino requested the names of the officers involved in his arrest as well as their badge numbers. He also stated that he was missing some property from the vehicle consisting of his insurance card. Furthermore he had some questions pertaining to manner in which he was searched by the officers on the street prior to being transported to headquarters.

I advised Mr. Gerbino to give me some time research the incident, speak to the officers involved and to review the BWC footage. Mr. Gerbino was satisfied with this and stated he would contact me at 0900 hours on 1/11/19. Mr. Gerbino would not provide me with his phone number but stated I could contact Ann Ryan if needed.

On January 11th, 2019 at 0800 hours I reviewed the incident (19-1000) and BWC footage (Sheppard/Kellogg) pertaining to the incident. I found the following:

Officer Sheppard and Officer Kellogg conducted a MV Stop of Gerbino at approximately 1344 hours while at the intersection of Lenox Ave. and Wager St.

I did not note any issues with the manner in which Gerbino was searched (incident to arrest) on scene by the officers.

The only property provided to the officers was a photocopy of his DLIC because he did not have his physical license on his person.

I did not note any property being removed from the vehicle during the inventory search.

On January 11th, 2019 at 0954 hours I called Ann Ryan at [REDACTED] and left a message on her answering machine for either her or Mr. Gerbino to contact me.

On January 11th, 2019 at 1030 hours I received a call back from Mrs. Ryan who advised me that she would pass my message along to Mr. Gerbino to have him contact me.

On January 11th, 2019 at approximately 1130 hours I received a call from Mr. Gerbino on my desk phone. Mr. Gerbino made the following statements pertaining to his interaction with the Police Officers who had arrested him on January 9th, 2019:

- The officer who searched him violated his rights and searched him up in his "balls and anus" and he had on blue gloves when he was searching him
- The two officers are loose cannons
- Vehicle registration, house keys and personal papers are missing from the vehicle
- The officers were very unprofessional and "stone cold"
- He sat in the back of the police car for 20 minutes with music blasting in his ear before being transported to the station
- At the station he asked for help getting out of the patrol car and the officer said, "fuck you"

After Mr. Gerbino made the above statements to me, I advised him that I watched the BWC footage from start to finish and some of the statements he was making were not truthful based on what I had observed on the footage. Mr. Gerbino became somewhat agitated and then began to continually press for a copy of the BWC footage which I advised him that I did not have the authority to release to him but I would be more than happy to have him come in to UPD headquarters where I would allow him to watch the footage. I also advised Mr. Gerbino that if he wished he could also file a formal complaint against the officers unless he was satisfied with the information I was providing him. Mr. Gerbino refused to come to the station to file a formal complaint and only stated he needed to consult his attorney prior to doing so. I then advised Mr. Gerbino that he could bring his attorney to the station as well

and he could complete the complaint form in his attorney's presence. Mr. Gerbino refused and when specifically asked if he wished to file a formal complaint he would not answer the question.

I advised Mr. Gerbino that I would be filing the complaint on his behalf but I would prefer he respond to headquarters to file the complaint himself. Again Mr. Gerbino refused to come to the station.

Furthermore, I asked Mr. Gerbino if he would like to speak directly with our Professional Standards Unit however he refused.

I then completed the UPD Personnel Complaint Form on his behalf and same was turned over to PSU along with this narrative attached.

Summary:

On 2/9/18 at about 2039 hours car 22, PO Basler, was patrolling the area of the [REDACTED] when he observed NY [REDACTED] traveling South on Steuben St with the front drivers side headlight not functioning. Due to the violation, he activated his lights and conducted a stop of the vehicle. The vehicle pulled into the driveway of [REDACTED]. Upon approaching the vehicle PO Basler advised the operator as to the reason for the stop. She was identified as Ronisha Pierce [REDACTED]. While speaking to Pierce, Basler detected the odor of marihuana coming from inside the vehicle. He asked Pierce to exit the vehicle and she refused. He then ordered her to exit and she again refused and was uncooperative. PO Basler stated that Pierce then put the car in drive and pulled forward after he told her no, causing the vehicles rear drivers side tire to roll over his right foot. Once in handcuffs, Pierce was escorted to the rear of car 22 to be searched. While this was taking place, Pierce was kicking PO Basler several times in his lower legs.

After being searched PO Kellogg attempted to place Pierce in the rear of car 22 and she was uncooperative and pulling away and wrapping her leg around his leg after being told to stop several times. PO Kellogg then utilized a come-along to get her into the car.

PO Basler stated that he was not injured and refused medical.

Pierce was interviewed at HQ and stated that she was not injured and did not want medical attention. She did state that her left shoulder was sore from a previous incident where she "popped it out".

Photographs of the scene and of Pierce were secured.

