





Investigator Desens's dedication, determination and tireless work on this investigation lead to the seizure of illegal firearms and narcotics.



Since it was re-instated on April 14, 2015, within its first year, the Tactical Unit conducted over 75 solo or joint operations dedicated to combating specific issues facing this city such as prostitution, reverse prostitution, underage alcohol sales and untaxed cigarette sales. They also conducted pro-active action sweeps, larceny details, burglary details, Gun Involved Violence Elimination (G.I.V.E.), Varick Street area event details, as well as directed enforcement of specific high crime areas.

The Tactical Unit was responsible for making nearly 1,000 arrests for offenses ranging from city ordinance violations to violent felonies, issued over 1,600 traffic tickets, assisted the Patrol Division on over 1,200 calls and conducted over 8,000 hot spot checks throughout the city. Most notably, the unit made over 225 narcotic-related arrests, seized over \$18,000 in U.S. currency and removed 14 illegal firearms that resulted in arrests, from the streets of Utica.

The Unit also took a very aggressive approach to combating illegal cabarets and after-hours parties, which have plagued the city. The majority of these illegal cabarets and parties are known for a high propensity for violence. The efforts put forth by the Tactical Unit significantly impacted and effectively reduced the amount of violence that typically occurred during the early morning weekend hours when these events took place.



Investigator Goldstein had been given a very detailed description of the subject's clothing and location of the 1500 block of Neilson Street. He relayed the information to Tactical Unit Car 27 – Officers Sean Bubnis and David Desens as well as Patrol 3 Car 55 – Officers Charles Parkosewich and Dennis Basler in hopes that the officers could locate the suspect and conduct an illegal weapon possession investigation. They then attempted to stop the suspect so they could address his VTL violation, as well as conduct an investigation regarding his possible possession of an illegal handgun. Moments later, Officers Bubnis and Desens arrived and joined the chase. The officers caught the suspect on James Street and a physical struggle to take the suspect into custody ensued. During the physical struggle, the suspect retrieved an illegal handgun from his person and discarded the firearm onto the ground. Together, the officers were able to take the suspect into custody without further incident.

The suspect was identified and the handgun was seized. The suspect did not possess a valid pistol permit and therefore possessed the semi-automatic .32 caliber pistol illegally. The suspect was charged with various Criminal Possession of Weapon crimes in addition to other associated charges.



On August 1, 2015, around 9:10 p.m., while Tactical Unit members Sergeant James Holt and Officers Joshua Hartnett and David Desens, were conducting a special detail, numerous patrol units were dispatched to the area of the 1000 block of Whitesboro Street for a reported shooting. While Sergeant Holt and Officers Hartnett and Desens were en route, dispatch advised that the shooting suspect had fled the scene in a green van.

Shortly thereafter, a green van passed Sergeant Holt and Officers Hartnett and Desens on Lafayette Street at a high rate of speed. Upon noting the suspect vehicle, the officers pursued the vehicle which continued eastbound on Lafayette Street and abruptly entered the civilian lot at police headquarters, parking near the front entrance of the police station. The officers then positioned themselves behind but offset from the suspect vehicle as it parked so that a "high risk felony stop" could be carried out. Sergeant Holt and Officers Hartnett and Desens utilized cover with weapons drawn and issued verbal directives for the suspect to drop the gun and surrender. As the suspect vehicle was cleared of any additional threats and the crime scene was secured, an illegally possessed, loaded 9mm KSI handgun, was found and seized. The handgun had just been utilized in a shooting of another male victim minutes before. The suspect was later charged with Assault 1st as well as various Criminal Possession of a Weapon charges.





On October 11, 2015, at approximately 3:20 a.m., Tactical and Patrol units were dispatched to a reported shots fired at 916 Lenox Ave. While en route, officers learned that at least two people had been shot and UFD had been requested. Upon police arrival, two males were found shot and were escorted to a UFD staging point. Due to the rapid response, officers quickly surrounded the house and began interviewing potential witnesses on scene.

