Sgt. Parkosewich continues to be doing well in his first few months of his being a Sergeant.

Sgt. Parkosewich's appearance remains neat, clean and professional.

Sgt. Parkosewich still accepts direction well and has a positive attitude.

Sgt. Parkosewich frequently jumps calls which require a supervisors response. He has had a few instances where he himself had a Use of Force because of his active role on the street and in responding to calls with officers. His involvement is great, he will just need to work on transitioning into directing the Officers on what he wants done instead of doing it himself. He did show good communication, delegation, and direction when he was the first on scene of a call for a man with a gun. He was able to manage the traffic stop, give direction and take control of the suspect, as well as crowd control and communication with officers not on scene. I don't think this will be a difficult transition for Sgt. Parkosewich.

He has again been the sole street supervisor on numerous occasions and has done well balancing responding to calls and monitoring the radio.

Sgt. Parkosewich's only noted issue so far is making sure that officers are making complete RMS entries before he closes out the call. Since this was brought to Sgt. Parkosewich's attention it has not been an issue since and I believe is attributed to his being a new supervisor.

Sgt. Parkosewich has now handled several supervisor investigations. They are always turned in promptly and are complete.

Sgt. Parkosewich has not used any sick days nor has he been late for his tour at all during this 16 week period.

Chief Williams,

I am writing to let you know of the excellent work done by two of my Sergeants and officer on the Midnight shift last night which resulted in a handgun and offender being taken off the streets. At around 0700 hours units were sent to Academy Square Apts. for a domestic dispute in which a man had come to his ex-girlfriend's apartment armed with a handgun and she was able to sneak away and call 911. The zone car was out of service at the time and the closest units were Sgt. Parkosewich in 40 and Sgt. Abel in 50. Upon the Sergeant's arrival they immediately armed themselves with their protective shields, made contact with the victim, and made entry into her apartment. By this time PO Grullon (Car 53) had arrived and made entry with the Sergeants. Once they made entry the suspect began walking away from the officers as they gave him loud verbal commands to get on the ground. Sgt. Parkosewich closed the gap between he and the noncompliant suspect quickly and with a shield shove and more verbal commands was able to get the suspect to the ground. The two sergeants and PO Grullon then worked together to get the suspect secured in handcuffs. Once the suspect was secured and a pat frisk began Sgt. Parkosewich located the described handgun underneath the suspect on his

right side. It was a loaded .380 pistol. The suspect, [REDACTED] was charged with Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> (loaded, defaced, and previous conviction), Criminal Possession of a Firearm, Resisting Arrest, and Criminal Contempt 1<sup>st</sup>/ Harassment 2<sup>nd</sup> related to the domestic incident.

This was obviously a high stress, rapidly moving situation and the two sergeants and officer worked together seamlessly. All showed great restraint and professionalism especially considering the nature of the incident. The two sergeant's set a great example for one of the agencies newest officers.

Sirs,

On August 19, 2017 at approximately 0227 hrs, multiple units were dispatched to the area of Rick's Place (Lansing St & Mohawk St) for a shots fired. We immediately located the victim/caller [REDACTED] who stated that a male he knows to be [REDACTED] had shot him in the left shin outside the bar. He said that [REDACTED] ran into the second floor apartment above the bar.

Long story short we set up a perimeter, began canvassing and located a single 9mm casing in the roadway. Within the first hour we also spoke with [REDACTED] of Ricks bar who said that the second floor apartments are all vacant but a [REDACTED] used to live there. [REDACTED] confirmed to me multiple times that the apartments were all vacant and no one should be up there. Inv. Donaldson then requested he sign a search waiver for these apartments along with the key. [REDACTED] agreed and signed the waiver.

Once the Waiver was signed we developed a plan to conduct a slow and deliberate search of the second floor. Officer Flanagan and I grabbed the shields from unit 50 and 40 and were followed by Sgt. Goldstein, Officer Bubnis, Officer Parkosewich and Inv. Donaldson. Once on the second floor landing we made contact with the suspect [REDACTED] and a [REDACTED] in apartment 1. Both were taken into custody without incident. We then cleared the remaining apartments and ended up locating a loaded 9mm pistol, a large quantity of U.S. currency and a large quantity of what appeared to be crack cocaine.

