Officer Manion always came to work ready to take on any available tasks/duties. He diligently kept up on his assigned GIVE duties and assisted F/T FIO A. Donaldson on a regular basis.

Officer Manion was always respectful and courteous to departmental supervision. He responded well to any requests assigned to him by myself or any other CID supervisory personnel. He always accepted tasks without complaint, and was open to any critique of his performance or decision-making.

He utilized one (1) sick day during this observation period.

Officer Manion demonstrated excellent analytical initiative during his assignment in the MVCAC. He self-initiated a database to track known offenders and their vehicles/associates. Although not a perfect database, his actions demonstrated a strong willingness to add to the cause and support the goals of the unit. He also instrumental in a new process for tracking our top 10 GIVE Offenders by evaluating offender statistics on a monthly basis.

In August, Officer Manion was involved in a property damage MV accident in the UPD parking lot while on-duty. Officer Manion was operating his privately owned vehicle at the time of the accident even after being advised by me that he was to operate police vehicles while conducting police duties during his shift.

Officer Manion always produced high quality products/reports for officers/investigators requesting work from the MVCAC. His reports/products were thorough and comprehensive, and delivered to requesting entities in a timely fashion. On multiple occasions I received positive feedback on his work from our customers.

Officer Manion came to the MVCAC with several contacts from outside the Utica Police Department, and while assigned here he made many more. He was able to work well with outside agencies and foster productive lines of communication. Unfortunately, Officer Manion did not have such a fruitful working relationship with members of the UPD, especially with his former TAC co-workers and members of SIU. For whatever reasons, there was a strained relationship, which at times caused issues. The position requires open lines of communication and trust with members of the department, especially specialized units working proactive criminal details. The exact reasons for these issues are unknown to me, but with all this being said I can say that I have never known Officer Manion to be disrespectful or untrustworthy while assigned to this unit.

Officer Manion interacted well with members of the public. He often was a contact person for known GIVE Offenders, and was fair and impartial when dealing with those with a propensity for violent crime. He regularly treated the public, to include victims, witnesses, and suspects alike, with dignity and respect.

How can this employee best improve his/her performance? Officer Manion was assigned as the Part-time GIVE FIO at the MVCAC after an approximate 8-month assignment in the TAC Unit. The position was not only new to Officer Manion, but was a newly created position in a newly created unit, the MVCAC. Officer Manion brought with him foresight for the position and the professional ability to network with law enforcement officials around the county. Although removed from the temporary assignment, he should remain positive and continue to hone his analytical and investigative skills for possible future openings within the department. He worked well in the MVCAC and should bring the knowledge and skills he learned to his fellow officers in the Patrol Division.

PO Manion:

On November 13th 2018 at approximately 1537 hours, while traveling to 1102 McQuade Ave., you struck a police barricade at the intersection of South St. and Taylor Ave. You reported to Sgt. Samuel Geddes that you were having issues with your windshield fogging up and while attempting to remedy it, you struck the barricade. The barricade had been placed in the roadway several weeks before, to prevent vehicles from running over a sink hole that had formed in the center of the intersection. As a result of striking the barricade, car 55 sustained minor damage to the front grill and hood. Don's Ford estimated the value of the damage at \$701.83.

As a result of the investigation it was determined that you have violated Department Procedural Manual section:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

PO Manion:

On June 19th 2018 at approximately 1455hrs, you and car 52 (PO Eric White) were parked in the parking lot at 809 Court St. Simultaneously, you both were dispatched to the area of Elizabeth St. and Kossuth Ave. for a robbery investigation. As you were exiting the parking lot at 809 Court St., you noticed that the street was freshly tarred/paved. In response, you attempted to back up and turn around, in order to exit on the Stark St. side of the parking lot. Not realizing White was close behind you, you collided with car 52, causing an estimated \$3,476.07 worth of damage to both vehicles (combined). It was determined (through investigation) that you were at fault for the collision.

