

Lieutenant Coromato embeds himself in all major criminal investigations. He has a good grasp on the fact pattern in each case and helps guide the investigation without micromanaging. Since he excels in this area, he was also rated excellent in the training and coaching of subordinates. Not only does he communicate with his Sergeants but he deals with the investigators one on one making him approachable. As always, he is rated excellent in communication skills. This high rating is attributed to his skills in crisis negotiations and public information duties.

On January 3, 2018 at about 8:30am the New York Mills Police Department was requested by Catholic Charities to check the welfare of a client who had not been heard from in several days. Sergeant Soja and Catholic Charities responded to the apartment of the client. After several attempts to contact the suspect forced entry was made into the barricaded hallway. The suspect appeared behind a second locked door and appeared to have some type of mental issues. Personnel from Catholic Charities attempted to talk to the suspect. The suspect then came down the stairs and stated he had the "gas" on and was going to blow up the house and everyone with him. At one point the suspect became irate and placed a knife to his throat. The suspect stated that he would only talk to Investigator Maldonado who he was familiar with, Investigator Maldonado and Lieutenant Bryan Cormato responded to the scene. Investigator Maldonado after a lengthy discussion with the suspect was able to have him drop the knife. After another discussion Investigator Maldonado was able to convince the suspect to surrender. He was then taken into custody by the investigator and Lieutenant Cormato. The suspect was then taken to a local hospital for a mental health evaluation. I would like to commend Investigator Maldonado for his compassion, professionalism and his ability to deescalate this serious situation. As a result of Investigator Maldonado and Lt. Cormato the suspect was not injured and most importantly no law enforcement personnel were injured. The Utica Police Department should be proud to have these two officers in their command and their actions in assisting our department should not go unnoticed.





Based on interviews they developed a suspect. The suspect was located and after an extensive interview police were confident that this death was, in fact, a homicide. 

This area is a known area where narcotics are sold from the street and shootings have occurred. During the course of this assignment, Officers Greico and Amerosa observed two parties in a vehicle traveling South on Dudley Ave. As the vehicle approached the intersection the officers observed that the occupants were not wearing their seat belts in violation of the vehicle and traffic law. The vehicle was instructed to pull over to the curb on James Street.

The two officers then started to interview the occupants. Officer Amerosa asked the front seat passenger, who had no identification to step out of the car. After the subject exited the vehicle, Sgt. Acquaviva approached the passenger side of the vehicle. Acquaviva observed a black semi-automatic handgun in between the passenger seat and doorframe. Upon hearing Acquaviva yell gun, Amerosa immediately took the passenger into custody, while Coromato and Greico removed the driver from the car and secured him. During the subsequent search of the subject a large amount of marijuana, package for sale was located.

It is my opinion that the above officer's actions merit an award. Due to the officers keen observations, professionalism, quick actions and courage an armed drug dealer was removed from a high crime area of Utica



In the early morning hours of August 4th 2018, cars were dispatched to the Burrstone Road bridge regarding a male attempting to jump. Sergeant Frank Scarchilli arrived on scene, positioned below the bridge on Route 12 and observed a male climbing over the rails. The male then maneuvered himself onto the concrete bridge support in an attempt to jump into oncoming traffic.

Sergeant Scarchilli immediately shut down both north and southbound traffic and began a dialogue with the distraught male. Officers Sean Bubnis and Tyler Mowers arrived on scene and they began a dialogue with the male from the top side of the bridge. The male continued to taunt the officers by hanging his body off the edge of the bridge and threatening to jump.

Having had prior dealings with this distraught individual, Lieutenant Coromato arrived on scene and began to have dialogue with him. After almost four hours, the man climbed up to the top rails of the bridge and was pulled to safety by Lieutenant Coromato, Officer Bubnis and Officer Mowers.

Due to the tremendous patience, professionalism and training, these officers were able to dissuade this individual from harming himself and get him proper mental health assistance. These officers bring honor to themselves and to the Utica Police Department.

AWARDED TO: BURGLARY UNIT

Over the past two years cities across New York State have seen an alarming increase in burglaries, and Utica is no exception with Burglary Unit investigating over 600 burglaries in 2011. In 2012 this increasing trend continued, climaxing with 97 burglaries during the month of July. Although the Utica Police has faced significant staffing cuts including the Burglary Unit they were able to formulate strategies to combat the spike in burglaries within the city.

They worked closely with the Oneida County District Attorney's Office, assisting with the development of recently enacted County Wide Legislation which governs Pawn Shops and Second Hand Stores. This newly enacted Legislation is already proving to be very helpful to investigators with the tracking of stolen property taken in burglaries.

The Burglary Unit also initiated a door-to-door campaign program in 2012, distributing hundreds of door hangers containing burglary prevention tips, while speaking with the neighborhood residents and raising awareness, saturating areas of the City impacted by burglaries.

The Burglary Unit also partnered with NYS Parole Officers and Oneida County Probation Officers, conducting unannounced home visits to persons on parole/probation for the offense of burglary in an effort to monitor their activity as well as attempt to obtain intelligence regarding local burglaries. Over 200 parolees, 200 probationers were spot checked in 2012. The Burglary Unit arrested multiple key suspects during the year of 2012. One such suspect admitted during his interview that he was responsible for committing over 100 burglaries in Utica over several years, bringing closure to numerous burglary investigations.

The hard work and dedication to duty displayed by the members of the Burglary Unit throughout the year of 2012 has resulted in an 8% decrease of burglaries compared to 2011, exceeding their Goals and Objective reducing the burglary rate by 5%. This is a highly commendable accomplishment in considering the staffing challenges faced by the department.

Investigators David Kuhn, Bryan Coromato, Salih Rizvanovic and Sgt. Michael Siriano are all deserving of recognition for their investigative teamwork, investigative skills and dedication to duty. They bring credit to themselves and the entire Utica Police Department.

In 2011, the Burglary Unit initiated an investigation of a burglary which occurred at a residence in Utica which had been burglarized at least ten times in a six month period. The burglaries occurred at night in a residence in which an elderly female lived alone. She also had been confronted by the suspect on one occasion.

Multiple surveillance operations were performed over the six month period, including placing officers inside the residence during overnight hours. It became apparent that the suspect resided in the neighborhood and knew the female was elderly and lived alone. Later in the investigation, she worked closely with the investigators and coordinated a sting operation in which the victim flawlessly carried out instructions she received from the investigators regarding her conversations with the suspect. The suspect was apprehended accepting cash from the victim in exchange for returning her personal property. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with multiple counts of burglary, extortion and possession of stolen property.



On July 27, 2008, Investigators Gerald Azzarito and Bryan Coromato responded to a call on Whitesboro Street to assist several patrol units with an assault of a male. At the time, it was not known that the male was being treated medically and had been involved with a previous assault on another male, aided by his roommate. Through his investigation, Investigator Coromato determined a second person had been assaulted, dragged and left outside. That individual was found and rushed to a hospital.