[REDACTED] was later tested for GSR which tested positive.



On behalf of the U.S. Probation Office for the Northern District of New York I would like to thank your department, specifically Police Officers Charles Parkosewich and Brian Baye for their outstanding work in the [REDACTED] case on the evening of March 29, 2016. Ms. [REDACTED] had just been released to pretrial services supervision by one of our U.S. Magistrate Judges in Syracuse a few hours earlier and my officers, Senior Probation Officers Ellen Phillips and Tim Nolan had traveled to Utica to conduct a residence check. Upon arriving at the residence my officers met your officers who were responding to a 911 call. Ms. [REDACTED] was found unresponsive at which time your officers administered an opiate overdose antidote, Narcan, and basically saved her life. We were able to secure an arrest warrant as Ms. [REDACTED] violated her release conditions by using heroin, and Officers Parkosewich and Baye remained at the scene and assisted in the case until the U.S. Marshals responded. Your officers assisted the U.S. Marshals Service by transporting Ms. [REDACTED] to the local jail. During that transport, Ms. [REDACTED] decompensated and required another dose of the Narcan, which your officers administered to her. They then sought medical attention for Ms. [REDACTED] (as she had previously refused to go to the hospital).

Officers Parkosewich and Baye handled this situation with the professionalism and compassion. I appreciate the professional courtesy which they extended to our officers as well. You should be very proud of their work.



You are to be commended on a job well done! While on patrol near the Oneida Square Roundabout of Genesee Street northbound, Officer Parkosewich observed a vehicle whose headlamp was not working. The vehicle was stopped by Officers Parkosewich and White, who was also in the vicinity. Officer Parkosewich approached the driver side of the vehicle and Officer White approached the passenger side. In doing so, both officers could smell the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle.

The operator of the car was asked for his license registration and insurance card and advised the driver he was being stopped for the non-working headlamp. The driver advised the officers he had received a ticket for the headlamp the night before and had a replacement headlight in the glove compartment. The officers asked whether he had any marijuana on him and his answer was no. Due to the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle, the driver was asked to vacate the vehicle for a search.

The driver stated he did not want to be searched and did not have marijuana on his person, although the odor of marijuana permeated from him. Officer Parkosewich ordered the driver to place his hands on the vehicle and proceeded with the search. A screwdriver was located in his right side of his pocket and as a search was made on his left side, the officer felt the handle of a handgun. The suspect then tried to put his hand in the pocket where the weapon was. Officer Parkosewich immediately pushed the suspect down on the hood of the vehicle and Officer White placed him in handcuffs. After doing so, the gun was examined which was found to be fully loaded. A continued search of the suspect also revealed marijuana on the suspect's person.


Thereafter, several family and friends of the suspect approached the vehicle making threats against the officers and arguing about the arrest of the suspect. They were advised to leave the area and one additional individual was arrested for Obstruction Governmental Administration 2<sup>nd</sup> degree

This undoubtedly was a very dangerous situation and because of the outstanding work and performance by both of you, no one was injured.


Dear Chief Williams:

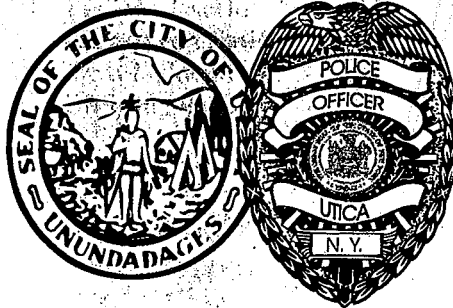

On March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017, officers were assigned to the GIVE Detail from the hours of 4:00 p.m. to midnight. At approximately 9:00 p.m., Investigator Aaron Donaldson received information that there was a lone male subject walking on foot in the area of Sunset Ave near Shaw Street and was believed to be in possession of a firearm. A description of the male was provided to the officers by Investigator Donaldson. At one point, the male met up with three additional subjects and they were now standing in front of a market located on Oswego Street. Officer Charles Parkosewich was assisting in plain clothes and advised the rest of the marked units that the subject was observed in front of the store and was now walking with the other individuals westbound on Oswego Street.