As a result of the investigation it was determined that you have violated Department Procedural Manual Sections:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics




Dear Chief of Police Williams,

Good morning. I wanted to drop you both a quick thank you note in regards to the pediatric code of [REDACTED] that came in on 5/8/18. Due to quick thinking of Officer Manion (prior to EMS arrival) he gave life saving interventions to the 9 month old baby via mouth to mouth and CPR. Upon UFD arrival, more life saving interventions were given. IO was placed and patient was bagged via BVM along with medications that helped the child's heart. Due to the quick thinking of EMS and PD this child was expeditiously (I think somewhere around 10 minutes from dispatch to ED) brought to the FSLHC ED and intubated by a pediatric anesthesiologist and CRNA. She has multiple congenital medical problems and was an extremely complex case. The mother was at the scene and told FD that she had spasms in her trachea, it was decided to transport to FSLHC. If this decision had not been made so quickly, the anesthesiologist may not have been able to intubate.

Due to the multiple co-morbidities of this child her condition is still guarded. She will hopefully be extubated tomorrow as her congestive heart failure has started to resolve.

I just wanted to thank everyone involved. This was a complex case and due to the collaboration between UPD, UFD and MVHS this child survived. She is a medically complex and if one tiny thing had changed, the outcome would have been much, much different.

Chief Kelly,

I am writing you to make you aware of a call where members of our department preformed their job well and represented the department in a manor where I feel they should be recognized. On today's date Tac 2 and Rescue 2 were dispatched to a pediatric code 99 involving an 8 month old female. Upon arrival Tac 2 crew found PO Manion of UPD preforming mouth to mouth and CPR on the child and were informed that it was a cardiac arrest. Tac 2 began care and assessed to find that the child was truly in cardiac arrest and they initiated an airway and attached the cardiac monitor. At this time I arrived and offered my assistance and was directed to assess the patients history from family. I discovered that the patient had a birth defect affecting her heart and had history of episodes but never this bad. This information was relayed to the crew. At this time the rescue arrived where I informed the crew of the progress of the call and then assisted the mother to the ambulance front passenger seat. I then asked the crew if they needed anything in the back of the ambulance and was advised that they just needed a driver. At this time D/C Ambrose arrived and advised me to drive them in and he would secure the Tac and Car 208. PO Manion escorted the ambulance to St Luke's clearing intersections for us. Upon arrival to the ED the patient had regained pulses. Pt care was turned over to the hospital and the staff and doctors commended the crew involved in this call. I have to say having witnessed this call that it could not have gone any smoother and the team dynamic we try for on every call was in full force. I believe the members should be recognized for their actions.

As a result of Officer Christopher Manion's quick response and medical intervention, the child survived the life-threatening medical emergency. He is a credit to himself and the Utica Police Department.

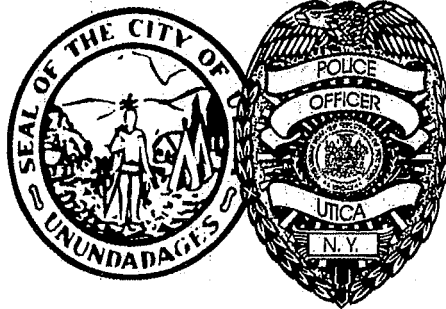

On August 21, 2017, Investigator Aaron Donaldson and Officers Michael Mahay, Christopher Manion, Paul Dewey, Dennis Basler and Tyler Sheppard were assigned to a GIVE Strike Team detail targeting "Hot Spot" locations of recent shooting incidents in the City of Utica. While in the east Utica area, Investigator Donaldson and Officers Dewey and Mahay observed three known GIVE Offenders riding bicycles in violation of several Vehicle & Traffic Law statutes. The three offenders were known to be associated with a violent group in the city believed to be responsible for multiple recent shots fired incidents. Investigator Donaldson notified Officers Manion, Basler and Sheppard of their observations and intentions to make a stop of the individuals.

Working together, the units made a coordinated effort to track and stop the group several blocks from where they were first observed. When the officers initiated contact, the three males began to flee on foot. One male in particular, who was believed to have been involved in several shooting incidents, was observed discarding a handgun in the roadway as he was fleeing the officers. After a foot pursuit and struggle to handcuff, three of the pursuing officers took the individual into custody. A loaded handgun was recovered and the other two suspects were charged accordingly.

