

On Thursday, October 31, 2019, I, Sergeant Samuel M. Geddes reported to the Utica Police Department for the 0745 to 1600 hours shift. I was assigned to the Patrol Division as a street supervisor in marked SUV 40, attired in full police uniform, under the command of Lt. Sean Dougherty.

At about 1515 hours, Lt. Dougherty directed me to respond to the residence of Officer M. Felitto at relative to an unintentional discharge. Lt. Dougherty advised me that Command Staff notification had been made.

Upon arrival I spoke with Officer Felitto who told me that while clearing his personally owned shotgun, he didn't realize that there was a shell in the chamber and he unintentionally depressed the trigger causing the shotgun to fire. The discharge caused a hole in the Eastern side of his residence. When asked if anyone else was home at the time of the incident, he replied in the negative.

We then went inside Officer Felitto's residence to his bedroom where I saw a Remington 870 Tactical 12 gauge Shotgun laying on his bed, as well as a spent Winchester 12 gauge buck shot shotgun shell, as well as a hole in the drywall. It appeared that the trajectory was pointed in a downward angle. Which Officer Felitto confirmed that the shotgun was pointing downward?

Photos entered into the crime scene photo file. The shotgun shell was entered into property. Property # 19-9335.

Gen September 18th 2019 at approximately 1345hrs, I responded to the parking lot of the Big Lots Plaza to ersee an accident investigation. The accident occurred at the intersection of Herkimer Rd. and Van Rensselaer Rd. and involved one of our supervisory vehicles (car 40/Sgt. Samuel Geddes).

Investigation:

On September 18th 2019 at approximately 1338hrs, Sgt. Samuel Geddes responded to a possible burglary
in progress call at Seymour Ave. from the area of Herkimer Rd. Geddes stated that as he
approached the intersection of Herkimer Rd. and Van Rensselaer Rd., with his emergency lights and
siren activated, he stopped short of the intersection, checked traffic and it appeared that all vehicles were
yielding to him. Geddes said he then proceeded through the intersection and was struck in the rear left
side quarter panel by a gray 2017 Ford Explorer, being operated by
had the green light and was attempting to make a left hand
turn onto Herkimer Rd., from the parking lot of the Big Lots Plaza, at the time of the accident/collision.
The driveway Charbel was exiting is directly across from Van Rensselaer Rd. Charbel's vehicle
sustained minor damage to the right front bumper.

There was a traffic backup at the above mentioned intersection, due to some paving that was being done on Leland Ave., in the north bound lane. With Leland Ave. closed, north bound traffic (on Leland Ave.) was forced to cut through the Big Lots Plaza, in order to access Herkimer Rd. This was not an ideal mation for the heavy weekday car volume.

After the collision occurred, PO Todd Duval (car 58), responded to complete an accident report. told Duval that while he was entering the intersection, he hit a pot hole, which distracted him, insinuating that he didn't see or hear Geddes coming.

A canvass was conducted by Duval and he ended up securing a deposition from an employee at
who confirmed that Geddes had his sirens activated, prior to the collision.
Duval also secured surveillance footage of the collision from the
. The surveillance footage only reveals that Geddes had his emergency lights
activated prior to the collision, but not much else. The collision was not captured on BWC footage.
Photographs of the scene and the damage were secured by Geddes.

Car 40 was inspected on scene by UPD Fleet Maintenance staff and shortly after, an estimate for the damage was completed by the Carbone Collision Center. The estimate determined that the repairs would cost approximately \$3,040.90. Car 40 was still drivable and not immediately taken out of service.

On October 22nd 2019, I checked with our MIS supervisor, Sgt. Edin Selimovic, to see if he could accurately calculate car 40's speed, prior to the crash, using the Track Star system. Selimovic attempted to run the data, however the results were determined to be unreliable.

Findings:

asset upon my investigation into this matter, it doesn't appear that Geddes was operating car 40 in a eckless manner and was using his emergency lights and siren, prior to the collision. Also, based on the surveillance camera footage and the damage to both vehicles, the collision occurred at a very low speed. I cannot determine with certainty that Geddes stopped short of the intersection, however did did admit to being distracted by a pot hole, as he entered the intersection (there were two compromised manhole covers at the intersection, which were photographed). Based upon the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law, Geddes had the authority to proceed past the steady red signal and I have no reason to believe that he did so unsafely.

*Geddes did fail to activate his BWC, during his initial response to seymour Ave., which is in violation of the following section(s) of our procedural manual:

Chapter Four, Article Two: Body Worn Camera Systems (BWC)

2.20 WHEN TO RECORD EVENTS:

A. Officers shall make every attempt to record the following enforcement and non-enforcement related contacts:

Immediately upon receiving and being dispatched to a call for service. (While in patrol vehicle in route to a call for service).

*Based upon Geddes' lack of disciplinary history, in this respect, I recommend he receives a verbal counseling for his transgression.

> DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S INVESTIGATION INTO THE SHOOTING DEATH OF WALTER WASHINGTON BY UTICA POLICE DEPARTMENT PTLM. SAMUEL GEDDES

REPORT SOURCES

In preparing this report, the Oneida County District Attorney's Office has met with members of the Washington family, listened to 911 tapes, as well as viewed photographs, videotape and visited the scene. Additionally members of the Oneida County District Attorney's Office reviewed all police reports, re-interviewed in excess of 20 people which included neighbors and residents of Oneida Street, including the children of Walter Washington, It. their mother, New York State Trooper, Thomas Haver and Utica City Patrolman Samuel Geddes. The District Attorney's Office also consulted with training officers employed by the Oneida County Sheriff's Department who are assigned to the Mohawk Valley Police Academy. All physical evidence was viewed and the knife and BB gun found at the scene were examined for finger prints at the request of the District Attorney's Office.

FACTS

- On the evening of July 5, 2005, Ptlm. Samuel Geddes of the Utica Police Department was on routine patrol in the City of Utica with partner, Trooper Thomas Haver of the New York State Police. The two officers were, at that time, working as part of Operation Impact.
- At approximately 11:30 p.m. the two officers received a radio call dispatching them to Oneida Street, in the City of Utica, regarding a complaint which alleged that a party would not leave the residence.
- While in route to Oneida Street a radio call was made by Investigator Joseph Longo of the Utica Police Department to the responding police officers. Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver receive that transmission. In that transmission, Investigator Longo stated: "Be advised that that's the Washington party. They had an incident the other night, he had a knife. That's his ex-girlfriend there."