The marked units consisted of Officer Brandon Burnham and Officer Andrew Miller, Sergeant Joseph Cimpi and Officer Donald Talerico and Sergeant Kerry Carville with Officers Alexander Castilla and Christopher Vomer. All patrol units were nearby and were able to converge onto the subjects from all points, so as to apprehend the subjects if they decided to flee. The subject, who was believed to be in possession of the firearm, was apprehended by Sergeant Carville and handcuffed. Officer Parkosewich was able to locate a loaded .22 caliber Burgo Revolver in the male's waistband. Sergeant Cimpi then searched the subject and located a .22 caliber live ammunition round.

If not for the number of officers on scene tactically positioned to ensure the subjects could not escape, the armed suspect may have fled the area or possibly attempted to use the handgun on an officer to escape. Due to Investigator Donaldson's gathering of information and Officer Parkosewich providing a distinct description of the subject, as well as all the marked units working together, a dangerous armed criminal was apprehended and an illegally possessed handgun was seized without incident. The actions of Sergeant Carville, Investigator Donaldson and Officer Parkosewich bring honor to themselves and the Utica Police Department.

On August 19, 2017, at approximately 2:30 a.m., multiple units were dispatched to the area of Rick's Place located on Mohawk St. for a shots fired incident. Upon arrival, officers met with the victim. The victim reported that he had an argument inside the bar which continued outside. Once outside, he was shot in the leg. He reported that the man who shot him then fled into the second floor above the bar.

Due to the circumstances, a perimeter was immediately established around this location. More evidence was located during the initial investigation and a search waiver was obtained from the building owner. A tactical plan was then developed to conduct a slow and deliberate search for the suspect and any possible evidence. Sergeant Keith Phillips and Officer Sean Flanagan led the search with shields followed by Sergeant Charles Goldstein, Investigator Aaron Donaldson, Officer Sean Bubnis and Officer Charles Parkosewich. Once inside, they located the suspect in the shooting, a loaded .9mm pistol, a large quantity of cash and a large quantity of cocaine.

The officers' vigilance, bravery and focused investigation led to the arrest of a dangerous individual, seizure of an illegally-posessed firearm and removed narcotics from the streets of Utica. Their actions bring great honor to the City of Utica and the City of Utica Police Department.

On February 26, 2018, units were dispatched to a personal injury motor vehicle accident on the 1400 block of Oriskany St. just west of Jason St. Initial reports from UFD and hospital staff indicated that the injuries of the motorists involved were non-life threatening. With this information, a decision was made not to reconstruct the accident scene.

However, while on scene, in order to conduct a thorough investigation, Officer Charles Parkosewich administered a breathalyzer test to the at-fault motorist who was being treated in an ambulance. This test indicated the presence of alcohol on the breath of the at-fault motorist and she was charged with DWI. Two days later, the operator of the second vehicle involved passed away as the result of injuries sustained in the accident. The at-fault driver was subsequently charged with vehicular manslaughter in the second degree.

Due to Officer Parkosewich's proven competence in DWI-related offenses, observational skills, diligence and gut intuition, he demonstrated the highest standards of our profession and removed a dangerous felon and drunk driver from the community.