The arrest of the violent gun offender had implications on several other gun-involved incidents in the city. He was ultimately convicted at trial for his crimes and sentenced to several years in prison. The officers' keen observation skills, ability to work as a team, and commitment to combating gun violence removed a violent gun offender from the streets and undoubtedly curbed gun violence in the City of Utica.

On Sunday, October 15, 2017, at around 11:30 a.m., Officer Michael Cerminaro was off duty and received a phone call from a criminal informant that had information on the whereabouts of a suspect wanted for murder. Officer Cerminaro then made contact via phone with Sergeant Ashley Berger who was the supervisor working the street. Officer Cerminaro provided Sgt. Berger with the information that the suspect was last seen entering an address on McQuade Ave. after exiting a specific make and model of vehicle.

Sgt. Berger contacted several zone units who then met with her to monitor the area of McQuade Ave. in an attempt to locate the suspect. After approximately twenty minutes of surveilling the area, Sgt. Ashley Berger observed the described vehicle pull out of a driveway on McQuade Ave. It began traveling northbound until reaching a red light at the intersection with South Street.

Sgt. Berger immediately advised Officer Christopher Manion over the radio to pull up to the stopped vehicle so that she could conduct a stop of the vehicle without it fleeing. Once Sgt. Berger conducted the traffic stop, the front seat passenger was positively identified as the suspect and was taken into custody by Officer Manion. The suspect was later charged with murder and criminal possession of a weapon.

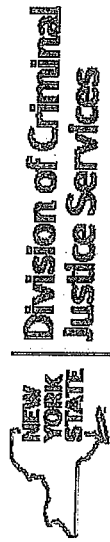

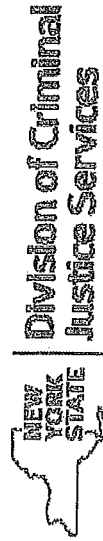

This afternoon at approximately 1546 hours Communications dispatched Car 52 (Officer Manion) and Car 51 (Officer Gymburch) to Catholic Charities (6 Noyes St) regarding an out of control resident. Upon arrival PO Manion was advised by the staff that Sheryl Gary [REDACTED] was on scene verbally threatening staff and throwing items. It was reported to PO Manion that they believed that Gary was under the influence of an unknown narcotic and had been ingesting an unknown substance. When PO Manion began interviewing Gary she was immediately belligerent and would not cooperate with PO Manion. After several attempts to converse with Gary, PO Manion was still unsuccessful and advised her that she was going to be taken into custody. PO Manion then attempted to take Gary into custody by placing her hands behind her back and at that point Gary began actively resisting by stiffening her arms, pulling away from PO Manion's grasp, and twisting her body preventing herself from being taken into custody. Upon Gary actively resisting PO Manion stepped back, un-holstered his department issued Taser, pointed the laser at Gary, and advised her that he would deploy his Taser if she did not comply and place her hands behind her back. Gary continued to be verbally non-compliant and physically aggressive. PO Manion then again attempted to take Gary into custody, but again she actively resisted by tensing up and pushing off of PO Manion. At that point PO Manion again un-holstered his Taser, gave Gary several commands for her to put her hands behind her back, but she continued to be verbally and physically non-compliant and stated, "Tase me then!". It was at that point PO Manion announced, "Taser, Taser, Taser" and deployed the Taser probes into Gary's right arm. Upon the Taser probes making contact with Gary's arm she dropped to the ground and PO Manion attempted to handcuff her while under the influence of the 5 second cycle. Gary continued to resist being taken into custody so at that point PO Manion administered a follow up drive stun to Gary's left hamstring in order to gain compliance. Gary continued to resist and once PO Gymburch arrived on scene she and PO Manion were able to handcuff Gary to the rear without any further incident. Once Gary was in custody the officers requested a supervisor to respond to their location. UFD was also dispatched to the scene. I responded to the scene and the following response to resistance investigation was initiated.