- Upon arriving at the scene, Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver spoke to the complainant, at which time she described Walter Washington to them and informed the officers that he was wearing a red football jersey, a hat and black gloves. The complainant further informed Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver that she had an emergency Order of Protection for Walter Washington, but had not been able to serve it upon him as yet.
- A search was conducted of the area and Walter Washington was not found. The officers then cleared the scene.
- At approximately 11:50, a second radio dispatch was issued to Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver indicating that the party had returned and that they should proceed back to Charles Oneida Street.
- At that time, Officer Geddes received a separate radio call from Utica Police Officer Scott Berger informing Geddes to use caution at that location as he had taken a prior burglary 1st complaint at that address just days before.
- Upon arrival at Oneida Street, the two officers drove their marked police vehicle into the driveway on the north side (left side of the building as you face the front of the building). They stopped and parked their car adjacent to the porch on the said north side of the building.
- At that time, the officers observed a male in a red football jersey, standing on the porch at the entrance of apartment. Subject was observed to be wearing dark gloves. Subject matched the description of Walter Washington, Jr. given the officers by earlier that evening.
- As the officers exited their vehicle, the subject proceeded down the porch steps, toward the rear of Oneida Street, then the subject turned to his right and headed south along the rear of the building. At that point, Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver instructed the subject, who they believed to be Walter Washington, Jr., to stop. They repeated these commands several times. The subject did not obey.
- The subject then began to jog away from the officers, along the rear of the building in a southerly direction. The rear of the building was lighted by a light at each corner of the building.
- The two officers began to run after the subject with Officer Geddes being slightly ahead of and to the left of Trooper Haver. (Officer Haver being closer to the rear of Oneida Street).
- At this time neither officer was able to see the subject's hands and could only see that Mr. Washington's hands were positioned in the front waistband area of his pants. Officer Geddes at this time ordered the subject to show his hands which he did not do.

- As Mr. Washington approached the southeast corner of the building (right rear as you face the front of Oneida Street) he stopped and turned 90° towards Officer Geddes with what appeared to be a black handgun in his right hand. At this point, both officers drew their service pistols independent of one another and demanded the subject drop his weapon.
- The officers made several demands that the subject drop his weapon but the subject continued to point his weapon at Officer Geddes. At this time, Officer Geddes fired two shots in rapid succession, with one round striking Walter Washington in the chest area and a second hitting the building in its southeast corner. Neighbor accounts would later say that they heard loud voices followed by two gunshots in succession.
- Officer Geddes then immediately radioed that shots were fired, that an ambulance was needed and that a supervisor should be sent. Both officers then approached the subject and the weapon was kicked away by Officer Geddes.
- It is an established police training procedure that, when the use of deadly physical force is necessary, the officer is to fire two shots in succession, targeting the largest area or "center mass" of the subject being fired upon.
- At the scene police later determined the weapon to be a black BB gun pistol styled like a semiautomatic hand gun. They also found a silver pocket knife which was closed. Both of these items were found on the ground at the southeast corner of the house in close proximity to where Mr. Washington was found. Also at that location was a red, blood-soaked football type jersey, bloodstains on the ground, one projectile embedded into the side of the house, and a pair of dark gloves. According to Mr. Washington's family members, he was known to wear gloves, even during the summer months.
- The BB gun and pocket knife were dusted for finger prints by the Utica Police Department. No prints were found on the BB gun and one partial print was found on the blade of the pocket knife. An analysis of the partial finger print through SAFIS in Syracuse revealed that the print did not match Walter Washington, Jr. or either of the police officers.

CONCLUSIONS

- On July 5, 2005, Utica Police Officer Samuel Geddes and New York State Trooper Thomas Haver were on patrol in the City of Utica under the program known as Operation Impact.

At that time, they were dispatched on two separate occasions to the home of Oneida Street, regarding a complaint of a person who would not leave.

- In the course of responding to Oneida Street, Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver received two separate warnings of the recent prior incident at that address and they were advised that they should use caution.
- At no time was either officer informed of the possibility that the subject, Walter Washington, Jr. would be armed with a handgun.
- That upon arriving at the scene for a second time, the officers exited their vehicle and observed the subject who they believed to be Walter Washington, Jr., standing on the porch of the residence which they knew to belong to Particle 11 the complainant.
- Upon the officers' arrival, Walter Washington, Jr. left the scene and refused to obey the lawful direction of Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver to stop to talk to them.
- As the two officers began to follow Mr. Washington around the rear of Oneida Street, he removed from the front waistband area of his trousers what appeared to be a black handgun and pointed the same at Officer Geddes from a distance of approximately 20 feet.
- At this time, both officers drew their respective service pistols and pointed them at Mr. Washington and repeatedly ordered him to drop the gun. Mr. Washington failed and refused to comply with this directive of the officers and continued to point the gun at Officer Geddes.
- With Mr. Washington's gun still pointed at Officer Geddes, Officer Geddes fired two shots at Washington pursuant to Utica Police training procedures. One bullet struck Mr. Washington in the chest area, resulting in his death, the other struck the rear corner of Oneida Street.
- It is the conclusion of the Oneida County District Attorney's Office that the actions of Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver were reasonable and in full keeping with accepted police practice and procedure.
- The actions of the Police Officer Samuel Geddes were a reasonable and justifiable use of deadly physical force pursuant to Section 35.30(1)(c) of the Penal Law of the State of New York in that his actions were in response to what he reasonably believed to be use or imminent use of deadly physical force against himself or his partner.
- Based upon the clear and unequivocal facts in this matter, it is the decision of the Oneida County District Attorney's Office that the actions of Officer Geddes and Trooper Haver were reasonable and in keeping with accepted police procedure and that this matter should not be submitted to the Oneida County Grand Jury for further review.

On July 6, 2005 at 12:40 AM I was called back to work regarding an officer involved shooting.

Upon arrival at HQ I met with Deputy Chief Benzo who briefed me on the incident that occurred at approximately 12:05 AM at Considered Street. He also briefed Capt. Coots of the New York State Police who arrived a short time after I did because a uniformed trooper had been working with the Utica police officer at the time of the shooting.