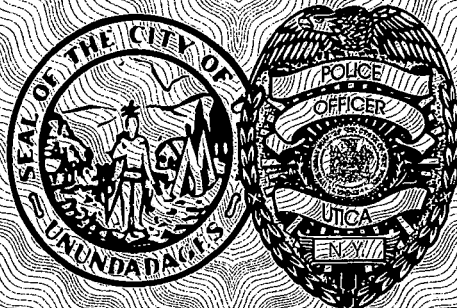

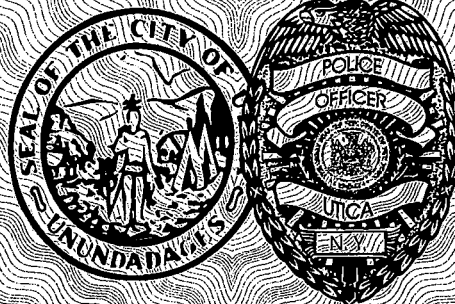

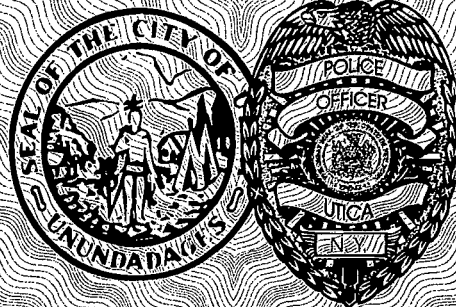

On August 5, 2015, around 9:00 p.m., Investigator Charles Goldstein received information that a male subject may be in possession of an illegal handgun. Investigator Goldstein had been given a very detailed description of the subject's clothing and location of the 1500 block of Neilson Street. He relayed the information to Tactical Unit Car 27 - Officers Sean Bubnis and David Desens as well as Patrol 3 Car 55 - Officers Charles Parkosewich and Dennis Basler in hopes that the officers could locate the suspect and conduct an illegal weapon possession investigation. Shortly thereafter, Officers Parkosewich and Basler spotted the suspect walking in the roadway in violation of NYS VTL 1156A. They then attempted to stop the suspect so they could address his VTL violation, as well as conduct an investigation regarding his possible possession of an illegal handgun. The suspect refused to comply with the officers' directives to stop and fled on foot. The officers chased the suspect in an effort to take him into police custody. Moments later, Officers Bubnis and Desens arrived and joined the chase. The officers caught the suspect on James Street and a physical struggle to take the suspect into custody ensued. During the physical struggle, the suspect retrieved an illegal handgun from his person and discarded the firearm onto the ground. Together, the officers were able to take the suspect into custody without further incident.

The suspect was identified and the handgun was seized. The suspect did not possess a valid pistol permit and therefore possessed the semi-automatic .32-caliber pistol illegally. The suspect was charged with various Criminal Possession of Weapon crimes in addition to other associated charges.

Due to the seamless teamwork, attention to duty, keen observations, and selflessness of all the involved officers, a dangerous armed criminal was apprehended and an illegally possessed handgun was seized without incident. The actions of Investigator Charles Goldstein, Officer Sean Bubnis, Officer David Desens, Officer Charles Parkosewich and Officer Dennis Basler bring honor to themselves and the Utica Police Department.

The officers made contact with the party and were able to identify her as a wanted party from an outside agency. It was apparent to the officers that the party was under the influence of narcotics. The officers arrested the party and began the transport to Utica Police Headquarters. While en route to Police Headquarters, the officers noticed that the party became unresponsive and her breathing became labored. The officers quickly determined the party was suffering from what appeared to be an opiate overdose and administered Naloxone to reverse the effects of the overdose. After a brief moment, the party regained consciousness and her breathing returned to normal. The alarm came in as a front glass breakage, indicating a burglary in progress.

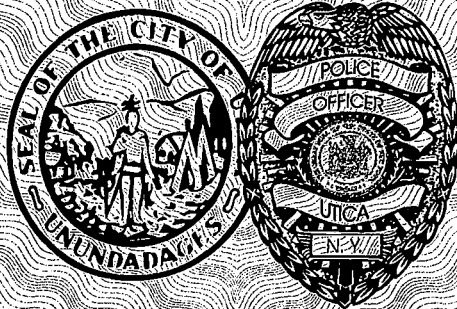

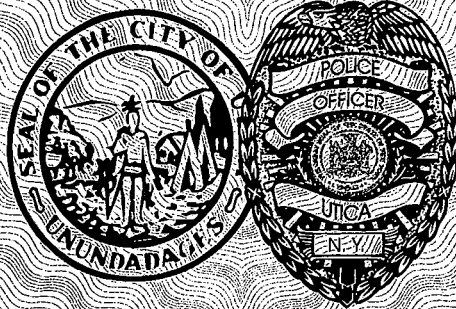

They were assigned to hot spot areas within the City of Utica to assist patrol units with these trouble spots. The main objective of the GIVE detail is to proactively seek out any persons who could possibly be in possession of illegal firearms, to help reduce gun-involved violence within the city.

Around 1:00 a.m., while at the intersection of Dakin Street & Park Ave., they observed a vehicle traveling South on Park Ave. at a high rate of speed. They also observed that the rear right passenger was hanging out of his window. After observing numerous New York State Vehicle and Traffic Laws violations, Officer Parkosewich conducted a vehicle stop while at the intersection of Kemble Street & Hobart Street.