Subsequently, PO Manion took his department issued Taser (SN: X13004FC0) out of service due to the deployment.

It was discovered that a female, [REDACTED], who was accompanying [REDACTED] was missing from the House of the Good Shephard on Champlin Ave. While arrangements were being made to transfer custody of [REDACTED] back to the House of the Good Shepherd both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were sitting on the stairs of the residence being passively resistant. PO Wiley requested another unit at which time Car 55 (PO Manion / PO Adis Gracanic) responded to assist. Upon their arrival PO Wiley closed his distance on [REDACTED] at which time he produced a black folding knife and lunged at PO Wiley. PO Wiley began to struggle with [REDACTED] on the stairs and PO Manion drew his taser, announcing he was going to tase [REDACTED]. Due to [REDACTED] not complying and him not dropping the knife PO Manion drew his service weapon and announced he was going to shoot [REDACTED]. During this time [REDACTED] had grabbed [REDACTED] in an attempt to assist with disarming him, which caused PO Manion to not have a clear and safe backdrop to discharge his firearm at [REDACTED]. During the struggle with [REDACTED] he was disarmed and the officers brought him to the ground in order to gain a position of advantage over him. After a brief struggle on the floor [REDACTED] was placed in handcuffs. At this time I had arrived on scene and [REDACTED] was making statements that he [REDACTED]. This coupled with his actions of lunging at PO Wiley with [REDACTED] he was going to be arrested for the [REDACTED]. I contacted PO Parkosewich, due to [REDACTED], and advised him regarding the potential felony charges against him.

On 6/4/19 the PSU recived the closure narrative wrttien by Lt. Dougherty. While reviewing the IA Pro it was discovered that vital information was missing and the UOF report in RMS was not visable. After speaking with MIS Sgt Selimovic, it was learned that once the RMS record is sealed, it cannot be viewed or unsealed without a court order. At this time the information is unable to verified due to the current status of the resord.

On Friday, May 31, 2019, I, Sergeant Samuel M. Geddes reported to the Utica Police Department for the 0745 to 1600 hours shift. I was assigned to the Uniform Patrol Division as a "B" Platoon street supervisor in SUV 40, attired in full uniform, under the command of "B" Platoon Squad Commander, Lt. S. Dougherty.

At about 1019 hours, Car 54, PO T. Duval was dispatched to Family Dollar, 1711 Genesee Street for a larceny in progress. Upon PO Duval's arrival he called out with a failure to comply. Upon arrival PO Manion observed a black male, now known to be Brandon Lacy, verbally arguing with his girlfriend Matilda in front of 1218 Leeds St. Matilda was yelling that Brandon had struck her and broken her glasses while Brandon continued to be aggressive toward her and ignored PO Manion's commands to get away from her. Brandon was posturing and getting within inches of Matilda's face as if he was going to physically fight her again, meanwhile Matilda yelled at Brandon to get away from her. It was learned from Matilda that she lives at 1204 Leeds St. and when Brandon started to get violent with her she left the residence and walked up the street to get away from him but he followed and continued to fight her, breaking her glasses. No injuries. No civilian complaints.

40, attired in full police uniform, under the command of Lt. S. Dougherty.

At about 1132 hours Car 55, Officer C. Manion responded to 1500 block Neilson Street regarding a Motor Vehicle Accident and the driver was fleeing the scene. The vehicle was described as a white SAAB SUV and the operator was described as a white male, long hair and dark clothing. At approximately 1055 hours dispatch advised of a BOLO out of NHPD for NY Reg [REDACTED] a 2008 Chrysler Sebring with two females occupying it that were wanted regarding a possible Grand Larceny at a store in the mall. The Reg came back to a residence on 513 Milgate St.

While patrolling the area, car 56, PO Husnay observed this vehicle pulling into the driveway of 513 Milgate St. He conducted a vehicle stop of the same in the driveway. Summary:

On July 29th 2018, I reviewed an investigation completed by Sgt. Ashley Berger in relation to a motor vehicle accident (involving car 52 and car 46), in the parking lot at 809 Court St., near the Shoppes at the Finish Line complex.