I learned that the officer involved was Ptl. Samuel Geddes who was working with a New York State Trooper, Thomas Haver, at the time of the shooting. Both officers were on duty in full uniform and neither suffered any physical injury as a result of the incident. The incident started as a domestic in which the offender, identified as Walter Washington, attempted to enter his ex-girlfriends apartment and that prompted her to call the police. It was during the second time that night that his ex-girlfriend, called the police that the shooting occurred. When Ptl. Geddes and Tpr. Haver arrived they found Washington on the porch. Upon observing the officers he took off towards the rear of the building despite being told several times to stop. While in the back of the building he pointed a pistol at Ptl. Geddes who then fired two shots at him. Washington was hit once in the upper chest and suffered a fatal wound. Subsequently the pistol Washington utilized was found to be a BB pistol. Deadly physical force by the officer involved the use of a U.P.D. issued Smith & Wesson .40 caliber semi automatic pistol serial number.

I interviewed and deposed Trooper Thomas Haver who described the incident during which he observed Walter Washington point a black colored handgun at Ptl. Geddes. Rather than expound further in this narrative see details contained in the attached deposition of Trooper Haver.

I then met with Ptl. Geddes in the Criminal Investigation Division for the purpose of an interview. He was with his PBA representative, Sgt. Thomas Brady. Also present was his supervisor, Sgt. David Mickle, who was off duty. Ptl. Geddes declared his willingness to be interviewed without union representation and we then went to my office where I advised him of his rights and he signed a waiver of union representation. Sgt. David Mickle remained and witnessed the interview.

A written statement was taken from Ptl. Geddes in which he described Walter Washington as taking a black colored handgun out of his waistband and despite being ordered to drop same he raised the gun pointing it at him placing Ptl. Geddes in imminent fear of death. See attached statement for complete details.

A check of the officers duty weapon and magazines/ammunition that were placed into property showed them to be department issue and consistent with departmental and training policy.

The Criminal Investigation Division investigation shows nothing that would contradict the officers account of what transpired. No one other than the two officers and the deceased were found to witness or be present at the shooting.

In conclusion it appears the deadly physical force used falls within the parameters of Article 35, (Defense Of Justification), of the New York State Penal Law. Deadly physical force used by Ptl. Geddes was justified by the reasonable cause to believe that such force was necessary to defend himself and another person from what he reasonably believed to be the use or imminent use of deadly physical force.

Oneida County District Attorney Michael Arcuri also determined the use of deadly physical force was justified and that the case would not be presented to a grand jury.

The officer also complied with UPD policy as per Chapter 4 Article 5 of the Procedural Manuel regarding the Use of Deadly Physical Force.

Identifying information: Informations obtained from Mr. Samuel Geddes. He is a 38 year old Caucasian male police officer from Utica Police Department. He was referred by his department for psychiatric evaluation in order to determine whether he is fit to resume his duties.

Presenting data: Mr. Geddes presented in my office for psychiatric evaluation. The confidentiality of this interview has been discussed with Mr. Geddes. According to Mr. Geddes he has been put on administrative leave since July 6th, 2005. Mr. Geddes reports that on July 5th, 2005 it was about 11:30 pm he responded to a phone call from a female victim of domestic dispute by her boyfriend possibly of a physical in nature. Mr. Geddes claims when he arrived to the scene he encountered a 38 year old African-American male who was also wanted by the police department for a burglary charge in the same house where his girlfriend resided. Mr. Geddes states that upon encounter with this African-American male he noticed that he had a gun in his possession. Mr. Geddes initially warned him to drop his gun but he failed to do so, as a result for the purpose of self-defense he had to open his gun fire, initial shot hit to an apartment building however second shot hit this African-American male underneath his left arm, as a result this African-American male fell on the ground. Mr. Geddes immediately contacted emergency medical services. Mr. Geddes states that emergency medical services attempted to resuscitate this person at the scene with no success and this African-American male was taken to the local hospital emergency room where he was pronounced dead. Mr. Geddes states that after he shot this African-American male he had feelings of his legs being weak and also felt thirsty. Mr Geddes was released from his duty at 8:30 am on 07/6/05. He describes his feelings that all day he was restless, had flashbacks of the same scene and he also had difficulty sleeping through the

night. On 07/8/05 he spoke to his priest who provided him emotional support and he felt better and was able to sleep through the night without any difficulty. On the morning of 07/10/05 he attended church services and since then he has been feeling more relieved however he has been engaging himself in physical exercise more so than before. He claims that at this time he feels calm, denies any flashback of that incident.

Past Psychiatric History: Mr. Geddes reports no significant psychiatric history except attended marriage counseling sessions in 1990.

Mental Status Examination: Mr. Geddes is a 38 year old Caucasian male casually dressed, well nourished, well-built, presenting with adequate personal hygiene and grooming. At present he is calm, able to interact with this examiner with good eye contact without the evidence of abnormal psycho motor activity. His speech is of normal tone, volume, relevant, spontaneous and well coherent. His thought process is logical, goal directed, organized and there is no evidence of looseness of association, flight of idea, he is not tangential, nor circumstantial. His thought contents are free from any type of delusional material or paranoia, nor his presentation is consistent with such process. He denies experiencing any types of perceptual disturbances either recently or in the past, nor there is any clinical evidence of such disturbances. He describes his mood as normal or euthymic. His affect is appropriate and congruent to description of his mood as well as ideation. He denies any history of impulsiveness. He has no thoughts, ideation, intentions or plan to become dangerous to himself or to others. Mr. Geddes is alert and fully oriented to place, person, time, day, date, and year. He appears of average intelligence. He has adequate retention and recall. He has adequate insight into his present situation and he is exercising adequate judgment to deal with the current situation.

Assessment and Formulation: Mr. Geddes at present is not manifesting any significant signs or symptoms related to a significant mental disorder. However he did seem to suffer a short duration of generalized signs and symptoms of anxiety which are seems to be subsiding and this examiner believed that Mr. Geddes may resume his conducts as a police officer. However he was also made aware that in the future he could develop other anxiety related disorders e.g. Post traumatic stress disorder, generalized anxiety disorder or a mood related disorder. He was also told that if any of these disorders develop and his level of functioning impairs he should seek either counseling or psychiatric help.

General Order



Effective date: August 15, 2002	Subject: Use of Deadly Physical Force	G.O. 02 - 40
Rescinds:	Reference standard(s): 20.1, 20.4, 20.5,	CHAPTER 4
All previous	20.7, 21.1, 21.2	ARTICLE

5.00 POLICY:

The purpose of this order is to establish policies and guidelines governing the use of deadly physical force by sworn officers of the Utica Police Department and to establish procedures for reporting, investigating and evaluating the use of such force.