This was an evolving situation with over 100 persons still on scene, so it was determined that all persons leaving would be pat frisked for weapons. Sgt. Phillips and Officer Desens were in the rear of the house with approximately 20 persons waiting to get checked. In this group was a male who was concealing the lower half of his body near a SUV parked in the driveway. He wouldn't initially put his hands in the air like the others. When Sgt. Phillips and Officer Desens ordered him to join the rest of the group, he did but not before squatting down slightly at the waist. When he did this, Sgt. Phillips heard an object slide across the ground in the area where this male was standing. Moments later, Officer Scott Lewis arrived and was asked to check under this vehicle for any type of discarded evidence. It was there that he located a loaded .32 caliber semi-automatic pistol. This male, who was later found to be on parole, was immediately taken into custody.

The vigilance, actions and focused investigation of Sgt. Phillips, Officer Desens and Officer Lewis led to the arrest of a parolee and removal of an illegally possessed firearm from the streets of Utica. Their actions bring great honor to the City of Utica and the City of Utica Police Department.



On 7/20/19 at about 2154 hours units were dispatched to the area of Steuben and Addington. The caller gave information about a male that was following her and may have a gun. PO Detraglia advised that the party in question was going to Laquea Lawrence and that he was just on a call regarding the same person. I responded to the area with multiple other units to assist with an area check. It was relayed to officers that Lawrence had 5 active bench warrants from this agency. Upon doing an area check officers stated they saw him run through the yards north bound from Addington Pl. A perimeter was set up and after several minutes PO Desens called out that he had the male at the intersection of Steuben and Grove. Units converged on his location as it was relayed that the party was resisting. Upon my arrival Lawrence was handcuffed and laying on the ground. As officers helped him up he began to fight with them and scream and kick at officers while

jumping up and down. At this time, officers took him to the ground again to gain position of advantage. On the ground, Lawrence was banging his head on the sidewalk saying that the police kicked him. He was extremely combative and would not comply. Family members of his approached and were yelling to him to comply and stop fighting with the police. This did not calm him down. PO Desens then drew his taser and turned it on and pressed it against Lawrence's upper back and gave commands to stop resisting or he would be tased. After several moments Lawrence was calmed down. Lawrence was then helped up and walked to the rear of car 26. At the rear door, he refused to get in the car and began to fight with officers again. At this time several officers were attempting to place him in the car and during the struggle their duty belts scraped against the rear drivers side quarter panel of car 26, causing several scratches.

I responded to the passenger side of car 26 and grabbed ahold of Lawrence's wrist as PO Desens utilized a come along and we were able to get him seated in the rear of car 26.

During the incident, Lawrence grabbed PO Kellogg and was kicking at several officers.

Lawrence was transported to HQ and turned over to the booking officer.

Depositions were secured from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] about what they saw during the incident.

PO Comeskey secured photographs of the scene. PO Sheppard secured photographs of Lawrence at HQ as well as the damage to car 26.

All BWC footage was downloaded and tagged. Photographs were downloaded into the proper folder.

On 10/10/19 at about 0125 hours PO Desens and PO Detraglia conducted a stop of NY [REDACTED] at the intersection of Wavery Pl and Watson Pl. PO Detraglia approached the passenger side of the car. As he did he observed the rear seat passenger to have a clear corner knotted bag with what appeared to be narcotics in it. This male was attempting to put the bag down his pants. Immediately PO Detraglia ordered the male out the car. The male was hesitant so PO Detraglia again ordered him out and escorted him out of the car. PO Detraglia attempted to detain the male who tensed up and immediately began fighting with him. PO Desens assisted PO Detraglia. Both officers administered several hard hand strikes to the males upper body with little effect. The male then attempted to get back into the car and crawl across to get out of the other side of the car away from officers. O Desens ran to the drivers side and stopped the male and administered several more hard hand strikes with little effect. PO Detraglia then announced his intent to use the taser if the male did not stop fighting and comply. The male refused, so PO Detraglia unholstered his taser and deployed the probes into the males right ribs. This had a desired effect and the male was removed from the vehicle and placed in handcuffs. PO Detraglia completed a search of the male and located in his pants one clear corner knotted bag containing an off white chunky substance consistent to crack cocaine. The bag also contained pills. These suspected narcotics appeared to be felonious in nature.

UFD was requested to respond to the scene to evaluate the suspect. The male identified himself as Eric Davis initially in an attempt to prevent officers from gathering his true identity. It was found that the male was actually Daniel Davis ([REDACTED]). UFD arrived on scene and evaluated Davis.