Investigation:

On June 19th 2018 at approximately 1455hrs, both car 52 (PO Eric White) and car 46 (PO Christopher Manion) were parked in the parking lot at 809 Court St. Simultaneously, they were dispatched to the area of Elizabeth St. and Kossuth Ave. for a robbery investigation. As they were exiting the parking lot at Court St., Manion (who was in the lead) noticed that the street was freshly tarred/paved. In response, Manion attempted to back up and turn around, in order to exit on the Stark St. side of the parking lot. Not realizing White was close behind him, he collided with car 52, causing an estimated \$3,476.07 worth of damage to both vehicles (combined). It was determined (through investigation) that Manion was at fault for the collision. An accident report was completed by PO Scott Berger and photographs of the damage were secured.

Findings:

Based upon her investigation, Berger found that Manion violated the following section(s) of our procedural manual:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

J. Duty Post;

1. Employees shall not leave their area of assignment unless they are:
 - a. On assignment from the dispatcher; or
 - b. Authorized by a supervisor; or
 - c. An incident outside their area requires immediate police attention; or

d. In close pursuit of a violator of the law.

EE. Departmental Vehicles/Operation/Care/ Personal Use/MV Accident/Reporting;

2. Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.

***Based upon my review of Manion's disciplinary history, the cost of the damage to both vehicles and the aforementioned procedural manual violations, I recommend that he receives a letter of reprimand and forfeits (1) vacation day from his time bank for his indiscretions.**

On June 19, 2018 I reported to the Utica Police Department, Patrol Division, B-3, for the hours of 0745-1600 and was assigned to Car 40. Sgt. S. Geddes was the acting Squad Commander.

At approximately 1455 hours Zone Car 52 (PO White), Zone Car 53 (PO Manion) and I were dispatched to the area of Elizabeth St. and Kossuth Ave. for a Robbery. (See RMS 18-24751 & related). Due to other closer units calling out for the call, dispatch cancelled Zone Car 53 at 1456 hours but kept Zone Car 52 in route. At the time of dispatch both vehicles 52 and 46 (being utilized for Zone 53) were in the parking lot of the old Central Electronics located at 809 Court St., City of Utica, County of Oneida, State of New York. PO Manion began to operate car 46 north east through the parking lot to the exit onto Court St. PO White followed behind him as he was headed to the call on Kossuth Ave. When PO Manion reached the exit he observed roadwork, including fresh tar, covering Court St. Even though the exit from the parking lot was not blocked off PO Manion said he was unsure if he could drive on the roadway or not so he decided to back up and attempt to turn around and exit the parking lot through the Stark St. side. PO Manion stated he did not see PO White stopped behind him in the parking lot and when he backed up the rear of car 46 struck the front end of car 52.

PO White stated that after being dispatched to the call on Kossuth Ave. he headed north east through the parking lot at 809 Court St. behind PO Manion in car 46. He stated that when PO Manion reached the exit onto Court St. both cars came to a stop and observed road crews working on paving and it was unclear if cars could exit the parking lot this way. PO White said he then saw car 46's reverse lights come on and begin to back up and he was unable to move his own vehicle out of the way in time to avoid a collision. He stated the rear of car 46 struck the front of car 52 causing damage to both vehicles. He then contacted this Sergeant via phone and I advised him to keep both vehicles in place while they waited for my response.

Upon my arrival I observed road crews paving and taring Court St. from Sunset Ave. to Schuyler St. There were flag men at both ends allowing some traffic flow on Court and there was one "Road Closed" sign on Varick St., not allowing traffic onto Court St. The southern lane of Court St. was covered in fresh tar lines. The northern lane of Court St. was fresh asphalt. There was no traffic control device, sign, or flag person at the entrance/exit of the parking lot making it unclear whether they wanted traffic on the roadway from that location or not.