It is the policy of the Utica Police Department to prevent the unnecessary loss of human life. A reverence for the value of human life shall guide officers in considering the use of deadly physical force. While officers have an affirmative duty to protect human life, the use of deadly physical force is never justified to protect property interests. Officers may use deadly physical force when there is reasonable cause to believe that such force is necessary in order to:

- Prevent or terminate deadly physical force from being used against the officer or a third person, pursuant to Section 35.15 subdivision 2(a) of the New York State Penal Law; and/or
- When the officer has reasonable cause to believe that such force is necessary to effect the arrest of, or prevent or attempt to prevent the escape from custody of, a person whom the officer has probable cause to believe has committed an offense, and who threatens the officers with a weapon or the imminent use of deadly physical force (Section 35.30 subdivision 1(c) of the New York State Penal Law and the U.S. Supreme Court Decision in Garner vs. Tennessee 1985).
- When the officer has reasonable cause to believe that such force is necessary, and where feasible some warning has been given, an officer may use deadly physical force in order to effect the arrest of, or prevent the escape from custody, of a person whom the officer has probable cause to believe has committed a crime involving the use, attempted use, or threatened use of deadly physical force. Article 35.30 sub 1 (a) 7 (b) and the US Supreme Court Decision in Garner vs. Tennessee 1985.

It is the responsibility of each officer to be aware of the requirements of Article 35 of the New York State Penal Law and to guide his actions based upon that law and department policy and training.

The fact that a police officer is justified in using deadly physical force does not allow reckless conduct by the police officer if the use of deadly physical force may injure innocent persons whom he is not seeking to arrest or retain in custody.

The discharge of a firearm will always be considered to be the use of deadly physical force. However, deadly physical force can be expanded to include the use of non-lethal weapons and force if the intent is to cause serious physical injury. This shall include, but is not limited to, impact weapons such as batons, flashlights, motor vehicles, and bare hands. Only issued or

approved firearms or impact weapons will be carried on duty and used when encountering resistance, except in extreme emergency situations when an officer may use any justifiable resource at his disposal.

5.10 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>:

- A. <u>Deadly Physical Force</u> Physical force which, under the circumstances in which it is used, is readily capable of producing death or other serious physical injury.
- B. <u>Serious Physical Injury</u> Physical injury which creates a substantial risk of death or which causes death or serious and protracted disfigurement, protracted impairment of health or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily organ.
- C. Reasonable Belief Those facts and circumstances within the knowledge of the individual which would make a reasonable and prudent person tend to believe that the facts and circumstances are true.

5.11 PROCEDURE:

5.12 **GUIDELINES**:

A. <u>Training</u> - All officers shall receive instruction regarding the use of deadly force and shall familiarize themselves with this order and pertinent sections of article 35 of the New York State Penal Law prior to receiving authorization to carry firearms, police batons or pepper spray.

B. Drawing and Displaying Weapons

- 1. The drawing or display of an officer's weapon represents escalation toward the use of deadly physical force, increasing the risk of unintentional discharge or weapon loss, and may contribute to fear or panic. Officers are justified in removing firearms from holsters and/or gun mounts if:
 - a. The member reasonably believes that the situation may pose an immediate threat of death or serious physical injury to themselves or another person; and/or
 - b. There is justification to use deadly physical force against a person.
- C. Warning Shots Warning shots are prohibited under any circumstances.
- D. Where feasible and consistent with personal safety, give some warning, other than a warning shot, BEFORE using deadly physical force against another person.
- E. Where feasible and consistent with personal safety, use every other reasonable alternative means BEFORE using deadly physical force against another person.
- F. Moving Vehicles DO NOT discharge a firearm from or at a moving vehicle or its occupants unless the occupants of the other vehicle are using deadly physical force against you or another person by means other than the vehicle:
- G. <u>Animals</u> With supervisory approval, when there is time to obtain it, officers are justified in using firearms to destroy animals provided the specific criteria detailed in section 5.20 of this order are met.

H. <u>Juveniles</u> - No distinction shall be made relative to the age of the intended target of deadly physical force. Self-defense and imminent threat shall be the only procedural guidelines for employing deadly physical force.

I. Effecting Arrests and/or Preventing Escape From Custody

- 1. An officer may use deadly physical force when he has reasonable cause to believe that such force may be necessary to effect the arrest or prevent the escape from custody of a person who threatens the officer with a weapon.
- 2. When the officer has reasonable cause to believe that such force is necessary, and where feasible some warning has been given, an officer may use deadly physical force in order to effect the arrest of, or prevent the escape from custody, of a person whom the officer has probable cause to believe has committed a crime involving the use, attempted use, or threatened use of deadly physical force. Article 35.30 sub 1 (a) 7 (b) and the US Supreme Court Decision in Garner vs. Tennessee 1985.
- J. DO NOT use deadly physical force when it appears likely that an innocent person may be injured as a result. Reckless conduct which harms an innocent person is NOT justified under the Penal Law.
- K. In considering the use of firearms, understand that YOU ALONE ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR ACTIONS and that you may be required to justify your actions in court. You ARE NOT required to retreat in lieu of the JUSTIFIABLE USE of deadly physical force. Nevertheless, deadly physical force MUST NEVER be used if a less drastic means can be used without unreasonably endangering yourself or another innocent person.

5.13 NOTIFICATION REQUIRED

- A. <u>Notification Required</u> Officers involved in the use of deadly physical force, on or offduty, shall immediately notify a supervisor. If the member is off-duty and outside the City of Utica when the use of deadly force occurred, the member shall also notify the agency with jurisdiction for investigation of the incident.
 - 1. This requirement shall apply to all firearm discharges except for the following instances:
 - a. Authorized training.
 - b. Target practice.
 - c. Hunting.

5.14 OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. <u>Officer-Involved Incidents</u> Whenever deadly physical force is employed and results in the death or physical injury of a person, the following responsibilities shall apply:
 - 1. <u>Involved Officer's Responsibilities:</u>
 - a. Determine the existing danger level.