I asked Davis on scene if he was injured and he stated he was not. I asked if he wanted medical attention and he stated yes he did only because he wanted to go to the hospital to be checked out due to being tased. UFD then transported Davis to St Elizabeth's hospital as car 27, PO West and RO Grullon. Followed. As of this email, Davis was still at the hospital waiting to be seen by the doctors.

The operator of the car was issued a ticket for failure to signal. PO Sheppard secured photographs of the scene and of the suspect at the hospital. Photographs were downloaded into the proper folder. BWC footage was downloaded and tagged.

No witnesses were located.

Inv Piersall was contacted and responded regarding the narcotics.

On 10/23/19 at about 2231 hours PO Talerico was responding to assist car 27 with a vehicle stop in the 800 block of Oswego St. PO Talerico was on the 700 block of Oswego St approaching Sunset Ave, traveling west. PO Talerico observed a grey Infiniti traveling north on Sunset Ave at a high rate of speed and passed through a steady red light at the intersection of Oswego St. PO Talerico believed the vehicle to be traveling well over 50mph. Due to the violations he attempted to conduct a stop of the vehicle. He caught up to the vehicle at the intersection of Francis St at Noyes St and activated his emergency lights to conduct the stop. The vehicle bearing NY [REDACTED] pulled into the driveway of 25 Noyes St. The driver immediately exited the driver's seat and began to walk toward the front of the vehicle, away from PO Talerico. PO Talerico attempted to call out the stop and ordered the male who he knows to be Johnathan Wright [REDACTED] to get back into the vehicle. Wright refused to comply and continued to walk away. At this time, due to the male not complying and PO Talerico believing he was about to flee, he grabbed ahold of him and pinned Wright against the car and advised him that he was under arrest. At this point Wright began to resist arrest by tensing up then pulling away while flailing his body in an attempt to get away. PO Talerico utilized a take down in the driveway of 25 Noyes St. While this was occurring, the rear passenger who was identified as Bernard Wright [REDACTED] jumped from the rear passenger seat into the driver seat of the vehicle and attempted to back out of the driveway while PO Talerico was ordering him to stop and not move. This male backed the car into the roadway, striking car 24's front bumper. Officers arrived on scene at this time to assist PO Talerico, who was still struggling on the ground with Johnathan Wright. PO Sheppard assisted by utilizing a come along to get Johnathan's hands out from under his body. After a struggle, Johnathan was handcuffed. He continued to be uncooperative and was then escorted to car 27 by PO Kellogg and PO Talerico. Both officers utilized come alongs due to Johnathan not cooperating and continuing to struggle with officers. I assisted RO Korman with detaining Bernard Wright. Bernard Wright was uncooperative at first and refused to place his hands behind his back but after I ordered him to place his hands behind his back a second time RO Korman and I utilized a come along to place

his hands behind his back and into cuffs. Once in cuffs all force stopped. Bernard Wright was placed into the rear of car 22. As PO Kellogg and PO Talerico attempted to place Johnathan Wright into the rear of car 27, Wright continued to pull away and resist. PO Kellogg continued to use a come along to get him into the back seat. As Johnathan sat into the seat he wrapped PO Kellogg in his legs which caused PO Kellogg to fall into the back seat and Johnathan kicked him in the face with his foot. I immediately responded to the drivers side of the car and grabbed ahold of Johnathan Wrights arms and pulled him across to the drivers side and held him down on the seat in order to gain control over him, as he appeared to be attempting to injure officers. Once PO Kellogg was out of the car, I sat Johnathan up and closed the door. He continued to kick at the doors of the car during the incident. Both Bernard Wright and Johnathan Wright were transported to HQ. At HQ Bernard was turned over to the booking officer immediately. Johnathan Wright continued to be uncooperative at HQ and refused to walk into the station. He began pulling away from officers at which point PO West, RO Grullon and PO Desens utilized come alongs to escort him into the station and turn him over to the booking officer. This response to resistance occurred from 2248 through 2301 hours. Once in the station come alongs were utilized by PO West, PO Grullon and PO Desens in order to place Johnathan Wright on the bench. Once on the bench and secured, all force stopped.

I asked Johnathan Wright if he was injured and he said he was. He complained of an abrasion to his left eye area and lower back pain. He stated that he wanted go to the hospital. UFD was notified and responded to transport him. PO Lentricchia escorted him to St Elizabeth's hospital to be treated. Johnathan was bleeding from his left eye area, but would not cooperate so that I could see clearly where the injury was.