Summary:

On 3/2/19 at about 0059 hours units were dispatched to [REDACTED] regarding a disorderly party. The caller from the bar stated that a patron had been bashing his head off the bar and creating a scene. Upon arrival, PO Schiavi, PO Dewey and PO Kellogg located who they now know to be Joseph Safin standing in the vestibule area attempting to re-enter the bar, but the door was locked. Safin had some blood on his hands and face and had a small cut above his left eye. Officers were interviewing Safin and Safin was becoming belligerent and aggressive toward officers. He was making threats to kick them and fight with them. Safin then made a quick aggressive movement toward PO Dewey, at which time PO Schiavi pushed Safin down into a snow bank. Once in the snow, Safin grabbed snow and threw it in PO Dewey's face. Safin was advised that he was under arrest. He refused to put his hands behind his back as PO Schiavi and PO Kellogg attempted to place him in handcuffs. PO Schiavi and Kellogg utilized come-along's to attempt to place Safin's hands behind his back, but he resisted. Safin then grabbed on to PO Kellogg's leg and refused to let go, causing PO Kellogg to utilize three hard hand strikes to Safin's midsection. This had the desired effect and they were able to place Safin in handcuffs. Once in cuff's, all force stopped. Officers advised me regarding the incident. PO Dewey secured photographs of the scene and Safin.

At HQ, I interviewed Safin. Safin appeared to be highly intoxicated. He initially refused to answer if he wanted medical attention but then stated that he did not need any. He did admit to bouncing his head off the bar several times due to the staff refusing to serve him shots, prior to police arrival. This caused the small cut above his left eye and other small abrasions to his cheek. At about 0225 hours I was notified by Lt Brodt that Safin had requested to go to the hospital to get evaluated for his cut above his eye. Car 55 escorted Safin to the hospital for the treatment. It is important to note that this injury was not caused by the response to resistance and was clearly visible upon police initial arrival on scene.

At the station Safin was found to be in possession of a felony amount of suspected cocaine. Marihuana was located in his pocket also. Inv Dare was contacted regarding the narcotics and responded to the station. I viewed all BWC footage and tagged it. The footage shows Safin lunging toward PO Dewey in an aggressive manner and Schiavi taking him down by pushing him into the snow bank. It then shows Safin throw snow into PO Dewey's face and shows Safin resist arrest and that once he was in handcuffs all force stopped. The footage coincided with the officers accounts of the incident. Photographs were downloaded into the proper folders. Notification e-mail sent. Investigation pending.

I responded to the area with multiple other units to assist with an area check. It was relayed to officers that Lawrence had 5 active bench warrants from this agency. Upon doing an area check officers stated they saw him run through the yards north bound from Addington Pl. Units converged on his location as it was relayed that the party was resisting. Upon my arrival Lawrence was handcuffed and laying on the ground. Family members of his approached and were yelling to him to comply and stop fighting with the police. This did not calm him down. PO Desens then drew his taser and turned it on and pressed it against Lawrence's upper back and gave commands to stop resisting or he would be tased. After several moments Lawrence was calmed down. Lawrence was then helped up and walked to the rear of car 26. At the rear door, he refused to get in the car and began to fight with officers again. At this time several officers were attempting to place him in the car and during the struggle their duty belts scraped against the rear drivers side quarter panel of car 26, causing several scratches. I responded to the passenger side of car 26 and grabbed ahold of Lawrence's wrist as PO Desens utilized a come along and we were able to get him seated in the rear of car 26. During the incident, Lawrence grabbed PO Kellogg and was kicking at several officers. Lawrence was transported to HQ and turned over to the booking officer. PO Detraglia approached Lewis and advised him to stop at which time Lewis turned toward Officer Detraglia and punched him in the face with a closed fist. At this time Lewis was advised he was under arrest and Detraglia, Kellogg and Sgt Grande attempted to place him in handcuffs. Lewis resisted arrest and began fighting with officers at which time officers utilized a take down of Lewis on the sidewalk just South of Hamilton St. Lewis continued to struggle at which time officers utilized several hard hand strikes to Lewis' body in an attempt to gain compliance. Sgt Goldstein then arrived and assisted with a come along of Lewis Right hand to get it out from under his upper body and then utilized downward pressure on his upper back to assist with keeping a position of advantage. After a struggle, officers were able to place Lewis in cuffs and all force stopped.

Lewis did not complain of any injury.

PO Shepard secured photographs of the scene.

PO Detraglia advised Sgt Goldstein and Sgt Grande that he sustained abrasions to his arms and swelling and pain to his right ankle. Sgt Grande also had swelling and pain to the backside of his left hand between the thumb and index finger.

Sgt Grande only wished the injury documented at this time and did not want medical attention at this time. PO Detraglia was transported to St Elizabeth's hospital by PO Sheppard for an evaluation.