- b. Immediately determine the physical condition of any injured person and render first aid when appropriate and safe to do so.
- C. Notify a supervisor
- Request assistance as needed, and any emergency medical services.
- e. Notify communications of the incident and location.
- f. Limit further communications regarding the incident to the telephones if possible.
- g. Secure the incident scene and act to protect all physical evidence and to identify all potential witnesses.
- h. Remain at the scene (unless injured) until the arrival of the appropriate command officers. However, if the circumstances are such that the officer's continued presence at the scene might cause a more hazardous situation to develop (violent crowd), the ranking commanding officer at the scene shall have the discretion to direct the officer to respond to another, more appropriate location.
- i. The involved officer will protect their weapon for examination and submit the weapon to a Supervisor, or to a detective assigned to the investigation, or as directed by a supervisor.
- j. Unless circumstances are such that it is impractical to do so, the involved officer(s) weapon will be secured and replaced with another issued weapon.
- k. Prepare detailed reports of the incident:
- I. Be allowed to communicate with family members, PBA representative, chaplain, attorney, or anyone else authorized.
- m. Not discuss the incident with anyone except authorized and assigned investigative personnel. Authorized personnel are as follows:
 - 1. Chief of Police
 - 2. Deputy Chief of Police
 - 3. Officer's Commander
 - 4. Professional Standards investigative Officer
 - 5. Supervisor of involved officer
 - 6. Assigned investigative personnel
 - 7. Corporation Counsel
 - 8. District Attorney
 - 9. Privately retained attorney
 - 10. Department/private psychologist
 - 11. Chaplain
 - 12. PBA representative/PBA Attorney
 - 13. Department/private Physician
 - 14. Immediate family
- n. Be available at reasonable times for official interviews, statements and evidence gathering.
- O. Submit to blood, saliva and urine tests.

- p. In all cases where any person has been injured or killed as a result of a traumatic police incident, the involved officer and his family will have available to them the services of the departmental chaplain. The purpose of this is to provide the officer and/or his family with a source of professional consultation to aid them in dealing with the potential moral and ethical after effects of a traumatic incident. The chaplain's services shall not be related to any department investigation of the incident and nothing discussed will be divulged to the department as these consultation sessions will be protected privileged communication.
- q. Any member directly involved in critical incidents, including but not limited to, officer involved shootings, officer involved fatal auto accidents, catastrophic natural or manmade disasters, etc. shall participate in a mandatory stress evaluation and management program. The Services Division shall ensure that arrangements are made according to department protocol.

5.15 <u>SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

- A. Officer-Involved Incidents Whenever deadly physical force is employed and results in the death or physical injury of a person, the following are the responsibilities of the first supervisor at the scene:
 - 1. Respond immediately to the scene.
 - 2. Determine the existing danger level
 - 3. Insure that the injured are receiving medical attention.
 - 4. Assume control and maintain the integrity of the scene until properly relieved.
 - Assist the involved officer(s).
 - 6. Conduct a preliminary field investigation
 - 7. Render supervisory assistance to assigned personnel.
 - 8. Insure that evidence technicians and/or crime laboratory personnel respond to the scene and conduct a complete investigation of the evidence of the scene.
 - 9. Insure that the following notifications have been made:
 - a. Chief of Police
 - b. Deputy Chiefs
 - c. District Attorney's office
 - d. The Officer's Commander
 - e. Criminal Investigation Division
- 10. Insure that statements and reports are completed by all officers present at the scene as to their actions and observations. These will be completed after the officers are relieved at the scene.

11. Review all reports of the incident.

5.16 COMMAND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. <u>Officer-Involved Incidents</u> Whenever deadly physical force is employed and results in the death or physical injury of a person, the following responsibilities of command officers shall apply:
 - 1. Render command assistance and coordinate all activities at the scene.
 - 2. Determine that proper notifications have been made.
 - 3. Brief the Chief of Police, and/or Deputy Chiefs when they arrive on the scene and coordinate all activities with them.
 - 4. Insure that the involved officer makes no statements to unauthorized personnel. Remove the involved officer from the scene and take him to CID as soon as possible. If necessary, designate a supervisory or senior officer to accompany the officer.
 - 5. Review all written reports of the incident.

5.17 <u>CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION DIVISION RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

- A. Officer-Involved Incidents Whenever deadly physical force is employed and results in death or physical injury, and in all cases involving the discharge of a firearm by police personnel, except in the destruction of animals, an investigation will be conducted by CID. The following shall be the responsibilities of the Criminal Investigation Division:
 - 1. When notified, the assigned detective(s) will respond to the scene immediately and conduct a thorough investigation.
 - The involved officer(s) will be taken to CID as soon as practical, where it will be the responsibility of the CID Supervisor to ensure that;
 - a. The involved officer(s) write a report regarding the incident.
 - b. The crime scene is processed and all evidence collected.
 - All necessary reports and statements are completed.
 - 3. It is the responsibility of the CID Division Commander to:
 - a. Respond to the scene
 - Assume command of the criminal investigation.
 - c. Assign appropriate personnel to conduct the investigation.
 - d. Assign personnel to conduct interviews and take statements.
 - e. Review all written reports of the incident.

- f. Insure that the involved officer(s) weapon is secured as evidence and direct the Firearms Unit officer to replace the involved officer's weapon at the time the involved weapon is secured.
- g. Inform the Chief of Police of the status of the investigation.
- h. Prepare a detailed report to the Chief of Police regarding his investigation and conclusion.

5.18 PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS INVESTIGATIONS UNIT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. Officer-Involved Incidents Whenever deadly physical force is employed and results in the death or physical injury, and in all cases involving the discharge of a firearm by police personnel, except in the destruction of animals, an investigation will be conducted. The following shall be the responsibilities of the Professional Standards Investigations unit:
 - Conduct a separate but concurrent investigation to determine if the incident falls within department policy, or out of departmental policy and/or in violation of applicable laws.
 - 2. Determine the quality of supervision prior to, during, and after the incident.
 - 3. Inform the Chief of Police of the status of the investigation.
 - 4. Prepare a detailed report of findings and conclusions to the Chief of Police.