I asked Bernard Wright if he was injured and needed medical attention and he stated he was not injured and did not need medical attention.

As Cortes was being escorted to car 57, he began to display aggressive, non compliant behavior by twisting and thwarting his body around. Cortes refused multiple times to get into the rear of the police car and repeated multiple times "suck my dick you bitch ass niggers, you are going to work hard for this arrest, I will spit in your face to give you covid, when I see you alone you know what will happen. Using empty hand force and verbal commands, Officers were able to place Cortes into the rear of car 57. While in the rear seat, Cortes began attempting to kick out the rear window. Officers opened the rear door asking Cortes to refrain from his actions. Cortes then stuck his legs out of the rear of car 57 and refused to place them back inside so the doors could be shut. Officers again used empty hand force and verbal commands to place Cortes back inside of the car.

NOTICE OF CHARGES

**Pursuant to Section 75 of the
New York Civil Service Law**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that, pursuant to Section 75 of the New York Civil Service Law of the State of New York, you are hereby notified that the following charges are proffered against you:

CHARGE 1. MISCONDUCT and CONDUCT UNBECOMING AN OFFICER

On or about December 29, 2018 at 1:32am, you were involved in an off-duty motor vehicle accident (NHPD,18-9935). You were the operator of your personal vehicle and were involved in a collision on Champlain Avenue in the town of New Hartford, New York. During the subsequent investigation it was determined that a factor in the accident was that you were under the influence of alcohol. You were arrested and charged with DWI in the jurisdiction of New Hartford, New York. On February 5, 2019 at 1:00pm you must appear in person at New Hartford Town Court. In addition to the accident investigation there is also an internal investigation regarding your actions on the above-mentioned date and time. As a result of the internal investigation at this time, it was determined that you violated the following sections of the Utica Police Department Policy and Procedures Manual. Additional disciplinary action may be forthcoming as the investigation progresses.

1.13 ORDERS AND DISCIPLINE:

A. Obedience to Laws, Ordinances and Rules;

1. No member or employee shall violate or attempt to violate a law of the United States of America, or of this state, or any laws or ordinances of the jurisdiction in which he may be present, or violate or attempt to violate any authoritative instruction, current directive, rule or regulation, policy or procedure, or any other lawful order. The department's rules and regulations cover all employees, civilian and police officers.

2. In order to constitute a violation of this rule it is not necessary that a complaint be filed with the department or with a criminal court but only that the facts exist, which would constitute such a violation.
3. A conviction for violation of any law or ordinance shall automatically constitute a violation of this rule.

1.17 GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT:

A. Unbecoming Conduct;

1. Employees shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off-duty, in such a manner as to reflect the highest standards of the law enforcement profession.
2. Employees shall so conduct themselves in both their private and public lives as to avoid bringing discredit upon the Department.
3. Employees shall not engage in conduct on or off duty, which adversely affects the efficiency of the Department, or engage in conduct that has the tendency to impair public respect for the employee and/or the Department and/or impair confidence in the operation of the Department.
4. Employees shall not participate in any incident involving moral depravity or perversion in their personal and business affairs which impairs their ability to perform as employees of the department or which causes the department to be brought into disrepute.

BB. Driver's License Status;

1. All employees of the department are required to possess a valid NYS driver's license. Employees shall report in writing any change in their driver's license status, i.e. suspension, revocation or any restrictions imposed by NYS DMV, to their commanding officer/supervisor prior to reporting for duty. Commanding Officers will forward this information to the Services Division for filing in the employee's personnel file. Employees will be prohibited from operating any city vehicle until the driver's license is reinstated.


PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a hearing on these charges will be held before a duly appointed hearing officer. At the hearing, the entire contents of your personnel file will be entered into evidence.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that a written answer to these charges must be personally served upon the undersigned within eight days. You are entitled to a hearing on the above charges and to be represented at such hearing by a duly authorized representative of your employee organization. At such hearing, you will have the right to present any witnesses and offer such other proof as you may have in support of your defense against the charges. Such hearing will be held at a date, time and place to be specified by a hearing officer to be appointed for that purpose. If, following the hearing, you are found guilty of the charges and specifications detailed above, the penalty to be imposed upon you may, pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of Utica Police Department and the New York Civil Service Law, consist of either reprimand, the forfeiture or withholding of pay for a specified time, suspension without pay for a specified time, or dismissal from service. All further notices and communications addressed to you in connection with this matter shall be mailed to your latest address currently on record in the Office of the Chief unless you request in writing that the same be sent to you or your designated representative at a different address.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that, for the purpose of imposing the appropriate discipline in this matter, your entire personnel file will be reviewed and taken into consideration. Upon request, you have the right to review your personnel record.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that you may make a statement in writing in response to these charges either to the Chief or his designated representative.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that, pending the hearing and
determination of these charges you are suspended without pay for a period of thirty (30)
days effective immediately.

The disposition of the traffic arrest was a plea of guilty to VTL 1192 Sub 1, Driving While Ability Impaired and a plea of guilty to VTL 1128 A, Moving From Lane Unsafely. An internal investigation and review of police and court documents regarding your conduct on the above-mentioned date and time has taken place. As a result of the internal investigation it was determined that you violated the following sections of the Utica Police Department Policy and Procedures Manual:

1.17 GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT:

A. Unbecoming Conduct;

1. Employees shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off-duty, in such a manner as to reflect the highest standards of the law enforcement profession.
2. Employees shall so conduct themselves in both their private and public lives as to avoid bringing discredit upon the Department.
3. Employees shall not engage in conduct on or off duty, which adversely affects the efficiency of the Department, or engage in conduct that has the tendency to impair public respect for the employee and/or the Department and/or impair confidence in the operation of the Department.

1.13 ORDERS AND DISCIPLINE:

A. Obedience to Laws, Ordinances and Rules;

1. No member or employee shall violate or attempt to violate a law of the United States of America, or of this state, or any laws or ordinances of the jurisdiction in which he may be present, or violate or attempt to violate any authoritative instruction, current directive, rule or regulation, policy or procedure, or any other lawful order. The department's rules and regulations cover all employees, civilian and police officers.

A command discipline agreement is the resolution of disciplinary issues through the **mutual** consent of the accused member and the Chief of Police. This command discipline is in lieu of a formal disciplinary action through the process mandated by Article 5, Title B, Section 75 of the New York State Civil Service Law and the Collective Bargaining Agreement. You have accepted responsibility for your actions and have elected to accept the discipline stipulated in this letter. Command discipline was determined based on the totality of circumstances of this investigation. As a result you will accept the 30 day suspension and forfeit 5 days of vacation time from your 2019 time bank.

On March 5, 2019 a Command Discipline hearing was commenced. You were offered PBA representation and you declined. Present, as a witness, during the hearing was Captain Charles Kelly, Criminal Investigations Division Commander. We came to the following resolution:


- A. You accept the findings of the investigation.
- B. You accept responsibility for violating the Departmental Procedural Manual.
- C. You accept the command discipline in the form of a 30 day suspension and agree to forfeit five (5) days of vacation time.
- D. You also understand that in the future, this conduct or any other similar violation(s) of the procedural manual will be subject to further disciplinary action (to include reprimand, forfeiture, revocation of a work permit, suspension and/or termination).

With completion of these steps, this matter will be closed. You are reminded that any similar future violations of Department Policies or Procedure may result in additional disciplinary action to include but not limited to reprimand, forfeiture, revocation of work permit, suspension and termination. You are being furnished with a copy of this letter. The original with acknowledgement signed by you will be placed into your personnel file.

On 6/20/18 around 0445 hours, several members of the METRO SWAT Team as well as several members of the METRO Unit, gathered in the UPD Roll Call Room awaiting the commencement of a brief relative to an impending high risk search warrant execution. Specifically, Inv. DeTraglia of the METRO Unit requested the assistance of the METRO SWAT Team regarding his intent to execute a high risk search warrant at [REDACTED] Ave. 2nd floor apartment pursuant to an active drug investigation involving the target/resident Victor Airmont (associated RMS 18-22883).