Officer Parkosewich approached the driver's side of the vehicle and interviewed the operator, who he recognized as a local gang member. 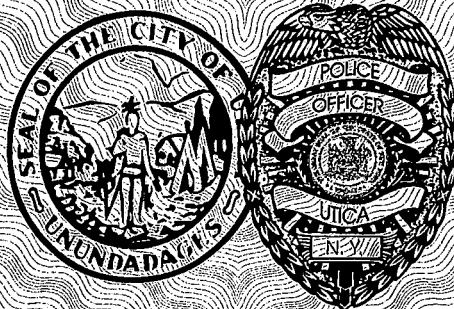

They were tasked with stationary and mobile surveillance of various hot spots throughout the city in order to assist marked police units also assigned to the detail. The main objective of the GIVE detail was to proactively seek out any persons who could possibly be in possession of illegal firearms to help reduce gun-involved violence within the city.

Around 1:20 a.m., the officers observed a vehicle traveling east on Eagle Street with the driver side head lamp not functioning. After seeing this violation, they activated their emergency lights to indicate to the driver that he was being stopped, at which point the vehicle started to slow down, the front passenger's side door opened and a male jumped out of the vehicle while it was still in motion. As the male jumped out of the vehicle, Officer Parkosewich observed him remove a revolver from his waistband as he ran eastbound through the yards toward Steuben Street. Officer Parkosewich gave chase while maintaining a constant visual of the male as he was still in possession of the handgun; however, due to the fact that the male was climbing fences, Officer Parkosewich lost sight of the male and the pursuit ended in the 1100 block of Steuben Street.

At approximately 2:50 a.m., Officer Eric White saw the same male entering 1305 Genesee Street and notified Officer Parkosewich who responded to the area. The male was then taken into custody and he was found to be in possession of two (2) live .380 rounds of ammunition. Officer Parkosewich and Trooper Swienton then used a metal detector and began re-tracing the suspect's path and located a .380 caliber revolver.

Due to Officer Parkosewich's, Trooper Swienton's and Officer White's alertness and strong dedication to duty, they were able to remove a handgun and dangerous individual from the streets. They bring honor to their respective agencies.

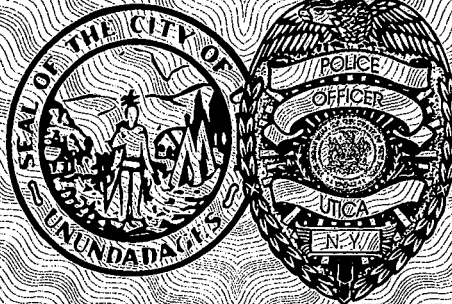

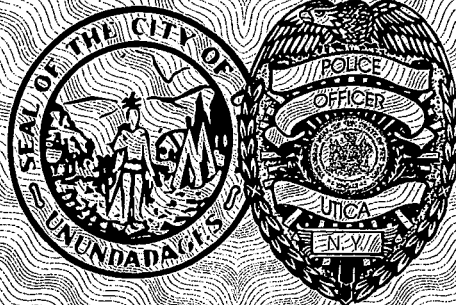

On April 12, 2014, at approximately 2330 hours, Officers Parkosewich and Abel were dispatched to 1009 Smith Place, apartment # 1, regarding a possible trespass. While en route to the call, the 911 Dispatching Center advised the responding officers that the suspect was a Hispanic male.

While responding to the call and in the area of Smith Place, Officer Parkosewich's attention was immediately drawn to a male who was walking west on Rutger Street from Mohawk Street. Officer Parkosewich noted that the male was wearing blue jeans, a red shirt, and a black jacket.

Upon his arrival to 1009 Smith Place, Officer Parkosewich locates and interviews the caller who was crying and had visible marks on her neck. While Officer Parkosewich was interviewing the victim, she stated that she had been in her apartment on Smith Place, when a male acquaintance of hers, knocked on her front door and when she answered it, the male pushed his way into her apartment and forced her to have sex with him. Officer Parkosewich ascertains a clothing description, at which time he is told that the male was wearing blue jeans, a red shirt and black jacket and lives on Rutger St.