5.19 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DUTY CAPTAIN:

- A. The Duty Captain shall investigate the circumstances of a firearm discharge, except the destruction of animals, and prepare a detailed report regarding observations or conclusions reached from the information obtained. The responsibilities of the Duty Captain are to:
 - 1. Respond to the scene immediately.
 - 2. Assume overall command of the entire investigation, delegating appropriate assignments to Unit Commanders, and the Professional Standards Investigating Officer.
 - 3. Be responsible for press coverage of the incident.
 - Ensure that notifications to the Chief and/or Deputy Chiefs has been made.
 - At his discretion, place the involved officer on administrative leave or duty without loss of pay or benefits, when it is deemed to be in the best interest of the Department and the officer.
 - 6. Keep the involved officer's commander and supervisor appraised of the status of the investigation.
 - 7. Make arrangements for the involved officer to contact family members.
 - 8. Establish and maintain a liaison with the District Attorney.
- 9. He will arrange for the involved officer to undergo a debriefing as soon as possible, but within 48 hours of the incident.

10. Avail the services of the department chaplain to the involved officer and his family to aid them with the after-effects of the incident. The purpose is to provide the officer and/or his family with a source of professional consultation to aid them in dealing with the potential moral and ethical after effects of a traumatic incident. The Chaplain's services shall not be related to any department investigation and nothing discussed will be divulged to the department as these consultation services will be protected privileged communication.

5.20 <u>DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE ON ANIMALS</u>

- A. Deadly physical force may be employed on an animal when the following criteria are met:
 - 1. An animal is attacking or presenting an imminent danger of substantial harm to the officer or any person.
 - 2. An animal is badly injured, diseased, threatening, or destructive.
 - 3. In all instances where an officer must employ deadly physical force upon an animal, the officer shall, when possible, obtain one of the following:
 - a. Written consent obtained from the owner of the animal (Sworn Affidavit);or
 - b. Written certification from a licensed veterinary surgeon upon examination of the animal.
 - 4. Whenever deadly physical force is used to dispatch an animal, the officer will contact communications channel 2, and request that the Department of Public Works (DPW) is notified and requested that the animal be removed, unless the animal is removed by the owner(s) or their representative.

5.21 <u>UNINTENTIONAL DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM</u>

A. Whenever an officer unintentionally discharges a firearm, on or off duty, the officer shall immediately notify a supervisor. The notification and reporting procedures for the unintentional discharge of a firearm shall be the same as reporting the use of deadly physical force (section 5.22). The involved member's Commanding Officer shall ensure that the Services Division is notified of the incident and that the officer undergoes remedial training in firearm safety provided by the Firearms Unit as soon as possible. The officer shall not be assigned to any patrol duties until such training has been received and successfully completed.

5.22 REPORTING THE USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE

- A. In addition to documenting the incident in a police report, officers are required to prepare a "Weapon Use Report" whenever deadly physical force is used including when:
 - 1. Deadly physical force causes the injury or death of a person.
 - 2. The use of force involved the discharge of a firearm, whether or not a person was struck or injured by the projectile.

- 3. A dangerous or injured animal is destroyed by the use of a firearm.
- An unintentional discharge of a firearm occurs.
- 5. A firearm is discharged for purposes other than training or recreation.
- B. When a "Weapon Use Report" is prepared as a result of a firearms discharge, the reporting officer shall document the following in their reports, in addition to all other pertinent facts and required information:
 - 1. The make, model, serial number and caliber of the firearm used.
 - 2. The type of ammunition used.
 - 3. The number of rounds discharged.
 - 4. Notation of any weapon or ammunition malfunction.
 - 5. Number of bystanders present, if any, and their proximity to the discharge.
- C. If more than one officer is involved in the use of deadly physical force, each officer shall complete the "Weapon Use Report" when applicable, describing the force used by that officer.
- D. If the officer is incapacitated, a supervisor shall prepare the use of force report based upon the supervisor's investigation of the incident.
- E. A superior officer shall review all "Weapon Use Reports" for completeness.

5.23 INVESTIGATING THE USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE

- A. There will be two separate, but concurrent investigations into officer involved incidents. They are the criminal investigation and the departmental investigation. The Criminal Investigation Division will conduct the criminal investigation. The Professional Standards Investigations unit will conduct the departmental investigation. Both the Criminal Investigation Division Commander and Professional Standards Investigations unit Commander shall coordinate with, and report directly to the Chief of Police.
 - 1. The criminal investigation will determine what actually transpired and whether or not there is criminal liability involved.
 - 2. The departmental investigation will determine whether the incident falls within Department policies and guidelines.
- B. Both the Criminal Investigation Division and Professional Standards Investigations unit shall prepare a full report to the Chief of Police regarding their investigation and conclusion.

5.24 <u>ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE/DUTIES</u>

A. The Chief of Police may, at his discretion, remove an officer from regular duty and assign an officer to administrative leave or other duties until the investigation has been completed. Assignment to administrative leave or other duties shall be non-disciplinary and is intended to serve two purposes:

- 1. To address the personal and emotional needs of an officer involved in the use of deadly physical force that resulted in injury or death.
- 2. To assure the community that verification of all the facts surrounding such incidents are fully and professionally explored.
- B. While on administrative leave the officer shall remain available at reasonable times for official interviews and statements, and shall be subject to recall to duty at any time.
- C. While on administrative leave the officer shall receive no loss of pay or benefits.
- D. Upon returning to duty, the officer may be assigned to administrative duty for a period of time as deemed appropriate by the officer, the officer's psychologist, and the Chief of Police.

5.25 EVALUATING THE USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE

- A. All supervisory officers are responsible for monitoring subordinate behavior relative to the <u>use of deadly physical force</u> employed by subordinates in the performance of duty, to ensure that departmental policy and procedures are followed.
 - 1. Supervisors must take immediate corrective action when subordinate behavior is observed to be inconsistent with department's policies and procedures regarding any facet of the use of force.
 - 2. A supervisor must notify the Office of Professional Standards Investigations in writing when behavior that is inconsistent with the department's policy and procedures on the use of force is observed.
- B. The Office of Professional Standards Investigations is required to conduct an investigation when a complaint is made regarding the <u>use of deadly physical force</u>. The Office of Professional Standards Investigations shall assess and determine that the force used was necessary, reasonable and justified and whether the force used was:
 - 1. Within Departmental Policy and applicable laws, or
 - 2. Inconsistent with departmental policy and/or a violation of applicable laws.
 - 3. The disposition of all cases logged by the Office of Professional Standards Investigations shall be compiled and analyzed annually. The disposition of all cases logged, together with any recommendations, shall be reported to the Chief of Police.
- C. The Training Division is responsible for the design and implementation of training programs relative to the <u>use of deadly physical force</u>. The Training Division will ensure that each employee receives in-service training annually on the department's "use of force" policies and procedures, and demonstrates proficiency with the weapon(s) each employee is assigned and authorized to use.
- D. The Chief of Police shall review all investigation and administrative reports regarding the <u>use of deadly physical force</u> to ensure that the force used was justified, necessary and reasonable and in accordance with department policy.