While waiting for the brief to begin, Inv. DeTraglia and I had a "side bar" conversation about the impending operation. Notably, I asked Inv. DeTraglia specific information about the target's dog as I was concerned about encountering a potentially aggressive dog within the second floor apartment of a duplex style multi-dwelling residence. Upon asking Inv. DeTraglia about the dog in question, Inv. Desens turned to me and strongly stated (to the best of my recollection) "I don't know why we use you guys, you guys are constantly whining about everything especially dogs." Although, Inv. Desens's comments which were a bit out of line, I did not broach the issue because Inv. Desens and I have been longtime comrades therefore I opted to convey my displeasure with his comments in a more subtle manner. Specifically, I told Inv. Desens to calm down and jokingly referred to him as "Pauly" in reference to Inv. Paul Paladino who can sometimes be brash. Furthermore, I jokingly stated "Somebody must have eaten their Wheaties this morning." The issue was not further discussed as the SWAT Team Commander Capt. Cinque arrived and the brief commenced.

After the brief, the METRO SWAT Team convened in the SWAT Truck awaiting our response to the target location. While in the SWAT Truck, a few members of the METRO SWAT Team expressed their displeasure with Inv. Desens's comments at the brief. Capt. Cinque inquired as to the comments at which time the situation was explained to him. Capt. Cinque felt as though the comments were uncalled for and disrespectful therefore he requested that an internal inquiry be completed regarding the matter.

Thus, I am submitting this narrative in response to the internal inquiry regarding the above matter.

On 6/20/18, I Sgt. Michael Murphy was assigned to the Special Investigations Unit from 0745-1600 hours with Lt. Bansner as my direct supervisor.

At approximately 0500 hours I was down in the roll call room members of SIU and the SWAT team waiting for a briefing on a job we were about to do at [REDACTED] Ave.

While waiting for the briefing to start various conversations were taking place amongst different people present in the roll call room. I was speaking with Lt. Holt about in-service training as he had asked me to teach it for him that afternoon and I agreed that I would do it for him. I'd say a few minutes after that Inv. DeTraglia was talking about the job we were about to do and the dog that was in it. I specifically remember Inv. DeTraglia talking about how it was a vicious dog according to his confidential informant. At that point in time Lt. Holt started talking about the dog and saying that it was friendly. There was some back and forth and Inv. Desens then interjected into the conversation. Inv. Desens started talking about how SWAT always complains about the job and it's always something. Lt. Holt then stated that Desens isn't as tough as Inv. Paladino. Both exchanged words, which appeared to be normal ball breaking for approximately 30 seconds.

Capt. Cinque then arrived and we conducted the briefing. After it ended we went out to the black Ford Explorer. Inv. Paladiono, Desens, DeTraglia and I all got into the explorer and pulled out onto Lafayette to await the SWAT van. We waited approximately 15-20 minutes for them.

After SWAT made entry and everyone was secured we went upstairs and switched out hand-cuffs. While waiting for a female officer to arrive and for another officer to arrive to complete evidence technician duties regarding the deceased dog, Lt. Holt, Inv. Desens and I were standing around the doorway just talking. The dog being friendly got brought up again, but I can't remember who brought it up or what exactly was said by who but both Holt and Desens were smiling/laughing about it. Everything seemed completely fine at that point in time.



On June 20th, 2018 I, Inv. David Desens reported to the Roll Call room at 0500 hours regarding a briefing held by Inv. DeTraglia. In attendance were members of the SIU and METRO/SWAT units. Upon sitting down, Inv. DeTraglia was already standing at the podium and engaging Lt. Holt in conversation. During their short conversation Lt. Holt began to question Inv. DeTraglia's obtained intelligence regarding a K9 anticipated on being located within the target residence. Lt. Holt then made the comment that he believed the dog was friendly, asserting to me that this K9 may not be a threat as described by Inv. DeTraglia. After hearing this, I turned to Lt. Holt and stated "What does it matter if the dog is friendly or not... and you guys wonder why we don't use you?" This was in reference to past briefings held regarding search warrant executions where intelligence has been questioned or comments made to a case agent. Lt. Holt replied "Oh that's Paulie Paladino tough, I expect that from him... I don't know if I can attribute that toughness to you though." Upon the conclusion of the brief all members responded to the target location.

Once METRO/SWAT had secured the apartment I responded to the second floor where I stood by in the front bedroom with a detained male. With the K9 dispatched in the proceeding room this male made a comment regarding the dog being friendly. With Lt. Holt and Sgt. Murphy standing next to me I stated to Lt. Holt "I guess you were right, the kid said the dog was friendly." The scene was then turned over to SIU for the continuance of the investigation.