Injury/Exposure reports were completed.

At HQ Lewis was totally uncooperative and refused to have his photographs taken regarding the response to resistance investigation. PO Sheppard secured photos as best as he could of Lewis. All BWC footage was downloaded and tagged.

Photographs were downloaded in the proper folder. RTR forms completed.

On June 27th, 2020 I Steven Gray, reported to the Utica Police Department in full uniform attire for the uniform patrol shift from 1545 to 0000 hours. I was assigned

to car/ zone 55, under platoon commander Sgt Goldstein.

At approximately 18:33 hours, I was dispatched to [REDACTED] with unit 52, PO Kellogg, regarding a [REDACTED] in progress. While enroute, dispatch advised that the caller was a [REDACTED] and the suspect of [REDACTED]. I know [REDACTED] through many previous encounters as a Utica Police Officer.

Upon arrival, I observed [REDACTED] in the roadway in front of the aforementioned address, yelling at [REDACTED] to leave, who was across the street from the above address. [REDACTED] was yelling back and myself and PO Kellogg asked him if he would come talk to us regarding what was going on. [REDACTED] initially refused and then came towards our direction. [REDACTED] had stated [REDACTED] was at her house, and wished he would leave. See DIR for further regarding the verbal domestic between both parties.

PO Kellogg and I then attempted to speak with [REDACTED], who was uncooperative with officers. We attempted to reason with [REDACTED] to disperse from the area fearing further domestic issues would arise if he did not. [REDACTED] began being extremely verbally abusive towards myself and PO Kellogg and his mother, [REDACTED]. We attempted again to disperse [REDACTED] to which again he refused. Throughout this encounter, [REDACTED] continued to dig in his pockets. PO Kellogg advised [REDACTED] to remove his hands from his pockets, to which he also refused to do. As PO Kellogg stated to [REDACTED] he would then be pat frisked, [REDACTED] ran away from us.

[REDACTED] then began to return to PO Kellogg's and my location, and squared off to us in a fighting stance. [REDACTED] began to scream multiple obscenities extremely loud at officers, including "Take it off the fucking trigger", "Take me motherfuckers", and "Put it back in the fucking trigger!". At this time, I observed multiple people began congregating outside numerous houses on Court St observing [REDACTED] scream obscenities. It was clear that at this time [REDACTED] was causing a public inconvenience and annoyance.

[REDACTED] was advised to cease his actions or he would be placed under arrest for disorderly conduct. [REDACTED] stated he was not going to jail. [REDACTED] began to walk away from us still yelling obscenities, and then would return to our location. [REDACTED] was then walking in and out of Court St continually disrupting the flow of traffic.

[REDACTED] continued to stay in the area and yell obscenities and it was clear he was not leaving the area, and that he would be placed under arrest. [REDACTED] has fled on numerous occasions, and another car was requested due to the possibility of same.

[REDACTED] was advised he was under arrest and as soon as I attempted to grab a hold of [REDACTED], he began running from me westbound on Court St. Myself and PO Kellogg gave chase west on Court St to the intersection of Whitesboro St. [REDACTED] began gaining distance and we backed off due to knowing his ID. PO Kellogg advised he would get in unit 52 and he would attempt to corral [REDACTED] to apprehend him. [REDACTED] began making his way back towards our location, and I began to pursue [REDACTED] on foot again. I chased [REDACTED] North through intersection of Court St @ Whitesboro St, through the parking lot of Nice and Easy. I then continues to chase [REDACTED] into the Psych center yard, and then East on Court St. in front of 1226 Court St, [REDACTED] ran into a large group of people who stopped him from continuing further. PO Kellogg and I were then able to grab [REDACTED] who continued to resist. [REDACTED] was advised to stop resisting and put his hands behind his back numerous times. Due to [REDACTED] still struggling, a takedown was conducted to gain a position of advantage. Once [REDACTED] was on the ground he continued to resist by refusing to place his hands behind his back. With the assistance of PO Lentricchia, we were able to place [REDACTED] hands behind his back and take him into custody without further incident.

Sgt Gymburch responded and was advised of the response to resistance. I was uninjured in this incident.

On today's date at about 1807 hours, Units 52 (PO Kellogg) & 53 (PO Santana) were dispatched to [REDACTED]. Upon their arrival, they were met by the [REDACTED] who advised both officers that her [REDACTED] was destroying property and had slapped her [REDACTED]. The suspect, [REDACTED] confronted the officers and prevented them from entering the residence to continue their investigation into the domestic dispute. PO Santana advised [REDACTED] that he was under arrest and [REDACTED] immediately resisted their attempts to place him in custody. Both officers utilized soft hand come along techniques & a takedown maneuver in an attempt to place [REDACTED] in custody. PO Kellogg deployed his Taser during the struggle, which had little effect.