Officers also saw blood on the front porch and several windows broken out of the home. While officers were interviewing family, the female said that there were guns on the second floor and prior to police arrival, the suspect threw a six year child to the ground outside, injuring her.

Based on the exigent circumstances, the officers made entry into the home and immediately made contact with the suspect who ran up to the second floor. Officers chased after him, observing that there was blood covering the walls. The suspect ran into a bedroom and attempted to slam the door shut on pursuing officers. After a prolonged battle, the officers were able to take the man into custody. Officers located 2-12 ga. Shotguns ammunition, brass knuckles, 2 marijuana smoking pipes and 12 packets of bath salts.

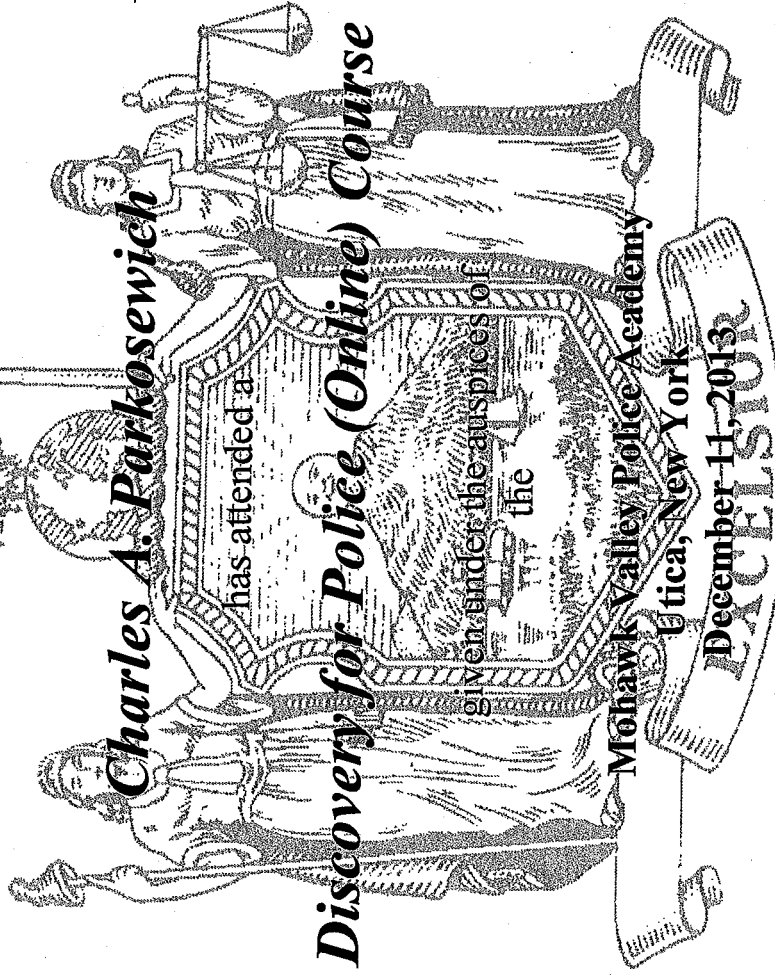

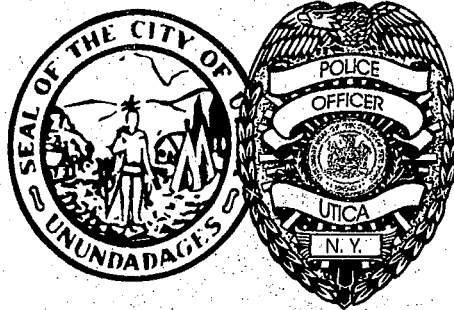

The officers quick response, alertness and teamwork, led to the arrest of three dangerous criminals. They are a credit to themselves and the entire Utica Police Department.

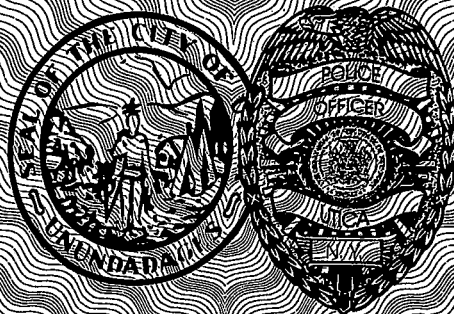