I observed car 46 first in line to exit the parking lot. It was parked on the apron, over the sidewalk at this point. Car 52 was parked directly behind it. Car 46 had obvious damage to it; A large dent in the bottom of the trunk lid and the rear bumper was dented and pulling away from

the body of the vehicle on both the right and left side. Car 52's damage was not as obvious. It sustained scuffs to the license plate area and the hood was not sitting flush, though it was still operational. I secured overall and midrange photos of each vehicle and later entered them into the 2018 Crime Scene Photos under RMS 18-24756. Neither officer was injured therefore no photos were secured of them.

Zone Car 51 (PO Berger) responded to complete the MV104L. Both PO Manion and PO White possess Valid NYS Driver's Licenses. In the report PO Manion was listed as V1 and faulted for Unsafe Backing. No citations were issued. The Logistics and Resources Unit, Professional Standards Unit, and Duty Commander were all notified of the accident via e-mail. Both car 46 and car 52 were driven to headquarters and taken out of service until they could be cleared by Fleet Maintenance.

An estimate was obtained from the Carbone Collision Center via Fleet Maintenance which stated the cost to repair car 52 would be approximately \$898.80. The cost to repair car 46 would be approximately \$2,577.27 for a total of \$3,476.07.

Based on my familiarity with the call dispatched, my observations of the scene, and speaking with the involved parties I determined that PO Manion was at fault for the accident for Unsafe Backing (VTL 1211a). He was also in violation of the below listed Department Policies and Procedures due to him being out of his patrol zone without permission and not using care when operating his department vehicle.



On June 19, 2018 at approximately 1455 hours PO Manion (Zone 53/Car 46) was attempting to exit the parking lot located at 809 Court St. into the intersection of Court St. and Varick St. PO Manion saw that Court St. was currently being paved and decided he did not want to drive on the fresh tar so he backed his patrol vehicle up so that he could turn around. Car 46 sustained a large indentation to the trunk lid as well as separation between the rear bumper and the vehicle itself. Both vehicles were taken out of service and parked at the Fleet Maintenance Garage. Car 51 (PO Berger) handled the MV104A. I will be handling the investigation.

Summary:

On January 24th 2019, I reviewed an investigation completed by Sgt. Samuel Geddes in relation to a property damage incident involving car 55.

Investigation:

On November 13th 2018 at approximately 1537hrs, while traveling to 1102 McQuade Ave., PO Christopher Manion struck a police barricade at the intersection of South St. and Taylor Ave. Manion told Geddes that he was having issues with his window fogging and while he was attempting to remedy it, he struck the barricade. The barricade had been placed in the roadway several weeks before, to prevent vehicles from running over a sinkhole that had formed in the center of the intersection. As a result of striking the barricade, car 55 sustained minor damage to the front grill and hood. Photographs were secured by Geddes and an estimate of the damage was completed by Don's Ford. The estimate valued the damage at \$701.83. A check a Manion's license status came back valid.

Findings:

Based upon his investigation, Geddes cited Manion for violating the following section(s) of our procedural manual:

Chapter Eight, Article One, Professional Standards of Conduct and Ethics

1.14 PERFORMANCE AND ATTENTION TO DUTY:

EE. Departmental Vehicles/Operation/Care/ Personal Use/MV Accident/Reporting;

2. Employees shall operate departmental vehicles in a careful and prudent manner, and shall obey all laws and departmental directives pertaining to such operation.

***Based upon my review of Manion's disciplinary history, the damage to car 55 and the aforementioned procedural manual violation, I recommend that he receives a letter of reprimand and forfeits (1) vacation day from his time bank.**

I, Officer Christopher Manion reported for duty on November 13, 2018, attired in full duty uniform with BWC 5258. I was assigned to the 0745-1600 hours' tour under the command of Lt. S. Dougherty. I was assigned to marked patrol car/zone 55.

I began my tour late, reporting to work at approximately 0815 hours. On my arrival, I secured my equipment, and made my way to car 55, which was parked against the cell block, facing north. Due to me starting my shift late, I did not have the opportunity to speak with the officer that utilized car 55 during the previous shift. When I did secure car 55, I did not observe any damage.