1. At the conclusion of each departmental and/or criminal investigation involving the <u>use</u> of <u>deadly physical force</u>, the Chief of Police shall make the final determination of action to be taken.

5.26 <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

- A. All personnel should be sensitive to the psychological trauma that is associated with these types of incidents. Behavior such as blaming, ridiculing, joking, teasing, and isolating the involved officer will only increase the potential trauma and therefore shall not be tolerated or permitted.
- B. Supervisors shall ensure that involved officer(s) are treated in a dignified manner.

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- 3. Disciplinary action initiated by a supervisor against a subordinate will be governed by the department's disciplinary policy, chapter three (3) article four (4) of this manual.
- D. Professional standards investigations are sensitive and confidential in nature. No member shall discuss or divulge any information concerning a Professional standards investigation to any unauthorized person.

9.14 <u>DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF SUPERVISORY/COMMAND OFFICERS:</u>

- A. It shall be the duty and responsibility of all supervisory and command officers to:
 - Continually examine all areas of police action and operations under their control to discover procedural defects and violations of policies, rules and procedures.
 - 2. Receive, record and investigate complaints regardless of their source (i.e. internal, external or precautionary).
 - 3. Inform the subject employee's superior when a complaint has been received, or inappropriate behavior has been observed.
 - 4. Conduct a thorough preliminary investigation at the time of intake.
 - 5. Conduct follow-up investigations and make recommendations involving members of their command when the alleged offense is:
 - a. Non-criminal in nature; and
 - b. Alleges a non-serious violation of department rules, regulations or procedures.
 - 6. Complete investigations within established procedural time frames.

9.15 <u>DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS PERSONNEL:</u>

- A. It shall be the duty and responsibility of personnel assigned to the Professional Standards Investigation Unit to:
 - 1. Record, register and provide staff control (for the Chief of Police and Deputy Chiefs) over investigations delegated to other levels of command within the department.
 - 2. Conduct the following specific types of serious complaint investigations:
 - Complaints alleging criminal conduct by department personnel.
 - b. Allegations of a serious violation of department policy, procedure or rules.
 - c. Actions by members that result in serious physical injury or death to another person.
 - d. Situations involving the use of deadly force by department personnel, to include the discharge of firearms in other than lawful sport activity, the destruction of dangerous or injured animals or at an approved firing range.

I am a New York State Trooper assigned with Troop D in Herkimer, N. Y. I have been a Trooper for a year and a half. On July 5, 2005 I reported to the Utica Police Department to work Operation Impact from 8:00 PM to 4:00 AM. I was assigned to work in a marked Utica Police car, Car 22, with a Utica Police Officer, Samuel Geddes. At about 11:30 PM we went on a call to the 1500 block of Oneida Street regarding a man refusing to leave. When Officer Geddes and I pulled into the driveway a white female and several children exited the residence onto a side porch. She said that the party she had called about had left. I walked towards the front of the house to look up and down the street to see if I could see him. I could not see anyone and at that time Car 55 Officer Lindsay pulled up. I went back to the porch where Sam was talking to the white female. She said she had an order of protection against the man she identified as Walter Washington. She said she had just obtained the order and did not know if it was served on Washington. She went into the house to get the order of protection and both Sam and Officer Lindsay looked at the document she produced. Officer Lindsay started taking a complaint from the woman and Sam and I left.

About a half hour later Sam and I were sent back to the Oneida Street address because the subject had returned. When we arrived I saw a black male subject standing on an unlighted porch, the same porch we were at earlier. As we pulled in the driveway the subject started walking down the back stairs of the porch towards the lighted back yard. As we got out of the car we both told the subject to stop several times. As we approached him he took a left around to back of the building and started jogging away from us. We started running after him. Sam was ahead of me and off to my left a litte bit. We both continued to tell him to stop but he continued on. He had his hands in front of him tucked against his stomach. He reached the opposite corner of the building at which time he stopped and turned ninety degrees towards Sam and pointed a black handgun at him. I believe the gun was in the mans right hand and he had a black glove in his left hand. He held the gun about mid body at almost arms length pointing it at Sam. I drew my pistol and demanded the subject drop his weapon. Sam, who was about twenty feet off to my left was yelling at the same time for him to drop it. We yelled at him several times to drop his weapon. He kept pointing the handgun at Sam and Sam fired two shots at the subject. The subject went backwards out of my line of sight at the corner of the building after Sam fired the first shot. Both shots were one right after the other. Sam then called on his portable radio that shots were fired and the subject was down and he also requested an ambulance. Sam approached the subject who was lying on his back and I kept him covered. I seen him kick the weapon away from the body and I heard sirens so I went to the front of the building so they would know where we were located.



On July 5th, 2005 I was working the patrol 3 shift. I was assigned to car 41 alone. At 2338 hours I heard headquarters dispatch cars 22 and 57 to Oneida Street regarding a person refusing to leave. Shortly after, I heard Investigator Longo contact these cars and advise them that the suspect at that address was probably a Walter Washington. He told them that this man was a suspect in a burglary and that he was often armed with a knife. Upon hearing this information I responded to the area.

While driving south on Oneida Street from Hobart, PO Geddes advised the cars that the suspect was last scene going north on Oneida Street. He was wearing a red jersey. I began to check the area with car 57 PO Lindsey. We were unable to locate the suspect. PO Lindsey than returned to Oneida Street to secure a report. A domestic incident report was secured under DRN#05-27669. I cleared the scene and responded to headquarters for the shift change.

I remained in uniform and began completing my squad paperwork review. Shortly after midnight, I heard car 22 get sent back to the scene at Oneida Street due to the suspect returning. A few minutes later I heard car 22 call out with shots fired. He was requesting EMS and a supervisor. I immediately responded to the scene from Police Headquarters.