At approximately 1537 hours, while traveling to a call at 1102 McQuade Ave., I was having issues with the windshield fogging. While attempting to remedy this, I struck a police barricade at the intersection of Taylor Ave. and South St. The barricade was in the driving lane. After hitting the barricade, I examined both the barricade and car 55 for damage and I did not observe any damage. I then replaced the barricade, and continued to the parking lot of Hannaford, where I again looked for damage. I did not observe any damage to car 55 at that time. I then proceeded to the call at 1102 McQuade Ave. Following the call on McQuade Ave., I proceed to Police Headquarters for the all-clear.

At approximately 1704 hours on 11/13/2018, I received a phone call from PO Femia. I was home at the time of the call. PO Femia, along with PO Comeskey, had relieved me at shift-change. PO Femia informed me that there was damage to the front of car 55, which was consistent with the vehicle striking a pole. PO Femia stated he did not observe this damage at shift change, and that it was brought to his attention by Sgt. Carville.

After speaking with PO Femia, I contacted Sgt. Carville regarding the damage. At that time, I advised Sgt. Carville that I did not observed any damage to car 55 either before my shift, or at the conclusion of my tour. After speaking with Sgt. Carville, PO Femia sent me a picture of the damage which, according to the picture, appeared to be very significant and indicative of the vehicle hitting a pole. This further bolstered my belief that the damage was not caused during my tour as the damage seen in the photograph would have been impossible to miss.

When I reported for my tour on 11/14/2018, I inspected car 55, and observed the damage to be far less significant than that of what the picture depicted and I made the decision to notify Sgt. Geddes regarding the barricade and the possibility that the barricade was the cause of the damage.

On Wednesday, November 14, 2018, I, Sergeant Samuel M. Geddes reported to the Utica Police Department for the 0745 to 1600 hours shift. I was assigned as a street supervisor in Car 40, under the command of Lt. S. Dougherty.

At approximately 0830 hours I met with Car 55, PO C. Manion at Elm Street and the Parkway, at his request. Upon meeting with PO Manion he advised me that on 11/13/2018 he was operating Car 55 eastbound on South Street when he struck a barricade that was in his lane of travel at the intersection with Taylor Avenue. Several weeks ago four barricades were placed in a square surrounding a sink hole in the center of the intersection. This sink hole has been covered with an orange plastic traffic barrel all summer, but due to deterioration the barricades had to be placed.

Officer Manion informed me that he was responding to a call at 1102 McQuade Avenue (RMS # 18-46954) when he began to have problems with his front windshield fogging up, which caused him to lose visibility when he struck the barricade. He told me that he checked for damage and finding none he responded to his call, completed same and secured for the day.

On 11/14/2018 Officer Manion learned that there was damage to Car 55 and he reported that he had struck a barricade the previous day. I inspected Car 55 and saw that the height of the damage was consistent with that of a barricade, as well as some slight yellow paint transfer.

We responded to the Fleet Maintenance garage where photographs were secured and an appointment for an estimate was set up with the Carbone body shop.

Fleet Maintenance staff cleared car 55 for service.

As a result of the impact with the barricade, the estimate of damages was \$701.83.



This is to inform you that on Tuesday, November 13, 2018 at approximately 1537 hours, Officer Chris Manion who was operating Car 55, was East bound on South Street when he struck a barricade that was in his lane of travel at the intersection with Taylor Avenue. Several weeks ago four barricades were placed in a square surrounding a sink hole in the center of the intersection. This sink hole has been covered with an orange plastic traffic barrel all summer, but due to deterioration the barricades had to be placed.

Officer Manion informed me that he was responding to a call at 1102 McQuade Avenue (RMS # 18-46954) when he began to have problems with his front windshield fogging up, which caused him to lose visibility when he struck the barricade. He told me that he checked for damage and finding none he responded to his call, completed same and secured for the day.

On 11/14/2018 Officer Manion learned that there was damage to Car 55 and he reported that he had struck a barricade the previous day. I met with Officer Manion and saw that the height of the damage was consistent with that of a barricade, as well as some slight yellow paint transfer. We responded to the Fleet Maintenance garage where photographs were secured and an appointment for an estimate was set up with the Carbone body shop. Fleet Maintenance staff cleared car 55 for service.