Upon arrival at the scene, there were several officers along with CID Investigators on scene. Crime scene tape was being put up and the scene was being secured. I observed a black male in the rear of the Oneida Street. He was lying on the ground near the southeast corner of the house. Rescue personnel were beginning to provide medical attention to this man. I observed a black handgun lying near his feet. I also observed a silver pocketknife on the ground near the firearm. I located PO Geddes and advised him not to discuss this incident with anyone at this time. I brought him to my vehicle and had him wait in the vehicle. Sgt. Zdanowicz was on scene and I advised him that PO Geddes was with me.

I then contacted Sgt. Hauck in the Lt.'s office and gave him the information regarding the incident. He began to make the appropriate notifications. I remained with Officer Geddes and subsequently transported him to headquarters per Captain Pawlinga's request. I also transported to headquarters NYS Trooper Haver. Trooper Haver was PO Geddes's partner and he was present at the incident. I escorted both officers to the Criminal Investigation Division per the orders of Deputy Chief Benzo. Upon arrival in the Criminal Investigation Division, I secured Officer Geddes's firearm and magazines. Sgt. Mickle had arrived and he witnessed this. PO Geddes had two fully loaded spare magazines with 15 rounds in each. His weapon contained one round in the chamber and 13 in the magazine for a total of 14 rounds. Officer Geddes's firearm was missing two rounds. I brought the firearm, 3 magazines and rounds to the desk. I labeled these items by affixing a sticker to them and initialing same. I then has Sgt. Garner place these items into property. PO Geddes remained with Sgt. Mickle in CID.

On 07/06/05 at 1400hrs, I attended the autopsy of Walter Washington at St. Elizabeth Hospital. The following were present during the autopsy: Dr. Sikirica, Lab assistant and Inv. White.

The victim was removed from locked cage #3 by and brought in to the autopsy room. I photographed the body on the gurney and again when he was placed onto the autopsy table. The victims boxers were turned over to me at Dr. Sikirica began the autopsy and I photographed points per his direction throughout the autopsy. Dr. Sikirica stated that there was one entry wound and no exit wound. He had an X-ray done and the projectile was still in the body. He continued the autopsy and stated that the round entered the victims left upper chest area, travelled through the left lung, through the Pulmonary Artery, through the Aorta, Through the Right Lung and came to rest outside of the upper right chest and lodged in the upper right arm pit area. I secured close up photographs of the organs that were struck and a photograph using projection rods to show the trajectory of the round through the body. The round was secured and photographed, and turned over to me at 1445hrs.

I also secured a lavender tube of blood from the victim at 1525hrs.

All evidence secured by this officer and transported to HQ.

On 07/06/05 at approximately 1210hrs, I was contacted at my residence by Sgt. Hauck to respond to 1

to process an officer related shooting.

I responded to HQ and picked up the ID van and equipment and responded to the scene. Upon arrival the following personnel were present: Cpt. Pawlinga, Sgt. Zdanowicz, Ptlm. Lenaghen, Ptlm. Fields, Inv. Hauck and Sgt. McCandlish (NYSP). The scene was taped off using yellow crime scene tape at the time of my arrival. I was led to the rear of 1 Oneida St. by Cpt. Pawlinga where the incident had taken place. As I was led through the scene it could be noted that the area behind the house was very dark, and the only lighting was on the South East rear of the house where there was a set of flood lights with only 1 of them working. There was also a set of flood lights on the northeast corner of the house that both lights were working properly. The incident took place on the South East corner of the house and yard. To the South East corner of the house on the sidewalk there is a Red shirt cut, 2 gloves, a silver knife, a baseball hat and a black gun. Cpt. Pawlinga stated that the officer had fired from an area just east of the items located. I began checking the area for the casings but due to the poor lighting conditions I stopped my search till I was able to light the scene up.

I pulled the ID van to the rear of the house and parked it on the grass. I utilized the scene lights and flood light from the van to illuminate the yard. I then set up portable lights on the south side of the house to light up the evidence already located. I then began using the metal detector to attempt to locate the casings fired from the officer. While I was searching the area, Sgt. Zdanowicz located the casings side by side to the east of the south east corner of the house next to a set of trees. I placed evidence flags on the casings to show location at this time. We also located what appeared to be a bullet hole in the side of the house next to the victims clothing which was noted at this time.

At this time I began photographing the entire scene and all evidence. I photographed overall, mid-range and close up shots of the entire scene and all evidence including the front of the house. I then placed evidence markers on each piece of evidence and re-photographed the entire scene using the same technique. I then turned off all the lights I was using to illuminate the scene and re-photographed the scene to show the low lighting in the rear of the house.

I illuminated the scene again and began video taping the entire scene along with the front and north sides of the house. I then turned off all the lights I was using and video taped the scene again showing the low lighting conditions.

I the began collecting the evidence and marking the position of each piece by a yellow flag or circled with a yellow crayon to use as a reference to map the scene out. The following evidence was collected at the scene:

#1- Spent Casing collected at 0227hrs.

#2- Spent Casing collected at 0227hrs.

#3- Right hand Glove collected at 0228hrs.

#4- Left Hand glove collected at 0229hrs.

#5- Silver Pocket Knife collected at 0229hrs.

#6- Black Marksman Repeater BB Gun collected at 0230hrs.

#7- Red Shirt cut with Blood collected at 0231hrs.

#8- Red/White/Blue Baseball Hat collected at 0232hrs.

#9- Bullet Hole photograph only at this time. Hole was 3'1" up from the ground.

At 0230hrs I received the victims clothing and belongings from Ptlm. Abel that he received at the hospital. I then attempted to retrieve the bullet from the side of the house. Ptlm. Paladino and Ptlm. Berger assisted as we removed the siding and the first piece of particle board. The hole went through those two pieces and looked as if it ended into the wood of the house. I photographed the holes and began slowly cutting around the hole in the house. I was able to locate the projectile and after photographing it in the hole, I collected it using Evidence Marker #9 at 0300hrs.

I then began setting up the Total Work Station with the assistance of Ptlm. Paladino. The only place I was able to set it up so I could map the entire scene was in the rear yard. The Main Unit was set up and I used a reference point from the South East corner of the house east 42' to the Unit. The RP Prism was then set up in the driveway and it was also referenced using the South East corner of 1 Oneida St. and was 80'11.5" north. Ptlm. Paladino marked the scene using the prism pole while I shot all the points with the main unit.

Upon completing the Work Station I contacted Lt. Jones who stated we could clear the scene.

All units cleared the scene at 0440hrs, and I transported all evidence collected to HQ.
